The charity secured donations of £37,599 and grants of £2,448 during the period, giving a total income of £40,047. It had expenditure of £9,328 for the year, which was mainly the staff costs and professional costs. This generated a surplus of £30,719 which was added to prior year surpluses. The charity held £93,072 as reserves (not including the property asset) to pay for the property extension and refurbishment project in the coming years. There is no policy to retain reserves and all surplus funds will be spent on future charitable activities and administrative costs.
