Statement from Chairperson – Dr. Linda Bello

This is the beginning of my second term as CamDocUK chairperson having been re-elected in March this year. I am deeply humbled by the opportunity to lead this remarkable association once again. As I embark on this second term, I am filled with a renewed sense of purpose and determination. Our work is far from complete, and the challenges ahead require our continued vigilance and innovation.

Over the past term, we have navigated through significant challenges and celebrated numerous achievements. I extend my heartfelt thanks to my executive team and members for their dedication, hard work and unwavering support.

A special thanks to our superb secretary General Dr Judwin Ndzo who has sadly stepped down after 7 years in the executive. She has been an exemplary secretary and asset to our association. I am pleased to report that the indefatigable Dr Anna Mbene has stayed on in her dual roles of Comms Sec and managing our finances. A warm welcome to the new members of our executive team whom I will formally introduce during the gala.

We continued our series of webinars “CamDocUK – Talking with the Community” and are currently on our 21st edition. Our most recent webinar on Endometriosis had one of our highest attendances this year. I would like to thank our

community for attending and engaging in these sessions, as well as our external speakers for all their time and input.

Our links with our sister organisations have remained strong. We supported Patcha Foundation in a medical mission which took place between the 10th to the 15th of June this year in Ngoazip South region of Cameroon. My special thanks to Dr Nkwayep Mpafe for representing us and for taking with him some medical equipment donated by CamDocUK.

It has been a pleasure to watch our numbers increase again this year and it is always heartwarming to see the positive interactions of members when we meet in person at our OGMs. I remain grateful for the commitment of our members.

We have partnered with CAHN to help us with grant/bid writing.
3. Members of **Better Health for Africa.**
4. Solidarity Clinic Buea, Cameroon: We informally partnered with Solidarity clinic, Buea in Cameroon to donate 172 pairs of prescription glasses which were distributed freely to the population.
5. **University of Buea:** We are still waiting for the go-ahead from the administration in order to facilitate educational activities between CamDocUK and the university.

C. Educational Activities

Our annually paid Zoom account has enabled us run educational webinars for the Cameroonian and African communities. We have had 4 Webinars so far on various topics: Breast Cancer, Endometriosis, Sickle Cell Disease, Organ Transplantation. These have been well received by the public.

Our Journal clubs continue but have gone from fortnightly to monthly but will be reviewed as need arises. This is only open to medics.

Members are able to use the paid Zoom account as part of their membership benefits.

D. Ongoing Projects

1. Maternal and Neonatal Care Project in Cameroon

This has been the highlight of the year. This was launched in July 2023, targeted at improving the healthcare of mothers in Cameroon.

Fundraising: Currently ongoing for our Maternity project. ‘GoFundMe’ was launched for this. So far, £8141 raised of a target of £50,000. Many thanks to CamDocUK members who have pushed for the drive to raise more funds.

Health facilities in Cameroon have been contacted to ascertain need. Procurement of equipment has begun. More funds are needed to transport goods, widen coverage and staff training.

2. Medical Conference in Cameroon

The medical conference in Cameroon titled ‘**NON-COMMUNICABLE DISEASE EMERGENCIES IN LOW-RESOURCE SETTINGS**’ held in partnership with the University of *Yaoundé’s Faculty of Medical and Biochemical Sciences* and the *Royal College of Physicians London*. This took place 23-24 October 2024. We raised some funds for the conference.

F. Cameroon Medical Council (CMC) Updates

There has been a recent change in leadership at the CMC, since then the relationship between the CMC and Cameroonian diaspora Medical Associations have stalled.

However, there is an increasing synergetic push by the

latter including CamDocUK to be more involved in health policies in Cameroon. To this effect, discussions are ongoing regarding streamlining the enrolment procedure onto the CMC register by diaspora doctors.

The Royal College of Physicians London (RCP) is looking for an opportunity to be present in Cameroon. CamDocUK is acting as a facilitator in this endeavour.



Statement from Chairperson – Dr Linda Bello

It's been another eventful year for our association, one filled with lots of awards that we were humbled to receive. Our first award was received at the Aspire Awards hosted by 'I am Cameroon.' We won the Trail blazers award for Citizen Empowerment. Following that we received the Echo Sante Award -Leadership in Health Excellence award - for our contribution to the strengthening of the national health systems.

To add to all this, in May this year we were one of 15 diaspora groups recognised at the Global Health Catalyst summit held at the University of Pennsylvania. The theme was 'Cancer Moonshot 2.0: Win-Win collaboration to advance global health and development' continued our charity work.

We continued our charity work by donating 172 reading glasses to Solidarity Clinic in Buea in February. We supported one of our members Dr Elvis Ngassa in his collaboration with ASCOVIME earlier this year in the Eastern Region where he participated in one of their surgical missions. We donated 23kg of medical equipment vital to this surgical mission, including surgical instruments, wound dressing packs, foley catheters and surgical mesh for hernia repairs.

We continued our series of webinars "CamDocUK – Talking with the Community" and are currently on our 16th edition. These webinars have been well attended and I would like to thank our community for attending and engaging in these sessions, as well as our external speakers for all their time and input.

Our links with our sister organisations have remained strong and we have forged some new partnerships and Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs). We supported Patcha Foundation in a medical mission which took place between the 21st to the 25th of June this year in Makenene. It has been a pleasure to watch our numbers increase again this year.

This was very evident at our OGM (ordinary general meeting) where we had a record turnout. I am very grateful for the commitment of our members. I will say this again - we are not a very large association but what we lack in numbers we make up

A. Meetings held this year

CamDocUK normally holds 3 meetings a year – two ordinary meetings and a general assembly. The latter is usually accompanied by a gala event. 2 OGMs were held in October 2022 and March 2023, and an AGM in July 2023.

C. EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

Our annual paid zoom account has enabled us run educational webinars for the Cameroonian and African communities. We continue to run regular webinars on various topics that are deemed beneficial to the public. BAME populations have some of the highest mortality rates, and so after sampling opinions from the public, we have run several webinars specifically targeting these. The series is themed: "Talking with the community". Topics included:

1. The foolproof strategy to live a healthy life.
2. Procedures for sourcing unlicensed medicines for compassionate use.

We have also held fortnightly in-house educational activities such as journal club, where we not only discuss topics on research, but also support international doctors in improving their practice in the UK.





Statement from Chairperson (Dr Linda Bello)

After a challenging year in which we had to all adapt to our new normal. This year saw us being able to return to our face-to-face activities in particular our gala which is one of the main ways we raise funds.

I was grateful for the fantastic turn out at the event where we had 220 guests. This enabled us to have a successful fundraising. My thanks to the Social Committee for a fantastic event in which were sold out for the first time.

I sent out detailed reports to all our donors who had contributed to our PPE project and sent videos of the PPE being delivered. We were also featured on TV in Cameroon for our good work. A special thanks again to HERO Cameroon for collaborating with us.

We continued our series of Webinars – Camdocuk talking with the community. We also successfully secured books for the medical library in the University of Dschang via the BMA.

A special thanks to my executive team for all their hard work and to our members. I have always said that what we lack in numbers we more than make up for with commitment and passion.

A. Meetings held this year

CamDocUK normally holds 3 meetings a year – two ordinary meetings and a general assembly. The latter is usually accompanied by a gala event. 2 OGMs were held in September 2021 and March 2022, and an AGM in July 2022. Our OGM normally holds on the first Saturday of March and October, however, due to logistic issues, it was agreed by the executive to have a September meeting instead.

The AGM, which is our biggest meeting held at Chesford Grange Hotel, Warwickshire. An external speaker, Prof Alan graced the event by a keynote speech – **“Investing in Children`s Nutrition for Adult Wellbeing and National Development in Africa”**.

This was followed by a fund-raising gala. This year`s fundraising theme was a general support towards the community activities that CamDocUK has been spearheading, as described in this report.

B. MOU and Partnership updates

Wee maintained our existing MOUs:

1. HERO Cameroon– Health Education and Research Organisation. A dynamic Cameroon-based organisation active in the public health sector in Cameroon. HERO ran our PPE project.

2. Ensemble Manchester: We have partnered with the Manchester-based organisation in community nutrition projects.

BAME groups experienced the highest mortality rates during the pandemic and we have been providing our support to the government regarding this.

6. MMPF: As is often the case, 2 of our members represented CamDocUK at the MMPF medical mission in Cameroon, where medical care was provided free of charge to underprivileged populations. We also donated medical equipment and medicines in support of the medical mission.

CamDocUK has also inadvertently established itself as the unofficial go-to organisation for the public, with several popular media houses requesting collaboration for interviews on various medical topics.

D. Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) Project

This has been the highlight of the year. At the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, a massive fundraising campaign was launched, probably the biggest carried out by the association to date with £24,626.40 raised from the public. 3000 gloves, 3000 face masks, 375 face shields, 300 protective gowns and 30 liters of sanitiser were purchased mostly from China, and distributed across all 10 regions of Cameroon. 


