OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Significant activities

The Peru Mission reports that during the financial year 2024 our activities in Peru were the following:

Schools/building

Following the successful completion of the works at Las Malvinas school, the work of the mission will be returning to focus on several smaller projects:

Colegio Reino Unido in the Santo Tomas area: our previous work in this school was to rebuild all of their classrooms and staff facilities. To complete the project, we will be providing new play areas and carrying out tree planting to provide shade and a green space in this barrio school.

Colegio Buenavista Gasparito: the Anglo-Peruvian society and William Leech Foundation have generously donated money to begin a project to build a clean water system, toilet facilities, admin facilities, a kitchen/dining area and two early years classrooms.

UK school volunteering visits

The group from St John's School & 6th Form College in Bishop Auckland are travelling out to Iquitos to work on new projects (including at Colegio Reino Unido) in July 2025. Carmel College in Darlington have recruited a new group and have begun fundraising for their next visit in summer 2026.

We still hope to expand the visits to other schools and are looking at how we could expand into visits from groups from universities and colleges.

Church Support

At the request of the bishop of Iquitos, we bought and delivered Latin American bibles for jungle communities on the River Itaya.

Medical Support

Support with medical costs for some parishioners of Padre Raymundo.

Help with medical costs, transport and fortified milk for a little girl with a severe bronchio-intestinal infection.

Christmas Presents

As in previous years, The Peru Mission purchased and distributed Christmas presents for children in parishes, schools, community centres and food kitchens.

Firefighting Equipment

Following outbreaks of wildfires in areas surrounding the city, TPM donated funds to buy firefighting equipment and protective gear to local firefighters in Iquitos.

Joe Plumb, our projects coordinator, visited the UK in the first part of the year.

Significant activities

The Peru Mission reports that during the financial year 2023 our activities in Peru were the following:

Schools/building

The trustees agreed that the primary focus of The Peru Mission's work this year would be the provision of six new classrooms and an office for an Educational Psychologist at Las Malvinas school in the Punchana barrio of Iquitos. Funding a project of this size has reduced the number of smaller projects we might be involved with in a typical year. We did provide funding for new desks and chairs for Colegio Gasparito in the jungle town of Nauta.

UK school volunteering visits

The other major focus for this year has been the restarting of the volunteering visits from UK schools following an enforced break due to the pandemic. 22 students and 4 staff from Carmel College in Darlington Travelled to Iquitos in June/July to take part in the project at Las Malvinas and to work with the girls at La Casa de la Ninas de Loreto home. This was a very successful trip and a group from St John's School & 6th Form College in Bishop Auckland will be travelling out to Iquitos to work on new projects in summer 2025. Several other schools have expressed an interest in becoming involved and discussions with them are ongoing.

Church Support

At the request of the bishop of Iquitos, we supported the writing of bids for various activities: painting the dormitories at La Casa de la Ninas de Loreto (this ended up being funded from the Carmel College visit); a training programme for lay leaders in local parishes; the purchase of bibles and catechetical materials for the use of these lay leaders. As in previous years, we were also a sponsor of the sponsored "trot" organised by Padre Raymondo Portelli to raise money for the various projects run through his parish of San Martin des Porres in Iquitos.

Medical Support

Facilitation of the visit of two UK doctors to work with Padre Raymondo and various other medical posts across the city.

Christmas Presents

The Peru Mission purchased and distributed Christmas presents to children from 3yrs to 15yrs of age in parishes, schools, community centres and food kitchens.

Additionally, The Peru Mission assisted 4 parishes in Iquitos with Bibles, guitars and hymn books for mission and evangelization activities in Amazon rainforest communities.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Significant activities

The Peru Mission reports that during the financial year 2021 our activities in Peru were the following:

- (i) The financial state of the charity continues to be satisfactory. In 2021 we raised and spent slightly more than in 2020. The shape of income and expenditure in 2021 was dictated by the pandemic.
- a. Additional funds came in the form of donations from individuals. Fundraising events that were planned had to be cancelled.
- Joe Plumb negotiated agreements with Dere Street Homes and William Leech charity to provide financial support towards Joe's consultancy fees and for administration support IT equipment for recording video updates on our website and social media platforms.
- b. Donations from our regular business and church supporters also gave generously to help our work during the pandemic.
- (ii) Joe Plumb successfully completed his Teacher Training in the UK before returning to Iquitos with his family and resumed his work as the Peru Mission Projects Coordinator and as the UK Honorary Consul in Iquitos
- (iii) We had no schools visiting Peru this year because of the pandemic.
- (iv) We had no building projects this year. All of our efforts and money were concentrated on urgent needs because of the impact of COVID-19 Pandemic
- (v) The Trustees agreed early in the Pandemic that our most effective way of working would be to be responsive to immediate needs at a level within our financial ability. During 2021 the extraordinary arrangements implemented in 2020 were stopped and we returned to our normal governance where the Trustees will be involved in all financial decisions.
- Also we reduced the amount of assistance given to food kitchens as the Peruvian economy opened up.

This allowed us to:

Since August 2021 The Peru Mission:

- has assisted 15 Peruvian school pupils with school uniform, shoes, rucksacks, exercise books and stationery.
- has assisted 3 cases of serious injury or illness in women and children, financing medicines, purchase of wheelchairs, remedial physiotherapy treatment.
- provided vital medicines to a Peruvian child of 2yrs of age suffering serious malnutrition and intestinal infection and medication and food supplement from several weeks to restore the child's weight to a healthy level.
- has purchased and distributed 80 mosquito-nets to protect children and adolescents against an epidemic of dengue fever in the Amazon Region of Peru.
- has supplied roofing materials to 6 families whose homes were destroyed by fire in a barrio on the periphery of the City of Iquitos, Peru.
- was able to make a gift of 180 Christmas hamper of basic food necessities to families and elderly people in indigenous communities in the Peruvian Amazon rainforest.

It is the policy of the Charity's that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six months expenditure. The Trustees consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the charity's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised.

As at 31 December 2021 the charity's reserves are £25,607 (2020 - £9,715).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The Peru Mission was established for the public benefit for the following purposes:

- The relief of need amongst the disadvantaged poor in Peru by the provision of the necessities of life, including the provision of classrooms and food kitchens.
- The advancement of public education amongst persons in Peru by the provision of teachers, books, classroom aids, schools and such other material as is necessary for educational advancement.
- The relief of sickness and the preservation of health by the provision of medicines, volunteer medical staff, clinics, hospitals, and the mounting of health education campaigns designed to improve and preserve health.
- The provision of facilities for recreation and other leisure time occupation for the people of Peru, in the interests of social welfare with the object of improving the conditions of life of the public at large.
- The advancement of religion by the support of faith based groups in the practical expression of the Gospel for the benefit of the community.

Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 December 2020

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Significant activities

The Peru Mission reports that during the financial year 2020 our activities in Peru were the following:

(i) The financial state of the charity continues to be satisfactory. In 2020 we spent more than in 2019.

The shape of income and expenditure in 2020 was shaped by the pandemic.

a, Additional funds came in the form donation from individuals who were helped by Joe Plumb to re-patriate to their home after being isolated in Peru following cancellation of most air travel in March/April. Joe was acting in his capacity as Honorary Consul but people were so grateful of his efforts that they made donation to the Peru Mission. These donations amounted to over £2,500 in May through our Just Giving page. A virtual cheese and wine party also raised £760 in May.

b, Donations from our regular business and church supporters also gave generously to help our work during the pandemic.

(ii) We had no schools visiting Peru this year because of the pandemic.

(iii) We had no building projects this year. All of our efforts and money were concentrated on urgent needs because of the impact of COVID-19

(iv) The Trustees agreed early in the Pandemic that our most effective way of working would be to be responsive to immediate needs at a level within our financial ability. So it was decided that any appropriate requests related to the pandemic within our financial capacity would be agreed between Joe and the Chair of Trustees and the money would be transferred and the Trustees informed that it was happening rather than requesting their consent. This allowed us to:

a, Send funds directly to the hospital in Iquitos for Oxygen supplies for the sickest patients during the early stages when oxygen was in desperately short supply. This shortage was resolved eventually, but we were able to help plug a short deficiency. Thus saving lives.

b, Provide food supplies to doctors and nurses who were in isolation within the hospital complex in order to not take infections into their homes. Again this was a short term need until a more organised supply of food was secured through the hospital authorities.

c, We provided our first Solidarity Parcels (food parcels) to those who had lost all income because of restrictions during their lockdown.

(v) We continued to provide Solidarity Parcels throughout the rest of the year as funds allowed. In total we provided over 3,000 Solidarity Parcels to over 1,500 families (some received more than one parcel)

a, The Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) had funds available for relief during the pandemic and we were invited to bid for some of these funds. We were given £10,000 from that bid to provide Solidarity Parcels to 250 families each week for four week during the most severe restrictions. The fact that Joe had established a distribution mechanism with our own distribution of parcels gave the FCO confidence in our ability.

Activities of The Peru Mission in the UK

During 2020 our Field Worker, Joe Plumb, moved back to the UK with his family. Before leaving he established contacts and delivery mechanisms that could be activated from the UK. You will see from this year's activity that this has worked exceptionally well.

Public benefit

When planning the activities of The Peru Mission and responding to emergency crises outlined in the activities mentioned above, the trustees of TPM has been mindful of the Commission's guidance on public benefit. This guidance has helped us to remain focused on the core purposes for which the charity was established. We believe that the range of activities mentioned above are fully compliant with this obligation.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the Charity's that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six months expenditure. The Trustees consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the charity's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised.

As at 31 December 2020 the charity's reserves are £9,715 (2019 - £6,702).
