The Trustees have appointed a volunteer Treasurer and put in place adequate controls to manage financial risks.

An online appeal was made during the year asking for donations for the benefit of the Denis Hurley Centre.

We continue to maintain regular communications with the DHC in Durban and regularly liaise with the Director of the Centre.



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
