The charity has made grants to institutions which have been identified as advancing the objectives of the charity.

Grant making policy

Grants are made to charitable institutions and organisations which accord with the objects of the charity.

The trustees are approached for donations by a wide variety of charitable institutions operating all over England. The trustees consider all requests which they receive and make donations based on the level of funds available.

Achievements and performance

During the year the charity continued its philanthropic activities in support of educational, religious and other charitable organisations. Income from donations and investments aggregated £85,190. Total resources expended were £72,691.

Grants and donations totalled £43,000 (2024: £28,700).

Financial review

The trustees consider the position of the charity to be satisfactory.

The charity's financial statements show a net surplus of £12,498 (2024: £14,318) and total reserves of £835,344 (2024: £822,846). Net income from investments during the year amounted to £57,018.
