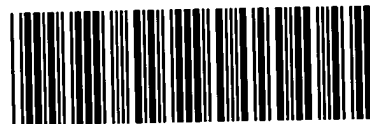

**REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2022**

The Directors present their report together with the unaudited financial statements of the Company for the year ended 31 August 2022

The organisation is a charitable Company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 24 November 2011 and registered with the Charities Commission on 16 July 2012. The Company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

Our key aims and objectives are as follows:

Overseeing the Running of Polish Saturday School:

- To provide high-quality educational opportunities for children and young people to learn the Polish language, history, culture and traditions.
- To foster a sense of pride and connection to Polish heritage among Polish-British children in Plymouth.

Promoting Polish Culture:

- To actively promote Polish culture through various initiatives including workshops, exhibitions and cultural events that showcase Polish traditions, art, music and cuisine.
- To collaborate with other cultural organisations and community groups to raise awareness of Polish contributions to British society and promote intercultural understanding.

Organising Charity Events:

- To organise fundraising events that support charitable causes related to Polish-British culture such as heritage preservation projects, community outreach programs and initiatives to benefit disadvantaged individuals and families.
- To collaborate with the biggest Polish charitable organisation to maximise the impact of our fundraising efforts and provide assistance where it is most needed.

Supporting Polish Parents:

- To offer support, guidance and resources to Polish parents in Plymouth including assistance with navigating local services, promoting cultural integration and maintaining Polish language skills within their families.
- To facilitate networking opportunities and social gatherings that create a sense of community among Polish parents and foster mutual support.

Assisting Local Schools in Organising GCSE Polish and A-Level Polish Examinations:

- To collaborate with local schools to support the organisation and administration of GCSE Polish and A-Level Polish examinations ensuring that students have the opportunity to pursue qualifications in the Polish language and culture.
- To provide resources and guidance to teachers, students and parents to enhance the teaching and learning of Polish as an academic subject.

Celebrating National Holidays and Traditions:

- To celebrate and raise awareness of Polish national holidays and traditions in Plymouth, organising events and activities that showcase the rich cultural heritage of Poland and promote cross-cultural exchange.
- To collaborate with local authorities and community organisations to ensure the inclusion of Polish culture in multicultural celebrations and events within the wider community.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activities of the Company in the year under review were the promotion of the objects for which the Charity was formed, to advance education for the public benefit in Polish language, culture, tradition and heritage in particular within the Polish community.

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The main focus of the charity continues to be week-to-week running of the Saturday school, with occasional social events, Christmas, family fairs, annual trips where we aim to promote the objectives of the charity

REVIEW OF CHARITABLE ACTIVITIES

Clear objectives have been set for the charity. Regular meetings are held at which performance measures against objectives are reviewed.

FINANCIAL REVIEW & RESERVES

The net movement in the Unrestricted Fund comprises a deficit of £1,523 being the excess of expenditure over income. The charity does not hold any restricted funds.

RISKS

The major risks to which the Company is exposed, as identified by the Directors, have been reviewed and systems have been established to mitigate these risks.

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

Future Plan for the Society for the Promotion of Anglo-Polish Culture in Plymouth:

Running Polish Saturday School:

- Strengthen and expand the Polish Saturday School by offering a wider range of educational activities including language classes, history lessons, cultural workshops and arts and crafts sessions.
- Collaborate with local educational institutions to provide professional development opportunities for Polish language teachers and promote the inclusion of Polish language and culture in the mainstream curriculum.

Promoting Polish Traditions and Cultural Events to the Local Community:

- Organise regular cultural events such as Polish music and dance performances, art exhibitions, film screenings and culinary festivals to showcase the richness and diversity of Polish traditions to the wider community in Plymouth.
- Collaborate with local venues, community centres and cultural organisations to host joint events and promote cross-cultural exchange.

Becoming a Hub of Support for the Polish Community:

- Establish a resource centre to provide information, advice and support services to the Polish community in Plymouth including assistance with housing, employment, healthcare and integration into the local community.
- Facilitate social gatherings, support groups and networking opportunities to foster a sense of community among Polish residents and create a support network for individuals and families.

Informing about the Contribution of the Polish Armed Forces in World War II:

- Organise educational events, exhibitions and lectures to raise awareness about the significant role of the Polish Armed Forces in World War II particularly highlighting the contribution of the Polish Navy in the city of Plymouth.
- Collaborate with local history societies, museums and schools to develop educational resources and ensure the inclusion of Polish history in local history curricula.

Supporting the Plymouth-Gdynia City Twinning Panel:

- Collaborate closely with the Plymouth-Gdynia City Twinning Panel to strengthen cultural, educational and economic ties between Plymouth and Gdynia.
- Facilitate exchange programs, cultural visits and joint initiatives to promote understanding and collaboration between the two cities.

Getting Involved in the Great Orchestra of Christmas Charity (GOCC):

- Participate actively in the annual GOCC charity event which is the largest charitable initiative in Poland.
- Organise fundraising activities, events and campaigns in Plymouth to support the GOCC's mission of providing medical equipment to hospitals and healthcare institutions in Poland.

Enhancing Organisational Capacity:

- Seek additional funding and grant opportunities to support the expansion of activities and services provided by the Society.
- Develop partnerships with local businesses, philanthropic organisations and government bodies to secure sustainable funding and resources.
- Invest in staff training and development to ensure the Society has the necessary skills and expertise to fulfil its objectives effectively.

By implementing this future plan, the Society for the Promotion of Anglo-Polish Culture in Plymouth aims to strengthen cultural ties, promote Polish traditions and support the Polish community in Plymouth. Through collaboration, education and community engagement, we aspire to create an inclusive and vibrant cultural landscape that celebrates the contributions and heritage of the Polish-British community.

RESERVES

It is the policy of the Directors to maintain a level of reserves sufficient to fund future projects when the need arises. Total unrestricted reserves at 31 August 2022 were £4,573 (2021: £6,096)

DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES



**INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT
to the Trustees of The Society for the Promotion of Anglo-Polish Culture in Plymouth**

I report on the accounts of the Trust for the year ended 31 August 2022 which are set out on pages 7 to 11.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144 of the Charities Act 2011 ("the Charities Act") and that an independent examination is needed.

It is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under section 145 of the 2011 Act;
- to follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners under section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act; and
- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

My examination was carried out in accordance with the general Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and the seeking of explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair view' and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.

Independent examiner's statement

In connection with my examination, no matter has come to my attention which gives me reasonable cause to believe that, in any material respect

- (a) the accounting records were not kept in accordance with section 130 of the Charities Act; or
- (b) the accounts did not accord with the accounting records; or
- (c) the accounts did not comply with the applicable requirements concerning the form and content of accounts set out in the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 other than any requirement that the accounts give a 'true and fair' view which is not a matter considered as part of an independent examination.

I have come across no other matters in connection with the examination to which attention should be drawn in this report in order to enable a proper understanding of the accounts to be reached.
