Provide financial support, facilities and advice to sufferers of cancer related diseases and associated family and friends who are in need of rehabilitation as a result of such illness to enable them to resume a normal life and introduce them to the benefits of sport and recreational activities. Provide financial support in the form of grants and donations to local hospices to enable them to provide treatment and care of persons suffering from mental or physical illness of any description, in particular for those who are suffering from cancer related diseases. Provide financial support, facilities and advice for those suffering from mental or physical illness of any description or in need of rehabilitation through specialist expertise and resources. Enhance the knowledge of the general public of cancer related diseases through educational campaigns. Work with and co-operate with other related charities to support the development of treatment and cures of cancer related diseases through the use of grants and external knowledge.
