TRUSTEES' REPORT (INCLUDING DIRECTORS' REPORT)

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2025

The trustees present their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 31 August 2025.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the financial statements and comply with the charity's Memorandum and Articles of Association, the Companies Act 2006 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)".

Objectives and activities

The charity objects are for the public benefit to advance the Christian Faith in accordance with the Statement of Beliefs in the United Kingdom or the World as the Trustees may from time to time think fit, and to fulfil such other purposes which are exclusively charitable according to the Law of England and Wales and are connected with the charitable work of the Charity.

Public benefit

The trustees have complied with their duty in section 17(5) of the 2011 Charities Act to have due regard to guidance published by the Charity Commission and consider the objects and activities of the Charity to be for Public Benefit.

Achievements and performance

Mahabba continued in its desire to be a grassroots-led movement: our Network held a 'Vision Day' in June 2024. The equivalent of an AGM, but with a particular network feel, we gathered individuals from around the country, inspiring, encouraging and sharing together. This established the AVM as an annual event, focused on being even more accessible, helpful and relevant to people in our Network. People shared encouraging stories and the vision for praying for and interacting with Muslims.

Another success from the year were the online workshop-webinars on Zoom. Mahabba provided the publicity, platform and technology. Our Network helped to support and equip Mahabba groups through these online events. Among others, one addressed various ways Christians can support refugees in the UK.

Another highlight is the Resources Circle, which continues to gather, edit and curate a set of high-quality resources on the Mahabba website. These cover a broad range but focus on helping individuals and groups with prayer topics, ideas for prayer meetings, recommended books, and all for free. The resources area continues to be one of the most popular areas of the website and sees a significant amount of traffic around key search terms on how to engage positively with Muslims.

Mahabba's main focus continues to be on prayer. Each month around fifty Mahabba groups engage in prayer locally for Muslims at a place and time of their choosing, some of the groups meet weekly. Mahabba also hosted a monthly online day time prayer meeting on a Thursday and a weekly half hour prayer meeting on a Friday that was open to all.

During Ramadan (Feb/March 2025) Mahabba offered five weekly online prayer meetings on a Friday evening led by different Mahabba groups. A special online evening prayer meeting was also arranged 6 months on from Ramadan.

The network has continued to develop friendly, active WhatsApp groups for support and encouragement. These platforms have provided a practical out-working for sharing information, faith and building relationships.

Internally, volunteer team leaders of Circles within the Network (groups of volunteers that facilitate the activity of particular areas) met to look at how to meet the needs and challenges of individuals in the Network.

The annual in person gathering for Mahabba leaders took place in November 2024 in Birmingham where we reviewed and set priorities for the year.

Financial review

The charity recorded a surplus for the year of £2,832 (2024: deficit of £2,808). At the financial year end the charity held funds of £20,361 (2024: £17,529).

The charity has a reserve policy of maintaining reserves equivalent to at least three months operating expenditure. The charity has met this policy throughout the year.

Major risks

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

Structure, governance and management

The charity is a company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 7 September 2012.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2025

1 Accounting policies

Company information

Mahabba Network is a private company limited by guarantee incorporated in England and Wales. The registered office is Chantry House, 22 Upperton Road, Eastbourne, East Sussex, BN21 1BF.

1.1 Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the charity's Memorandum and Articles of Association, the Companies Act 2006 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)". The charity is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

The charity has taken advantage of the provisions in the SORP for charities applying FRS 102 Update Bulletin 1 not to prepare a Statement of Cash Flows.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

1.2 Going concern

At the time of approving the financial statements, the trustees have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus the trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

1.3 Charitable funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of their charitable objectives.

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors or grantors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the financial statements.

1.4 Income

Income is recognised when the charity is legally entitled to it after any performance conditions have been met, the amounts can be measured reliably, and it is probable that income will be received.

Cash donations are recognised on receipt. Other donations are recognised once the charity has been notified of the donation, unless performance conditions require deferral of the amount. Income tax recoverable in relation to donations received under Gift Aid or deeds of covenant is recognised at the time of the donation.

1.5 Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to transfer economic benefit to a third party, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement, and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Expenditure is classified by activity. The costs of each activity are made up of the total of direct costs and shared costs, including support costs involved in undertaking each activity. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs which contribute to more than one activity and support costs which are not attributable to a single activity are apportioned between those activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources. Central staff costs are allocated on the basis of time spent, and depreciation charges are allocated on the portion of the asset's use.

1 Accounting policies (Continued)

Expenditure is recognised when an obligation exists, payment is probable and the amount is measurable. Resources expended include irrecoverable VAT.

1.6 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities.

1.7 Financial instruments

The charity has elected to apply the provisions of Section 11 'Basic Financial Instruments' and Section 12 'Other Financial Instruments Issues' of FRS 102 to all of its financial instruments.

Financial instruments are recognised in the charity's balance sheet when the charity becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset, with the net amounts presented in the financial statements, when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Basic financial assets

Basic financial assets, which include trade and other receivables and cash and bank balances, are initially measured at transaction price including transaction costs and are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial assets classified as receivable within one year are not amortised.

Basic financial liabilities

Basic financial liabilities, including trade and other payables and bank loans are initially recognised at transaction price unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the debt instrument is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial liabilities classified as payable within one year are not amortised.

Debt instruments are subsequently carried at amortised cost, using the effective interest rate method.

Trade payables are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of operations from suppliers. Amounts payable are classified as current liabilities if payment is due within one year or less. If not, they are presented as non-current liabilities. Trade payables are recognised initially at transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Derecognition of financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are derecognised when the charity's contractual obligations expire or are discharged or cancelled.

1.8 Employee benefits

The cost of any unused holiday entitlement is recognised in the period in which the employee's services are received.

Termination benefits are recognised immediately as an expense when the charity is demonstrably committed to terminate the employment of an employee or to provide termination benefits.

1.9 Taxation

The trustees consider that the charity is not liable to United Kingdom corporation taxation on its charitable activities.

2 Critical accounting estimates and judgements

In the application of the charity's accounting policies, the trustees are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amount of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised where the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods where the revision affects both current and future periods.
