ACT Foundation is an international charitable network operating across more than 28 countries, established to provide humanitarian assistance and support to vulnerable communities. The Foundation's charitable purposes include disaster relief, the advancement of education, the relief of poverty and hunger, the promotion of health, and the protection of human dignity.

ACT International Foundation undertakes activities both internationally and within the United Kingdom. In the UK, the Foundation supports local charitable initiatives, including the provision of food to individuals experiencing homelessness and assistance to animal welfare sanctuaries. These activities are delivered in furtherance of the Foundation's charitable objectives and public benefit obligations.

Internationally, ACT International Foundation works in partnership with registered ACT Foundation teams and trusted local organisations to ensure that aid is delivered effectively, lawfully, and in alignment with the Foundation's governing objectives. Local partner teams in countries such as Sri Lanka, India, Nepal and Thailand have implemented relief programmes with appropriate oversight and accountability.

All activities undertaken in the United Kingdom are delivered by volunteers. The Foundation also collaborates with other charitable and non-profit organisations on an ad hoc basis where objectives are aligned and partnerships support effective delivery of charitable outcomes.

The trustees are committed to ensuring sound governance, financial prudence, and responsible risk management. The Foundation does not undertake activities that would expose it to undue financial risk. All operations are fully insured through Zurich Insurance Company, providing appropriate and comprehensive cover for the Foundation's activities.

Through effective governance, international cooperation, and the commitment of volunteers and partners, ACT International Foundation continues to deliver humanitarian assistance, respond to emergencies, and support communities in rebuilding their lives in a manner that is lawful, accountable, and consistent with its charitable purposes.

- a) The prevention or relief of poverty worldwide by providing donations, aid and services to people in need and/or charities, or other organisations working to prevent or relieve poverty.
- b) The relief of sickness and preservation of health among the sick-poor worldwide.
- c) The relief of people in need worldwide either generally or individually through the provision of education, training and skills.
- d) For the benefit of the public to relieve the suffering of animals in need of care and attention and, in particular, to provide and maintain rescue homes or other facilities for the reception, care and treatment of such animals.

UK Activities – Achievements and Performance

During this year period, ACT International Foundation carried out charitable activities across the United Kingdom to relieve poverty, support vulnerable individuals, promote animal welfare, and strengthen community wellbeing.

The charity supported people experiencing homelessness by preparing and distributing approximately 2,200 nutritious vegan meals through regular outreach activities and partnerships with local organisations. Essential items including clothing, toiletries, and blankets were also provided.

To address food insecurity, the charity donated over 5,000 kilograms of food to individuals and families via food banks and community groups. In addition, approximately 2,000 kilograms of food were donated to support animal welfare, providing essential supplies to animal sanctuaries and organisations caring for animals in need.

The charity supported children and education by providing Christmas shoeboxes to 189 schoolchildren at St Paul with St Luke Primary School in Tower Hamlets, containing educational items, toys, and treats.

Additional activities included visits to elderly care homes, blood donation drives, ongoing support for animal sanctuaries, and environmental initiatives such as canal clean-up projects.

These activities delivered clear public benefit by alleviating hardship, improving food security for people and animals, reducing social isolation, and supporting environmental protection.

International Activities – Achievements and Performance

During this year period, ACT International Foundation supported a range of international charitable projects aimed at relieving poverty, addressing food insecurity, supporting education, improving health and sanitation, promoting animal welfare, and responding to humanitarian emergencies. The charity worked in partnership with local ACT teams and trusted community organisations to ensure that support was delivered efficiently and reached those most in need.

International activities included emergency disaster relief, school meal programmes, food and essential aid distribution, water and sanitation projects, support for elderly care, and animal welfare initiatives. These projects provided both immediate relief and longer-term benefits, helping to strengthen community resilience in underserved regions.

These international activities delivered clear public benefit by providing emergency relief, improving access to food, water, sanitation, and education,

ACT International Foundation, as part of the wider ACT global disaster relief network, played an active role in supporting humanitarian response efforts during times of crisis. The charity demonstrated its commitment to effective and compassionate disaster relief by providing support in response to flooding in Kenya, Bangladesh, and Sri Lanka. Working in coordination with local ACT teams and trusted partners, ACT International Foundation contributed to the delivery of emergency assistance, including food and essential supplies, ensuring timely and practical support reached affected communities. Through coordinated planning and collaboration, the charity helped address immediate humanitarian needs while supporting recovery efforts in regions impacted by natural disasters.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

United Kingdom

Homeless Outreach and Meal Distribution

ACT Foundation UK supported people experiencing homelessness by preparing and distributing approximately 2,200 nutritious vegan meals during 2024. Outreach activities took place in Central London, Uxbridge, Windsor, Reading, Manchester, and surrounding areas, delivered in partnership with local shelters, soup kitchens, and community organisations.

Food Bank and Community Food Support

To address food insecurity, the charity donated over 5,181 kilograms of food to individuals and families through food banks and community organisations, primarily in Reading and the surrounding areas. Partner organisations included CIRDIC Churches in Reading Drop-in Centre, Faith Christian Group Reading, Bed for the Night Reading, Community Kitchen at Park United Reformed Church, Sadaka Reading, and Woodley Food Bank.

School Food Hampers

ACT Foundation UK distributed school food hampers to families experiencing financial hardship, particularly during school holiday periods. These activities were delivered in Reading and nearby communities, helping to support children's nutrition and household food security.

Christmas Shoebox Appeal

The charity delivered 189 Christmas shoeboxes to pupils at St Paul with St Luke Primary School in Tower Hamlets, London. Each shoebox contained educational items, toys, and treats, supporting children's wellbeing and educational engagement.

Elderly Care Home Visits

Volunteers carried out elderly care home visits across local UK communities, providing companionship, social interaction, and emotional support to residents, helping to reduce isolation and improve wellbeing.

Blood Donation Drives

ACT Foundation UK encouraged community participation in blood donation drives, supporting national health services by promoting and participating in blood donation activities at UK donation centres.

Animal Welfare Support

The charity supported animal welfare by donating approximately 2,000 kilograms of food to animal sanctuaries and welfare organisations across the UK, helping to ensure animals in care received adequate nutrition.

Environmental Projects

Environmental responsibility formed part of the charity's work through canal clean-up projects and other volunteer-led environmental initiatives in local UK communities, contributing to environmental protection and community wellbeing.

Volunteer-Led Community Service Activities

Across all UK projects, ACT Foundation UK coordinated over 100 service activities and delivered approximately 1,700 volunteer hours, demonstrating a strong commitment to selfless service and measurable public benefit.

International projects**Sri Lanka**

ACT International Foundation supported multiple humanitarian and development initiatives in Sri Lanka. Activities included disaster relief assistance, school meal programmes, and food ration distribution to vulnerable families. The charity also contributed to the construction of wells and sanitation facilities, improving access to clean water and hygiene.

Nepal

In Nepal, the charity focused on long-term community development and improving basic living conditions. Support was provided for school meal programmes to improve child nutrition and school attendance.

India

ACT International Foundation supported projects in India aimed at relieving poverty and supporting vulnerable individuals and families. Assistance included food rations, child support initiatives, and contributions to community welfare projects delivered through local partners, helping to address basic needs and improve quality of life. In addition, support was provided to elderly care project, Mohanji Homes for Seniors, promoting dignity and wellbeing for older people.

Kenya

Following severe flooding during the year, ACT International Foundation provided emergency disaster relief in Kenya. Funds were allocated to local ACT teams to support families affected by the floods, helping to meet urgent needs such as food and essential supplies.

Bangladesh

The charity responded to flooding in Bangladesh by providing disaster relief funding to local partners. Support focused on addressing immediate humanitarian needs, including access to food and basic necessities for affected communities.

Thailand

In Thailand, the charity supported food distribution and community support projects, helping vulnerable individuals and families meet basic needs and providing relief during periods of hardship.

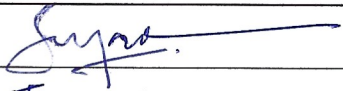

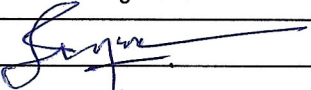
