Review of Developments, Activities & Achievements

2024 proved to be a very challenging year for the Charity.

Our long serving Chair, Kerry Rhodes, decided to step down to concentrate on personal matters, and in June the Trustee accepted her resignation. At the AGM I was voted in as Chairman in addition to my existing duties as Treasurer.

The Trustee will be forever grateful to Kerry for her incredible hard work in both promoting the activities of the Charity and offering her vast wealth of knowledge to the Trustees and all the supporters of the Charity who contacted us. We remain in contact with Kerry and wish her the very best on her journey.

The Charity itself had a busy year, offering advice and help in many different areas. As one of our Trustees is a qualified behaviourist, we have been able to offer advice on a much wider range of subjects.

Our financial position has improved throughout the year, and we have been able to help a number of dogs with expensive veterinary bills, including a case of Lumbro Sacral condition and a laminectomy.

We are very grateful to our growing number of supporters who have made it possible for us to help these dogs.

During the year we re-homed 39 dogs, 28 male and 11 female. We were contacted by many more owners who were looking for guidance and information about the breed and I am very pleased to say that we were able to help in these cases.

We will continue to offer support, advice and guidance wherever we can, and look forward to 2025 with anticipation.



Review of Developments, Activities & Achievements

For the most part, the memory of the Pandemic is beginning to fade ... sadly, the ramifications of decisions that were made during that time are as stark as ever. The war in Ukraine continues to play out meaning the cost of living due to various extenuating circumstances has rippled throughout the country.

Bills have gone up for everything and this certainly includes dog food, veterinary expenditure and insurance. This combination of a rise in prices on the already strapped members of the public, together with the number of dogs purchased by people with little notion of HOW to rear a hound has now come home to roost as they find themselves in ownership of a rowdy teenage dog with power and no manners or training. This has resulted in an enormous leap in the number of dogs coming through our doors to be rehomed and those requiring behavioural training before going to their new home.

After seeing so little need for kennelling over the last financial year, we continued our policy of NOT renting kennel space annually; favouring instead an approach of paying for any kennelling from private organisations (who have Ridgeback experience) as and when it was needed. This decision has paid dividends and saved us paying out an enormous amount of "empty cash" throughout the course of 2023. However, we did have a rather unexpected expense when a female Ridgeback we took in (Lulu) turned out to be very newly pregnant and by the time we were made aware of the situation, there was little that could be done other than to keep her comfortable until the puppies arrived. Obviously, with Ridgebacks carrying such huge litters, the amount of care from the kennel staff including time, feeding, cleaning etc was quite a full workload and meant the mother and her 9 puppies needing board and lodgings for 8 weeks before they could be rehomed. This unexpected outlay was on top of what we could reasonably expect in the kennelling department. Our outgoings for kennelling were: £7938

With so many dogs/owners requiring direction and guidance on how to implement training and correct behavioural inadequacies, we are so grateful to be able to continue to use the "in house" skills of Lisa Edwards, one of our Trustees, who is a qualified behaviourist. Lisa takes the lead on all complex assessments.

As last year, our fundraising during this financial period has encompassed auctions, sponsored events and a huge return from the carefully selected products we have chosen to stock in our online shop. Our range is constantly being updated and we now have more choice than ever before. Dogmatic head-collars have always gone down very well with our supporters and although there had been difficulty in acquiring these last year, we are delighted that they are now back on our shelves and just as popular as ever they were. Our outgoing expenses for merchandise this year were: £11238

This year, after much careful planning, we were really excited to be able to run our enormously popular fun day. Having had to postpone due to Covid restrictions for the last couple of years, we did spend a great deal of time and effort discussing how to ensure that this year would be bigger and better than ever before. We contacted many pet related shops and also various artisan sellers and specialists to garner as many top-quality donations as possible to give our supporters a wonderful array of prizes at next year's show. The 2023 venue was secured and booked, new advertising signage was designed and created to ensure as many people would be able to find us as possible.

Sadly, our Patron, Yorkshire Vet Julian Norton was unable to attend as planned this year and we can't really blame him after him keeping two dates free for us over the last couple of years and both times being "stood down" at the last minute. Hopefully, for our coming fun days he will be available to help us boost the interest. We did, however, have the very kind offer for this year the "use" of Bargain Hunt TV presenter and antiques expert Caroline Hawley's ex Footballer husband! John Hawley was a very well-known local football star in a past life and in his new incarnation of auctioneer, was a great addition to our day. He drummed up an enormous amount of bids and sales due to his cheeky banter and everybody thoroughly enjoyed the buzz of bidding which brought us in a lovely total. Caroline herself has also kindly agreed to come along to our Fun Day in 2024 to run the auction and drum up more publicity and funds.

Our largest outgoings for the year were enabling us to purchase merchandise but, as above, this was an outgoing well worth spending as it has recouped much more than we have spent. We have had much less expenditure with our vet bills this which really has been a blessing. Our outgoings for veterinary care, medicine and medical procedures was £8073

There have been many things that have resulted in the number of dogs coming through our doors skyrocketing. Never has the need to support them been more vital – and more costly too. The cost of living really is ramping up with many people finding they are making a choice between heating and eating ... obviously with things so serious the family dog is often the only fat left to trim, and that's where we have had to pick up the slack.

Many people are finding that they simply cannot afford to feed their dogs and pay for their veterinary care when everything else is already so much more expensive. In several cases people who were previously working from home have now found themselves back in the office and this has resulted in many dogs being left for an unsatisfactory length of time while they wait for their owners to return. Sometimes, this is at best just not appropriate but at worst the dogs are suffering with extreme separation anxiety and destroying the family home. Dogs who have never been alone are suddenly being thrust into a world of 10 or 12 hour days of solitude the like of which they are simply not equipped to deal with. When this happens, and with no other alternative, owners are reluctantly realising that keeping their four-legged friend is no longer an option and really just not in best interests of the dog's welfare. We are just glad we are here as a safety net. Rescue is not a world for the faint hearted. The number of people seeking help, advice or support for their dogs through our charity was 121. The number of dogs being surrendered to us this year was 60.

Finally, I would like to thank our incredible Trustees who are not immune from the daily stresses, the need to return to the office and indeed the cost of living as either. Each one of our volunteers has stepped up when called upon and provided an experienced, knowledgeable and altruistic network for those who have really come to depend upon us. I don't know where I'd find another such band of happy campers!

As last year, and against all predications and expectations when compared to the overall state of our country, our Charity goes from strength to strength with a bank balance, moral, supporters and reputation being at an all-time high.

We continue to strive for progression in advice, education and all-round support for the breed to which we are all so devoted, but I'd be lying if I said we are not all praying for some kind of respite in what has become a real feeling of fighting against an ongoing tsunami.



Review of Developments, Activities & Achievements

The hangover from Brexit and the Pandemic continues to be a struggle for the entire country. Add to this the extenuating effects of Russia's invasion of Ukraine on the price of living, and we are once again seeing the whole of the global economy taking a severe hit, not just the world of Rescue. The war and the connected effects, particularly on fuel prices, has rippled through everything from food, materials, wages, fuel and even heating. Bills have gone up for everything and this certainly includes dog food (raw and dry) which we know our loyal hounds devour heartily! This by itself is enough to be the straw that breaks the camel's back for some people and to force them into an incredibly difficult dilemma.

We continued our policy of NOT renting kennel space annually; favouring instead an approach of paying for any kennelling from private organisations as and when it was needed. This decision has paid dividends and saved us paying out an enormous amount of "empty cash" throughout 2022.

Our outgoings for kennelling were: £470

We continue to use the "in house" skills of one of our Trustees who is a qualified behaviourist for all complex assessments, and another of our Trustees as a foster option, should that be required. These two facilities have massively reduced the need to bring in outside assistance and with it cut down the outgoings they would have brought.

Our outgoings fostering were: £3057

It is heart-warming to see that the Scottish Ridgeback club is still very much supporting our charity, and is splitting their fundraising efforts equally.

Fundraising this year has encompassed auctions, sponsored events and a huge return from the products we have selected to stock in our online shop. Our range is constantly being updated and we now have more choice than ever. Dogmatic head-collars have always proven to be very popular but there has been a hiatus with these due to supply issues. We are, however, confident we will again have access to these in 2023. Our coats and fleeces are always very much in demand and we will continue to offer range of clothing products that we feel are perfect for our beautiful Ridgebacks.

Our outgoing expenses for merchandise this year were: £10909

This year, due to the world getting back on its feet following Covid, we decided not to hold our anticipated annual Fun Day. Rather than put on a half-hearted event which could possibly have a low footfall and therefore waste our precious funds, we decided to put this off until 2023 with the hopes of coming back bigger and brighter next year. The 2023 venue is secured and booked so we look forward to that in September. A specific meeting to discuss the plans and requirements for the Fun Day has been scheduled for the early part of 2023. We have secured attendance from both our Patron, Yorkshire Vet Julian Norton, and also Bargain Hunt TV presenter and antiques expert Caroline Hawley. Caroline has kindly agreed to come along to our Fun Day next year to auction off some lots for us and drum up more publicity and funds.

Our supporters continue to participate in the Weather Lottery, Easy Fund Raising and also Amazon Smile but we understand the Smile option will terminate in 2023, which is a shame as it was so easy to use and generated funds for us so very effectively.

Our largest outgoings for the year were enabling us to purchase merchandise but, as said above, this was an outgoing well worth spending as it has recouped much more than we have spent. With the sad loss of several of our older, more expensive dogs from a veterinary care standpoint, we have had much less expenditure with our vet bills this year and thankfully Eli on whom we had to spend so much last year, continues to go from strength to strength with no further problems.

The war in Ukraine has caused the price of fuel to rocket. This has increased the prices of pretty much every single thing and thus the cost of living crisis really is ramping up. Many people are finding that they simply cannot afford to feed their dogs and pay for their veterinary care when everything else is already so much more expensive. In several cases we have seen people who can no longer afford to pay their mortgages, forcing them to sell up, move to rented accommodation and, as a result, having to give up their dearly loved hound. We are just glad we are here as a safety net. Rescue is not a world for the faint hearted. With the country just starting to get back on its feet following the Pandemic, people have begun to return to work. This has brought the anticipated repercussions of dogs being surrendered as their owners are no longer able to be at home during the day, and many people are seeking help and advice after returning to work and finding their dogs are suffering with separation anxiety, having never been left since they arrived as "lock-down pups". Where possible, our behaviourist has been able to guide owners through to help them work with their dogs behaviours so that they might be able to keep them. Where this has not been possible, we have had quite a job to find knowledgeable, experienced owners who are both willing and able to work with their challenging behaviour and accommodate that which cannot be changed.

The number of people seeking help, advice or support for their dogs through our charity was 75

The number of dogs being surrendered to us this year was 36

The number of dogs fostered prior to rehoming was 5

Lastly, I would to thank our Trustees who have worked tirelessly and managed to continue their own full time employment and yet still gave of themselves fully, working seamlessly as a team and put in hours of work on top of their day to day responsibilities.

As last year, our Charity goes from strength to strength with a bank balance, moral and reputation being at an all-time high.

Our funds at the close of play for 2022 were : £115100 which was up by £1180 from year end 2021.

We continue to strive for progression in advice, education and all round support for the breed to which we are all so devoted.



Review of Developments, Activities & Achievements

The pandemic continues to be a struggle for the entire country hard, indeed the whole of the global economy has taken a severe hit. Standing orders and general donations have, rather understandably, decreased as everybody has had to tighten their belts.

From a financial standpoint, it was fortuitous that we had already decided to draw an end to our association with C-Four Paws for kennel rental, and this arrangement concluded with our final payment to them in January 2021. With the addition of a qualified behaviourist/dog trainer to our ranks, we have been able to save money massively on assessments and the production of written reports when we are approached about problem dogs. Where previously these dogs would have had to come into our kennel facility for assessment and a third party report generated, we are now able to personally assess them in situ and rehome directly from their current owner, should this be deemed appropriate. When kennelling is still required, we have now commenced using kennels on an ad hoc basis and also have the option of utilising one of our Trustees to foster dogs, should that be required. This more fluid way of working has proved doubly positive not only in that we are no longer paying for empty kennel space, but that we are also able to kennel the dogs in a more geographically convenient area rather than having to transport them up and down the country to our previous central hub. This year, the full total spend on kennelling and foster fees was down to just £2900, a considerable reduction from last year's kennel bill of £11,210.

It is heart-warming to see that the Scottish Ridgeback club is still very much supporting our charity, and is splitting their fundraising efforts equally between ourselves and the Rhodesian Ridgeback Welfare Trust. This year, funds were generated from both shows and sponsored events.

Fundraising this year has been of a much lesser endeavour than usual but we have made strides with our merchandise in the online shop. Our range has been updated and care selecting products really has paid off with the "big hitters" being the Dogmatic headcollars. Our coats and fleeces are always very much in demand but sadly our manufacturer has had several problems and personal issues to deal with meaning we have had quite the hiatus in being able to stock as many as we have demand for. Indeed, we have a waiting list for them and expect them to fly off the shelf as soon as they become available. In this interim period, we were, however, able to stock generic coats from a local trade supermarket and rather surprisingly these have also done very well enabling us to claw back quite a sizeable mark-up (so much so that we have decided to continue this range even when the Ridgeback-specific coats and fleeces come back in stock again at the beginning of 2022).

Due to the amount of merchandise we now have to store, it was thought prudent and sensible to arrange the use of a storage facility. The cost for this service is £1800 per annum, but it does ensure our products are safe, dry and easily accessible.

This year, again due to the restrictions of Covid, we were unable to run our hotly anticipated Fun Show in Malton, or to produce any of our fun fundraising videos. Sadly, another casualty in our events diary was our Predation Workshop with Claire Staines of Lothlorien Dog Services arranged for Welton in May. We are hopeful that finally next year, we may pull it off and also be able to reschedule our Fun Show with Julian Norton, the Yorkshire Vet, that we are so excited to get off the ground.

On the positive fund-raising side, we were very proactive in our use and publicity of other ways in which our supporters could generate funds. We had 47 people sign up to our Weather Lottery meaning regular payments coming in for that. We are now also encouraging the use of Amazon Smile when people shop on line. We were staggered to find that this method of shopping alone raised in excess of £600 for our charity this year. Easy Fundraising continues to be a popular avenue for people to help us raise our bank balance without it costing them a bean, and we were also fortunate enough to have 2 separate legacies gifted to us.

Our largest outgoings for the year were again in the form of veterinary bills which totalled £5937 for the year. Eli, who required complicated and expensive surgery for his dermoid sinus is now doing great with no anticipated surgery, medication or problems going forward. His bill was roughly £3200 but as our supporters raised £2000 specifically for him, this really eased the burden. Evie our long-term foster "golden oldie" continued to be in and out of the vet's office with her medical issues. Her bill for the year was £500. It will, however, be the last payment we need to make for our darling girl as sadly she passed away towards the end of this year.

The Pandemic continues to have an impact on both the numbers of dogs being surrendered and also the type of dogs coming through our doors. We are starting to see the ramifications of those people who took on dogs during lockdown without perhaps being "Ridgeback people". By this I mean that many of the dogs have not been appropriately trained, socialised, schooled or given the adequate boundaries and guidance. As these dogs are now entering adolescence, their hormones are also kicking in and many people who had not done their homework before getting them, are finding they are simply "too much dog" for them now they are powerful, boisterous, disobedient teenagers. The average age of those dogs being surrendered to us has reduced significantly because of this, although we are still seeing some dogs at the other end of the scale ... our oldest this year was a heart-breaking 13 years old.

The number of dogs being surrendered to us this year was 20

The number of dogs fostered prior to rehoming was 2

Lastly, I would to thank our Trustees who have all worked seamlessly as a team and put in hours of work in ensuring the smooth running of the charity, website optics, social media accounts and round the clock support to those who need us. This year has brought some very trying situations both from a logistical, emotional and ethical stand point. Some decisions have not been easy to reach but I am glad to say that on every occasion, the Trustees have worked together as a single entity, agreeing en masse with all decisions and plans. The bank balance, moral and reputation of the charity is at an all-time high and is certainly in the most healthy position moving forward into 2022.

REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS, ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

The pandemic has hit the entire country hard, indeed the whole of the global economy has taken a severe hit. Standing orders and general donations have decreased as everybody has had to tighten their belts.

From a financial standpoint, it was fortuitous that we had already decided we would be moving away from the kennels at C-Four Paws and instead looking at using kennels on an ad hoc basis as and when they were needed. Indeed, we recently started working with Laxton kennels in Leicestershire who helped us enormously when we were dealing with Indi. Laxton kennels offer a very professional set up that includes Bex, a qualified behaviourist, who we can call on for assessment and training work should we have a dog who would benefit from such interventions. The added safety net of a professional being able to look over a dog and give a qualified opinion of their behaviours and temperament is worth its weight in gold and certainly gives us added confidence if and when we are called upon to help with a "difficult" case. Their fees are very reasonable and, as they are only to be paid if we actually have a dog with them, they are a massively reduced outgoing for us to bear.

Although the Midlands and Northern RR Club are no longer supporting us with their fundraising or competition events, it is heart-warming to see that the Scottish club is still very much onside and is splitting their fundraising efforts equally between ourselves and the RRWT.

Fundraising this year has been of a much lesser endeavour than usual (we did several fun videos that people paid to be in - "The Barkness", Hand Sanitizer Challenge" and Toilet Roll Challenge - and also ran a weekly quiz on Friday evenings throughout lockdown No 1. We wanted to give our supporters a little fun and a bit of feel-good free activity to say thank you. Although we didn't charge for our supporters to participate, when the quizzes drew to a close, we did receive donations of over £300 which was lovely). What we lost in activities such as the regular auctions (we decided it was not fair to ask our supporters to partake in these during such difficult times) we have made up for in merchandise sales which have gone very well indeed. The shop aspect of the website is doing very well indeed with some really lovely products being available, particularly the fleeces and coats made by Carol Ann at Oridgenals.

Sadly both our May events - our Predation Workshop with Claire Staines of Lothlorien Dog Services arranged for Welton and also our Ridgeback Fun Day planned for Malton, at which Julian Norton our Patron was to be judge, have had to be put on ice. We tried to rearrange for May of 2021 but it seems this is still too soon and so the hope now is that they will take place in May 2022 instead. In the same vein, our participation in at Crufts 2021 has also had to be shelved until 2022 at the decision of the Crufts Committee.

We received a sizeable donation from Diane following her custody battle with Until Every Dog Has A Home regarding Cuthbert. Cuthbert was surrendered to UEDHAH but did not appear to be getting the new life she had hoped for him. She launched a legal campaign to try to get him released, for which the Ridgeback world at large donated a substantial amount to cover her legal fees. When it finally broke that Cuthbert had indeed been rehomed in December, Diane will pay her remaining fees and in 2021 has been kind enough to gift the outstanding monies to us here at Ridgeback Rescue. We are, of course, absolutely delighted, coming as they did on the back of a huge medical bill we had incurred for Eli - a young male RR who had been found to have a dermoid sinus when we initially took him on. Invasive and complex surgery on the DS and then surgical treatment of a massive abscess under the muscle sheath following the surgery left us with a bill just shy of £5,000. The donation from Diane, together with an appeal we put out on behalf of Eli, brought in more or less the full amount necessary to cover his bills and give him the happy ending he needed. Once again, the Ridgeback world didn't let us down.

Those who are fostered or rehomed by us when they are already 'elderly' have their veterinary fees met by our Charity. As our rehomed dogs get older, it is inevitable that they often require more veterinary support. Billie and Diwa were two elderly dogs who were rehomed together. Sadly, Diwa has now passed but did manage to rack up substantial medical bills as her life drew to a close. Billie, now also in her dotage, is struggling with various respiratory and heart problems and the total vet fees over last year for Billie and Diwa combined were £3,000. Our third "big hitter" in the medical stakes was our lovely foster dog Evie. Evie has really been battling with her Laryngeal Paralysis and associated recurrent aspiration pneumonia. Her fees for 2020 alone were a massive £2,374.

The number of dogs being surrendered to us this year has been down massively at just 20 as opposed to the 31 who were rehomed last year. One can only assume this is down to a number of factors:

- a) People working from home, so able to spend time with their animals and meeting their needs.
- b) People working from home has also meant the market for dogs has soared dramatically both in sheer demand and also in the prices being charged. This "perfect storm" has meant that instead of being surrendered to us as dogs normally would have been, they were sold on Gumtree etc for a highly inflated fee. I worry as to the fitting nature of the homes these dogs were paired with and can only hope that if, and when things return to "normal". That they seek help from us to rehome then to a better suited environment.

Lastly, I would like to thank our Trustees who have all worked seamlessly as a team and put in hours of work in ensuring the smooth running of the charity, website optics, social media accounts and round the clock support to those who need us. This year has brought some very trying situations both from a logistical, emotional and ethical standpoint. Some decisions have not been easy to reach but I am glad to say that on every occasion, the Trustees have worked together as a single entity, agreeing en-masse with all decisions and plans.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE TRUSTEES

The Charities Act requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for every financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity at the end of the year and of the surplus, or the deficiency for the year.

In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to select suitable accounting policies, and then apply them on a consistent basis, making judgements and estimates that are prudent and reasonable. The trustees must also prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.
