Trustees Report 2024

The Trustees have the pleasure of submitting their report and accounts for the year ended 31st December 2024, which financial statement has been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on pages to and comply with the statement of recommended practice (SORP2015), and the applicable law.

OBJECTIVES

As stated in our trust deed, RCCG WINNERS ASSEMBLY's objectives are the alleviation of poverty and the advancement of the Christian faith. In pursuit of this goal, we held regular Sunday services, bible studies, and seminars that are tailored towards meeting the spiritual needs of our members.

To alleviate poverty in our community, our six registered projects that serve our community free of charge have continued to help us achieve this purpose.

- The Aydee project – (Helping people with addiction problems)
- Food and Shade project – (Reaching out to the homeless)
- Christ Saturday school – (Helping year 7 students with their studies)
- The senior companion – (Reaching out to the elderly)
- Christ Foodbank – (Helping struggling families)
- The young people forum – (Reaching out to the youth)

ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

The year 2024 can be said to be a very successful year for us as a charity. Spiritually the church has improved and numerically we have increased.

Our Sunday services have seen a greater number of attendees and more and more people added to the church daily.

For our bible studies and prayer meetings we have continued to meet onsite and online via zoom cloud meeting. This has boosted our attendance as more parishioners find it easier to fellowship from the comfort of their homes.

Our senior companion project and Christ food bank have continued to help those vulnerable members in our community and beyond. We delivered food items to two elderly homes at least twice a week throughout the year in two neighborhoods

Since our own drop-in center has been suspended due to issues with our landlord, we have now teamed up with another organization to deliver food to their center four times a week. This is making a lot of impact in their lives.

This year we were able to hold our usual Christmas carol with over 300 hamper boxes given out free of charge at the event. We held it in a different location and it can be said that it was the most successful of all so far. It was electrifying as it brought Christmas cheer to all, resident and passersby alike.

Throughout this year our foodbank served over 20 families every week not forgetting our parishioners who were also struggling financially and benefited from the foodbank.

We were also able to organize successfully a marriage seminar where we brought couples together over breakfast and had teachings on how to have a peaceful and successful marital relationship. It was well attended and all who did were blessed.

Over, it can be said that the year 2024 was very good.

Financial Review

The principal funding is provided mainly through voluntary tithes and offerings by the church members and through gift aid scheme. Pledges are also taken for specific projects.

The net incoming resources for the year amounted to £ - 16,722.88 (2018 was £-3260)

All these have been unrestricted reserves and no fund is allotted to restricted projects. The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, particularly those relating to the operations and finance and are satisfied with the risk management systems in place to mitigate any risk exposure.

Structure, Governance, and Management Constitution

The charity is constituted under a trust deed and registered with the Charity Commission of England and Wales. RCCG WINNERS ASSEMBLY is a member of the Redeemed Christian Church of God (RCCG), which has parishes worldwide. The relationship is governed by an agreement of common purposes between the parishes and RCCG.

The charity's management is the responsibility of the trustees, who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the trust deed. The church is organized so that the trustees meet regularly to manage its affairs. A minister and volunteers manage the church's day-to-day administration.

Future development

Due to our numerical increase, we are now seriously planning to acquire our own property for the charity. The trustee has approved the opening of a dedicated savings bank account with Kingdom Bank, where savings will be made towards the acquisition of this property.

This means that we are no longer looking for a place to let as we are at peace in our present property, even though we have outgrown the property.

Our vision of owning and running a night shelter for the homeless is still very much alive, and so is our desire to run our own orphanage in Africa. We believe these will be achieved one day.

Note 1 Basis of preparation

1.1 Basis of accounting

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant note(s) to these accounts. The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Inland (FRS102) issued on 16 July 2014 and with the Charities Act 2011 and the Charity constitutes a public benefit as defined by FRS102.

Note 2 Accounting policies

2.1 RECONCILIATION WITH PREVIOUS GENERALLY ACCEPTED ACCOUNTING PRACTICE

There is no change in accounting policy in this period

2.2 INCOME

Recognition of income

These are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when:

- the charity becomes entitled to the resources;
- it is more likely than not that the trustees will receive the resources; and
- the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Offsetting

There has been no offsetting of assets and liabilities, or income and expenses.

Grants and donations

Grants and donations are only included in the SoFA when the general income recognition criteria are met (5.10 to 5.12 FRS 102 SORP).

In the case of performance related grants, income must only be recognised to the extent that the charity has provided the specified goods or services as entitlement to the grant only occurs when the performance related conditions are met (5.16 FRS 102 SORP).

Legacies

Government grants

Tax reclaims on donations and gifts

Gift Aid receivable is included in income when there is a valid declaration from the donor. Any Gift Aid amount recovered on a donation is considered to be part of that gift and is treated as an addition to the same fund as the initial donation unless the donor or the terms of the appeal have specified otherwise.

Contractual income and performance related grants

Donated goods

There is no donated good.

Donated services and facilities

Donated services and facilities are included in the SOFA when received at the value of the gift to the charity provided the value of the gift can be measured reliably.

Donated services and facilities that are consumed immediately are recognised as income with an equivalent amount recognised as an expense under the appropriate heading in the SOFA.

Support costs

The charity has incurred expenditure on support costs.

Volunteer help

The value of any voluntary help received is not included in the accounts but is described in the trustees' annual report.

Income from interest, royalties and dividends

Not applicable during this period.

Income from membership subscriptions

Tithes and offering received from the members are in the nature of a gift are recognised as Donations and Legacies

Settlement of insurance claims

Insurance claims are only included in the SoFA when the general income recognition criteria are met (5.10 to 5.12 FRS 102 SORP) and are included as an item of other income in the SoFA.

Investment gains and losses

This includes any realised or unrealised gains or losses on the sale of investments and any gain or loss resulting from revaluing investments to market value at the end of the year.

2.3 EXPENDITURE AND LIABILITIES**Liability recognition**

Liabilities are recognised where it is more likely than not that there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources and the amount of the obligation can be measured with reasonable certainty.

Governance and support costs

Support costs have been allocated between governance costs and other support. Governance costs comprise all costs involving public accountability of the charity and its compliance with regulation and good practice.

Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of resources, eg allocating property costs by floor areas, or per capita, staff costs by the time spent and other costs by their usage.

Grants with performance conditions

The Charity is not awarding grant to any organisation

Grants payable without performance conditions

Where there are no conditions attaching to the grant that enables the donor charity to realistically avoid the commitment, a liability for the full funding obligation must be recognised.

Redundancy cost

The charity made no redundancy payments during the reporting period.

Deferred income

No material item of deferred income has been included in the accounts.

Creditors

The charity has creditors which are measured at settlement amounts less any trade discounts

Provisions for liabilities

A liability is measured on recognition at its historical cost and then subsequently measured at the best estimate of the amount required to settle the obligation at the reporting date

Basic financial instruments

The charity accounts for basic financial instruments on initial recognition as per paragraph 10.7 FRS 102 SORP. Subsequent measurement is as per paragraphs 11.17 to 11.19, FRS 102 SORP. The above is not applicable to RCCG WINNERS ASSEMBLY

2.4 ASSETS

Investments

The same treatment is applied to unlisted investments unless fair value cannot be measured reliably in which case it is measured at cost less impairment.

Investments held for resale or pending their sale and cash and cash equivalents with a maturity date of less than 1 year are treated as current asset investments

Stocks and work in progress

Stocks held for sale as part of non-charitable trade are measured at the lower or cost or net realisable value.

Goods or services provided as part of a charitable activity are measured at net realisable value based on the service potential provided by items of stock.

Work in progress is valued at cost less any foreseeable loss that is likely to occur on the contract.

Debtors

Debtors (including trade debtors and loans receivable) are measured on initial recognition at settlement amount after any trade discounts or amount advanced by the charity. Subsequently, they are measured at the cash or other consideration expected to be received.

Current asset investments

The charity has investments which it holds for resale or pending their sale and cash and cash equivalents with a maturity date less than one year. These include cash on deposit and cash equivalents with a maturity date of less than one year held for investment purposes rather than to meet short term cash commitments as they fall due.

The Trustees have the pleasure of submitting their report and accounts for the year ended 31st December 2023, which financial statement have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on pages to and comply with the statement of recommended practice (SORP2015), and the applicable law.

OBJECTIVES

The Objectives of RCCG WINNERS ASSEMBLY as a clarity as stated in our trust deed is the advancement of the Christian faith, and the alleviation of poverty. To achieve this goal we held regular Sunday services, bible studies and seminars that cover all aspect of human existence for the benefit of our members.

To alleviate poverty in our community we have established and registered six projects that benefit our community.

- The Aydee project – (Helping people with addiction problems)
- Food and Shade project – (Reaching out to the homeless)
- Christ Saturday school – (Helping year 7 students with their studies)
- The senior companion – (Reaching out to the elderly)
- Christ Foodbank – (Helping struggling families)
- The young people forum – (Reaching out to the youth)

ACTIVITIES

The year 2023 was fairly stable for us as a charity. The church grew exponentially than any other year before now. With this level of increase in membership. It will be a big problem for us to accommodate all our members if all come to worship on a Sunday.

For our bible studies and prayer meetings we have continued to meet onsite and online via zoom cloud meeting. This has boosted our attendance to some extent but still far behind compared to our ratio of membership.

Our food and Shade project and the Aydee projects are still on hold at the moment because we are yet to secure a property to operate from.

This year we have continued to do delivery of food to the elderly four times a week. We are also able to run our foodbank successfully throughout the year.

We were also able to hold our usual Christmas carol this year with over 250 hamper boxes given out at the event free of charge.

Achievements

Throughout this year our foodbank served over 20 families every week. We also delivered assorted food items to an elderly home a minimum of three times every week. Our Christmas carol cheered up members of our community with over 250 hampers given away to members of our community free of charge.

Financial Review

The principal funding is provided mainly through voluntary tithes and offerings by the church members and through gift aid scheme. Pledges are also taken for specific projects.

The net incoming resources for the year amounted to £25,936.43 (2022 was £14,255).

All these have been unrestricted reserves and no fund is allotted to restricted projects. The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, particularly those relating to the operations and finance and are satisfied with the risk management systems in place to mitigate any risk exposure.

Structure, Governance and Management Constitution

The charity is constituted under a trust deed and is registered with the charity commission of England and Wales. RCCG WINNERS ASSEMBLY is a member of Redeemed Christian Church of God (RCCG) which has parishes all over the world. The relationship is governed by an agreement of common purposes between the parishes and RCCG.

The management of the charity is the responsibility of the trustees who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the trust deed. The church is organized so that the trustees meet regularly to manage its affairs. There is a minister and volunteers, who manage the day-to-day administration of the church.

Future development

We are still in search of a property of our own so that the shade and Aydee project can resume operations once more. Our dream of a night shelter is still very much alive and so is our desire to run an orphanage in Africa. We believe that all this will be achieved one day.

The trustees have the pleasure in submitting their report and accounts for the year ended 31st December 2022 which's final statement have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on pages 7 to 17 and comply with the statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2015), and the applicable law.

Objectives and Activities

The objective of RCCG Winners Assembly as a charity as stated in our trust deed is the advancement of the Christian faith and the alleviation of poverty. To achieve this goal, we hold regular Sunday services, bible studies and seminars for the benefit of our members. To alleviate poverty in our community we have established and registered six projects that are run from our centre for the benefit of everyone unconditionally. These projects are:

- Aydee Project (helping people with addiction problems)
- Food and shade projects (reaching out to the homeless)
- Christ Saturday school (helping year 7 students with their studies)
- The senior's companion (reaching out to the elderly)
- Christ food (for helping struggling families)
- The youth (reaching out to the youths)

Activities and Achievements

We reported in the year 2021 that our new place of worship couldn't accommodate our projects based on the conditions of our lease. Consequently, none of our community-oriented projects domiciled in our property was able to run in the year 2022. However, we were able to continue to serve a small Spanish community from our foodbank after our landlord permitted us. We were able to continue to deliver sandwiches and food items to two elderly people's homes.

This year under review, we were able to organise our yearly BBQ in the park for the homeless and people suffering from substance abuse. The attendance was massive as it was the first time since COVID. It gave people the opportunity to come out as a community after COVID. In addition, at Christmas we gave out over 250 hamper boxes to various homes around our locality. An exercise that brought community spirit, joy and love to our neighbours. It was a great experience.

Spirituality and numerically we grew tremendously with 2-3 people being added to our congregation every week. This also has translated into more people in attendance at our bible studies and prayer meetings.

Financial Review

The principal funding is provided mainly through voluntary tithes and offerings by the church members and through Gift Aid scheme. Pledges are also taken from specific projects. The net incoming resources for the year amounted to £14,254.92 (2021 was £-6,248). All these have been unrestricted reserves and no fund is allotted to restricted projects. The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, particularly those relating to the operations and finance and are satisfied with the risk management systems in place to mitigate any risk exposure.

Structure, Governance and management constitution

The charity is constituted under a Trust Deed and is registered with the Charity Commission of England and Wales. RCCG- Winners Assembly is a member of Redeemed Christian Church of God [RCCG] which has parishes all over the world. The relationship is governed by an 'Agreement for common purposes, between the parishes an RCCG. The management of the charity is the responsibility of the Trustees who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the Trust Deed. The church is organised so that the trustees meet regularly to manage its affairs. There is a Minister and Volunteers, who managed the day-to-day administration of the church.

Future Development

We are still searching for a property of our own so that we can resume with our projects as normal. We have been seriously impacted by our inability to run all our projects due to our lease conditions. We have also not forgotten running our own night shelter and an orphanage in Africa. We are very hopeful that we all these will be realised someday.

REPORT 2021

The Trustees have pleasure in submitting their report and accounts for the year ended 31st December 2021 which's financial statement have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on pages 7 to 20 and comply with the statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2015), and the applicable law.

Objectives and activities

The objectives of RCCG Winners Assembly as a charity as stated in our trust deed is the advancement of the Christian faith and the alleviation of poverty. To achieve this goal we hold regular Sunday services, bible studies and seminars for the benefit of our members. To alleviate poverty in our community we have established and registered six projects that are run from our centre for the benefit of everyone unconditionally. These projects are:

- The Aydee project – (helping people with addiction problems)
- Food and shade project –(reaching out to the homeless)
- Christ Saturday school – (helping year 7 students with their studies)
- The seniors companion –(reaching out to the elderly)
- Christ food bank- (for helping struggling families)
- The young people's forum – (reaching out to the youths)

ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

With continued presence of COVID-19 our activities were once again disrupted as in 2019, consequently our operations were limited due to the restrictions on gathering. We continued to use zoom cloud meetings for our meetings, Sunday services and bible studies. We also realised this mode of worship is associated with a lot of shortcomings in that it bred laziness and led to apathy. On resumption of our drop-in centre after restrictions by the government were lifted, we ran into another problem with our property owner who threatened to cancel our lease contract unless we stop our Aydee and shade project. The reason being that he considers our patrons as undesirable elements. We had no option other than to suspend these projects as well as our foodbank that ran skeletally. By the end of 2020 only the foodbank and the senior's companion were operational as we were still able to take food to the elderly home that we had partnered with over the years. Just as in 2019, we could not hold our community BBQ this year as well. However, our Christmas Carol service outing at the park was held. We were able to light up our community with a nice Christmas Carol and gave out over 200 hamper boxes again this year to members in our community.

Achievements and performance

In all we continue to make a large impact in our community by helping families who are struggling financially through our foodbank. With the little opportunities that we have partnering with another rehab organisation, we go into the street every Wednesday talking to people about the dangerous effects and consequences of drugs and alcohol addiction. Our food delivery days a week to the elderly home has increased tremendously since this year.

Something that makes us immensely proud of ourselves in these difficult times in our community. Though, this premises that we have just moved to ay not be suitable for our community work, it sure has been favourable spiritually. Thus, our membership has grown tremendously and there is still room for more. In addition, more of our members now attend bible studies and prayer meetings more than ever before. This has translated to growth in spirituality.

Financial Review

The principal funding is provided mainly through voluntary tithes and offerings by the church members and through gift aid scheme. Pledges are also taken for specific projects.

The net incoming resources for the year amounted to £16,722.88 (2018 was £3,260)

All these have been unrestricted reserves and no fund is allotted to restricted projects.

The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the Charity is exposed, particularly those relating to the operations and finance and are satisfied with the risk management systems in place to mitigate any risk exposure.

Structure, Governance and Management Constitution

The Charity is constituted under a Trust Deed and is registered with the Charity Commission of England and Wales. RCCG- Winners Assembly is a member of Redeemed Christian Church of God [RCCG] which has Parishes all over the world. The relationship is governed by an 'Agreement for common purposes' between the parishes and RCCG.

The management of the charity is the responsibility of the Trustees who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the Trust Deed. The church is organised so that the trustees meet regularly to manage its affairs. There is a Minister and Volunteers, who manage the day-to-day administration of the church.

Future development

We are still in search of a property of our own so that the shade and Aydee project can resume operations once more. Our dream of a night shelter is still very much alive and so is our desire to run an orphanage in Africa. We believe that all this will be achieved one day.

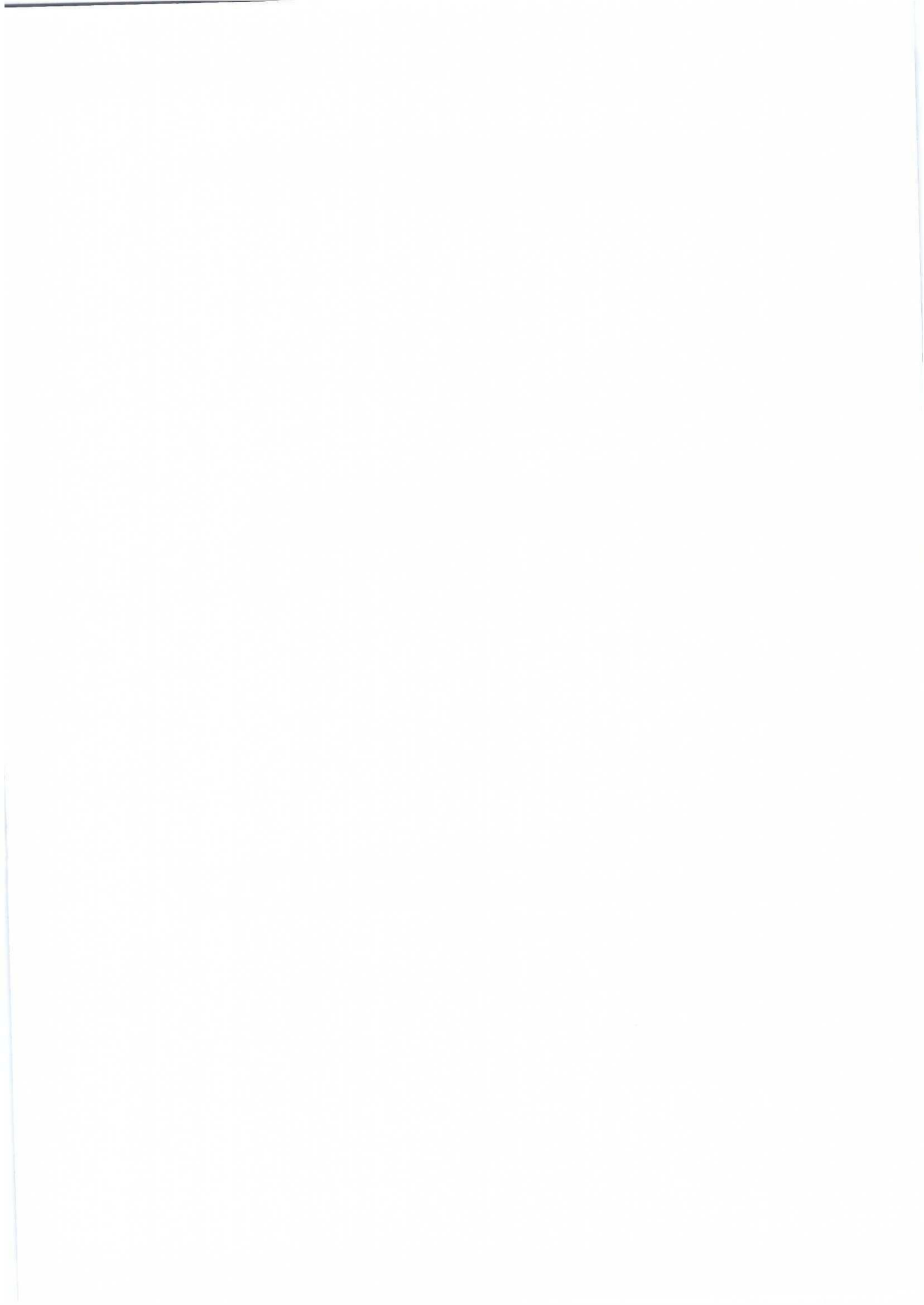

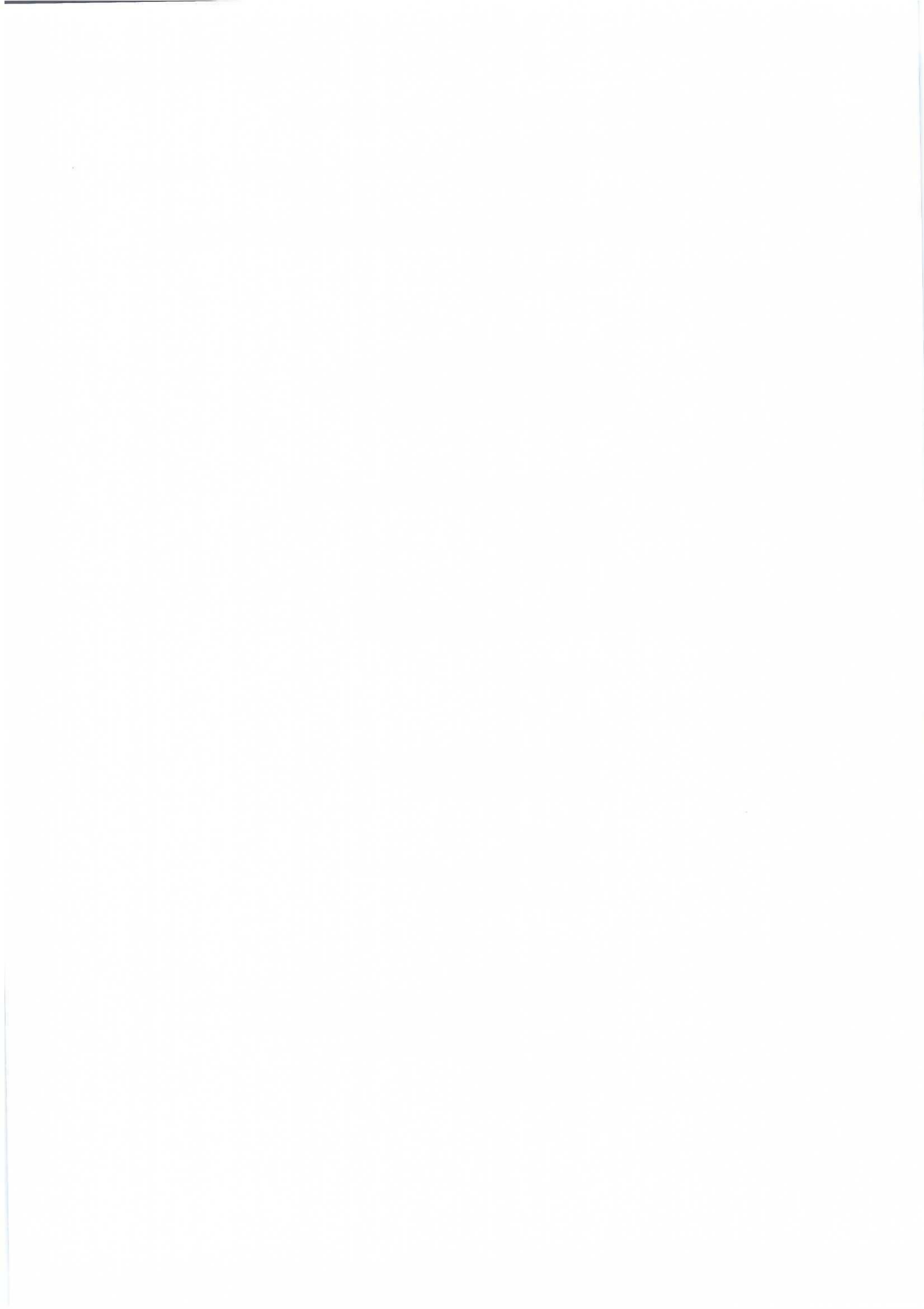

REPORT

The Trustees have pleasure in submitting their report and accounts for the year ended 31st December 2020 which's financial statement have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on pages 7 to 20 and comply with the statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2015), and the applicable law.

Objectives and activities

The objectives of RCCG Winners Assembly as a charity as stated in our trust deed is the advancement of the Christian faith and the alleviation of poverty. To achieve this goal we hold regular Sunday services, bible studies and seminars for the benefit of our members. To alleviate poverty in our community we have established and registered six projects that are run from our centre for the benefit of everyone unconditionally. These projects are:

- The Aydee project – (helping people with addiction problems)
- Food and shade project –(reaching out to the homeless)
- Christ Saturday school – (helping year 7 students with their studies)
- The seniors companion –(reaching out to the elderly)
- Christ food bank- (for helping struggling families)
- The young people's forum – (reaching out to the youths)

ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

This year being a COVID 19 year has not allowed us to perform as we used to do. Congregational worship was disrupted and eventually shut down throughout a great period of the year; and we had to improvise with Zoom cloud meeting which is a far cry to the conventional mode of worship. This did not help much in terms of the spiritual growth of the parishioners. Our drop in centre was impacted as well and ran sparingly and we had to do takeaways only. So was our Food bank as well. We couldn't have our annual community BBQ as we have always done for the past 8 years. However, we were able to hold our Christmas carol service outing at the park where we gave out 200 hamper boxes to members of our community.

Achievements and performance

we continue to supply sandwiches to two elderly people home working with Hyde Housing in addition we are glad to report that no less than 3 of our Patrons have gone back to work. In all however, it is right to say that we performed better this year than in 2018.

Financial Review

The principal funding is provided mainly through voluntary tithes and offerings by the church members and through gift aid scheme. Pledges are also taken for specific projects. The net incoming resources for the year amounted to £-16,722.88 (2018 was £-3,260) All these have been unrestricted reserves and no fund is allotted to restricted projects. The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the Charity is exposed, particularly those relating to the operations and finance and are satisfied with the risk management systems in place to mitigate any risk exposure.

Structure, Governance and Management Constitution

The Charity is constituted under a Trust Deed and is registered with the Charity Commission of England and Wales. RCCG- Winners Assembly is a member of Redeemed Christian Church of God [RCCG] which has Parishes all over the world. The relationship is governed by an 'Agreement for common purposes` between the parishes and RCCG.

The management of the charity is the responsibility of the Trustees who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the Trust Deed. The church is organised so that the trustees meet regularly to manage its affairs. There is a Minister and Volunteers, Who manage the day to day administration of the church.

Development activities

During the pandemic we lost our newly acquired place of worship because of change of landlord. Consequently, we had to secure another one where we moved to in December 2020.

We are still burning with the passion of running our own night shelter and the vision of supporting an orphanage in Nigeria in due time.

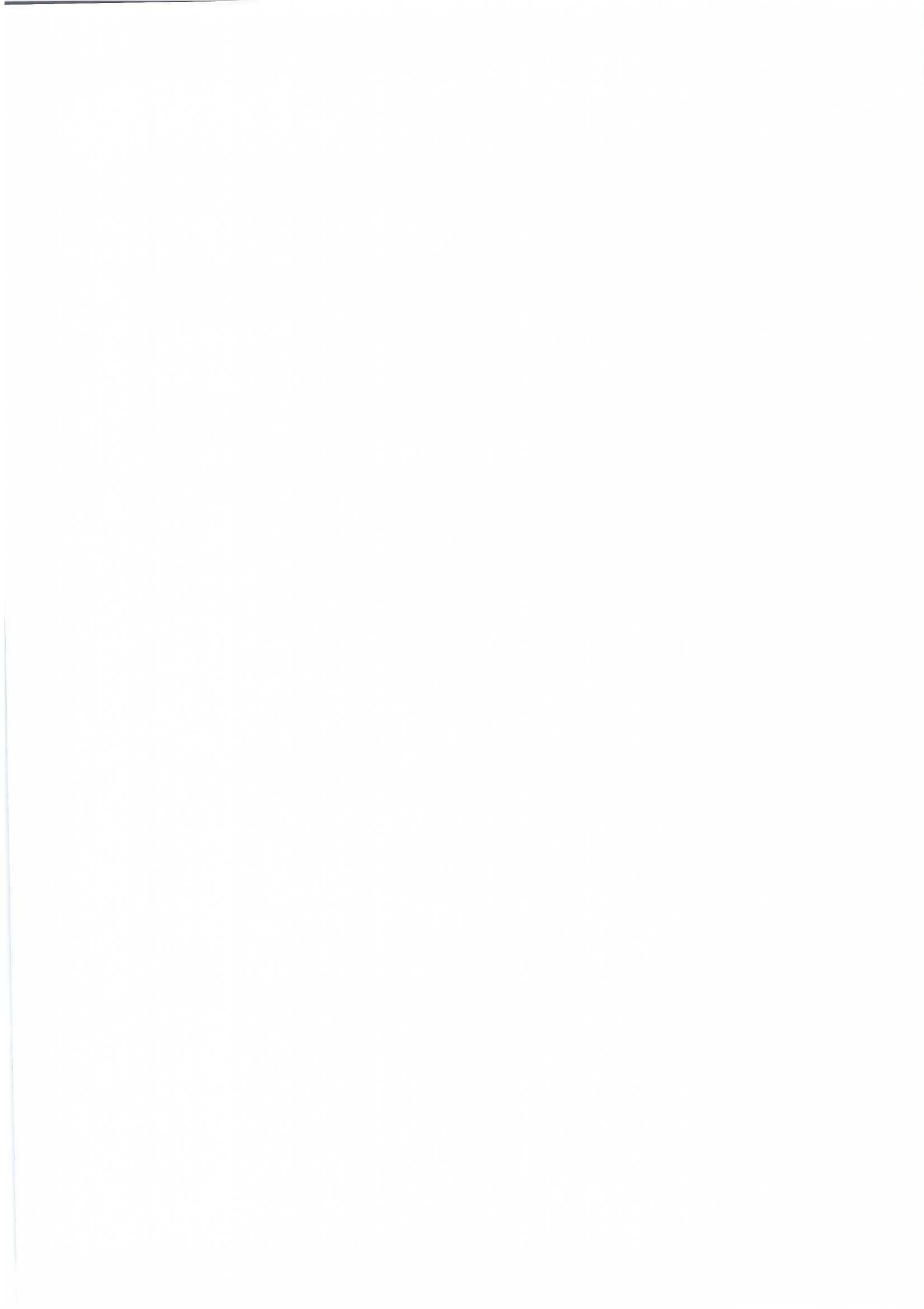

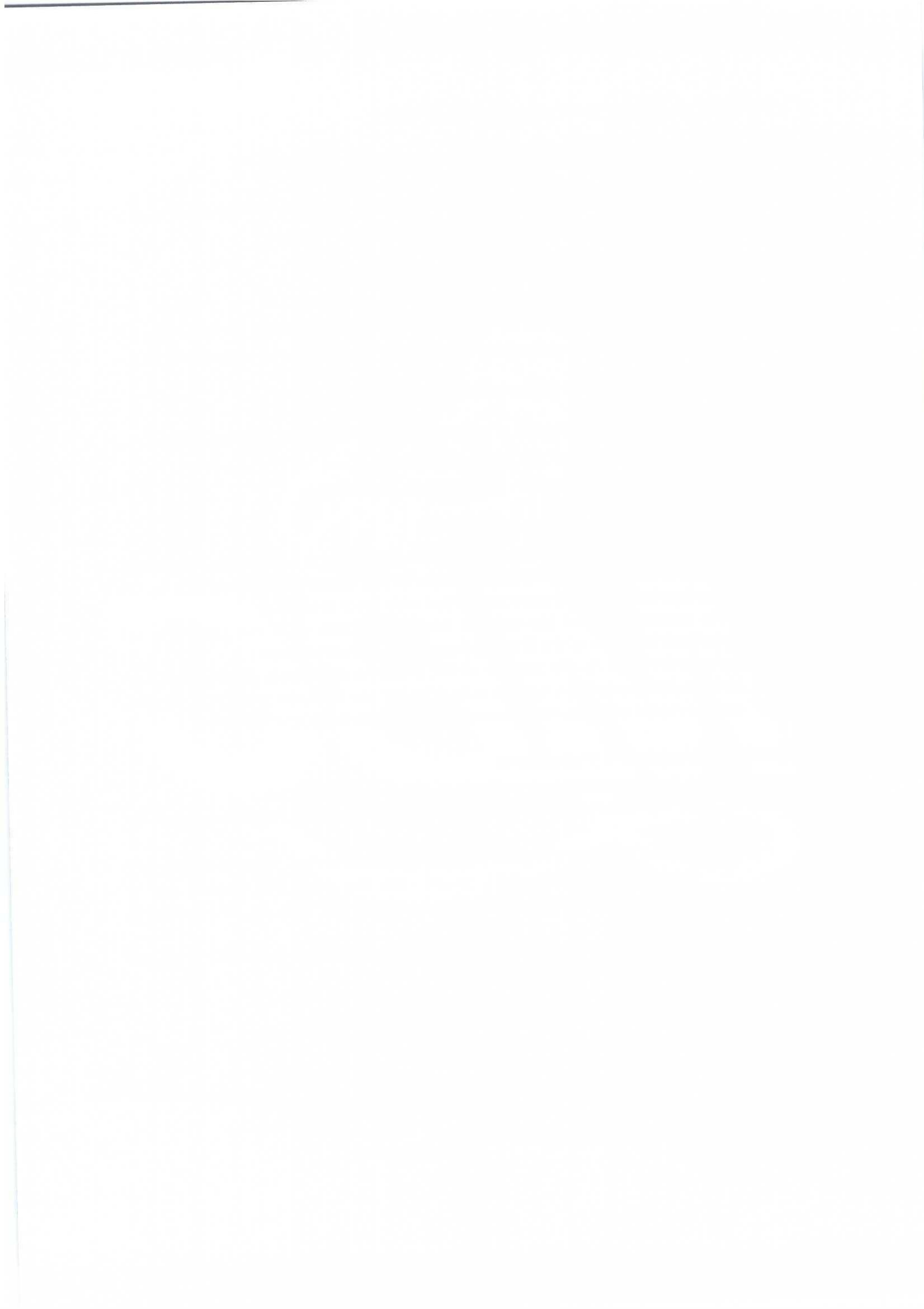

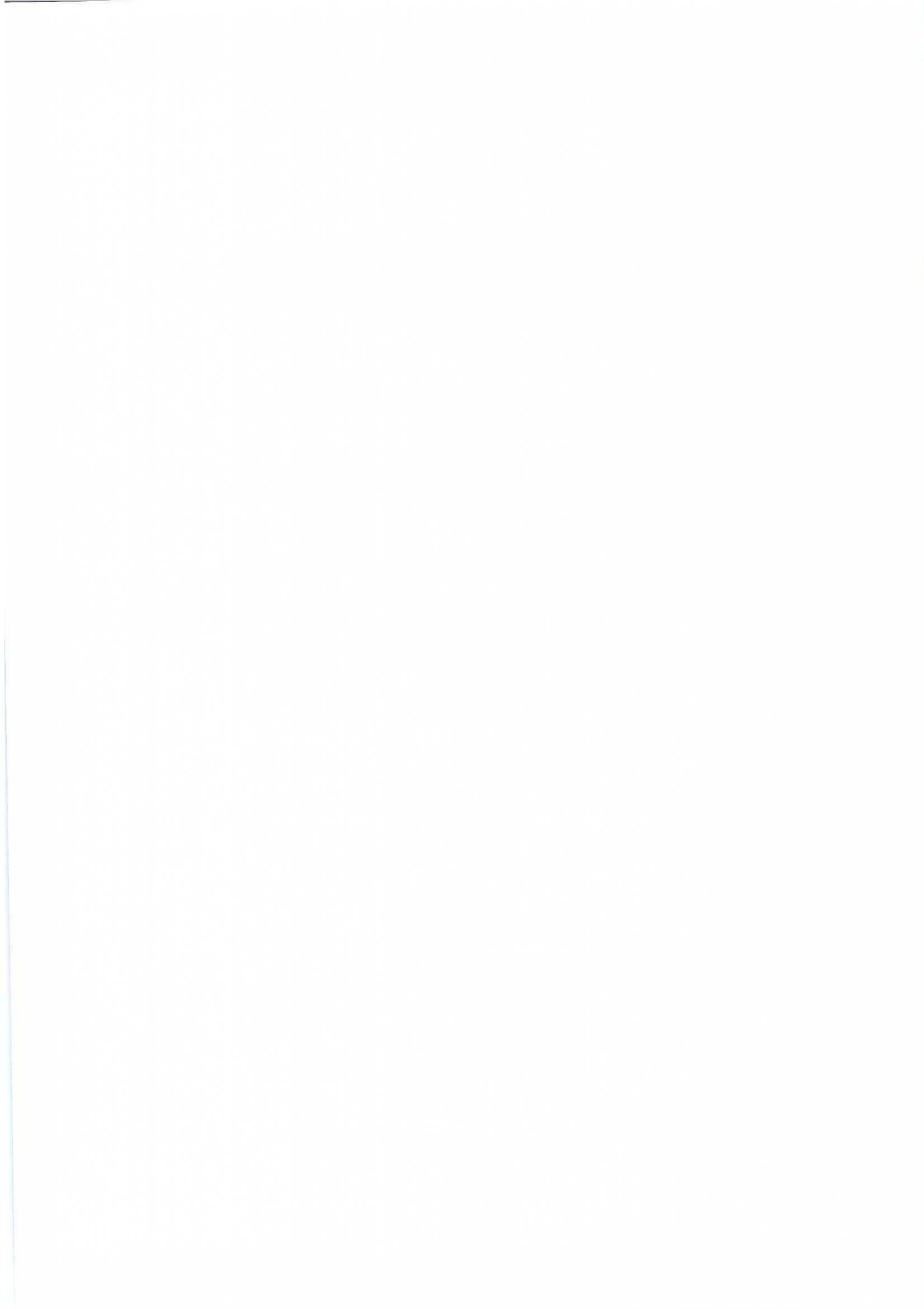
