Aim & Purposes

The Organisation has a responsibility of providing Islamic teachings to the Muslim Community of the local area as well as providing a better understanding of the Islamic faith to the much wider Community. The Organisation also aims to provide suitable premises and facilities to any service user.

Objectives and Activities of the Charity

The Charity's main objective of relocating to the new site on Albion Street has been achieved. The old site is no longer required & was advertised and an offer has been accepted. It is currently with our legal team with the view to complete as soon as possible.

The new premises are in full use now and are better equipped to serve the needs of the Community.

During this year we have made full use of the new premises at Albion Street. There was still some work to be completed but now whole of the premises are fit for use. We have let out a number of rooms to private businesses for which the charity is receiving rental income.

Front and Rear car parks have been resurfaced, boundary wall at the front of the property is 95% complete, railing and gates have been installed and only external signage is left to be completed.

The new premises are being used for daily prayers, educational classes for all age groups, community meetings/gatherings/functions, social activities, and Muslim funerals. Meeting rooms may also be made available to external organisations on request.

Achievements and Performance

During the year the charity has been supporting local groups such as Black Country food bank and also we have had several visits from local primary schools as part of their religious education curriculum. The charity has an open door policy and will continue to support where we can.

The Charity has been very active in promoting and advertising the new premises to private small business so that the premises can be let. The Charity has also received donations for & completed the work on the boundary wall.

Financial Review

Total Receipts were £167,204

This was made up of public donations at Friday prayers, monthly membership fees and voluntary donations received. This income also includes rent received from letting out a number of rooms in the masjid.

The only other asset of the Charity at this time is the old Trinity Street site. This site is up for sale & will be sold in due course.


