

Description of the charity's Trust

The charity is governed by Trust Deeds. The charity is constituted by a chairperson and two trustee members.

Trustee's selection methods,

The trustees are appointed in accordance with the policy, organisation and rules of the charity. Members of the church who are qualified to be trustees are eligible to apply.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

1. To advance the Christian faith in accordance with the statement of beliefs in such ways and in such parts of the United Kingdom from time to time as the trustees deem fit.
2. To promote empowerment, self-advocacy and encourage members to contribute their skills to the benefit of the wider community.
3. To provide counselling to married couples.

SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES

- a. To promote the whole mission of the church through activities for youth, senior citizens and special need groups.

- b. To provide regular public worship in the community open to all members.
- c. To provide sacred space for personal prayers and contemplation.
- d. To conduct pastoral work including visiting the sick and the bereaved.
- e. To undertake outreach in the community every Friday in partnership with Tesco.
- f. To conduct breakfast meetings and welfare counselling every first Saturday of the month..
- g. Tuesdays and Thursdays prayer meetings activity in church auditorium and on Zoom.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The church has opened its doors to the community for Tuesday's, Sunday's and Thursday's prayers in the community. This has enabled the youth who were at first roaming about and engaging in unsociable activities to come and listen to the word of God. The church organises food bank and good morning breakfast at the last weekend of every month. The church organises online leadership training for Pastors and elders. The church organises regular marriage and singles seminars for members.

The trustees outlined their commitment to enable as many people as possible to worship and become part of the community in Southwark catchment area and south East London.

Financial Review

The trustees have decided not pay salaries to any member but rather plough back the reserves of the charity to enable it embark on activities in the community and the public. At the moment most of the trust income is used to pay for rent at the meeting venue.

Ultimate Power Assembly has a system in place that allows the vulnerable, the bereaved, the sick, the aged and unemployed within the congregation access some form of support such as food, clothing and money. Every Christmas period we give out hand packs, clothes and sleeping bags to the homeless as part of church activity. The church is actively looking to buy a permanent place of worship.
