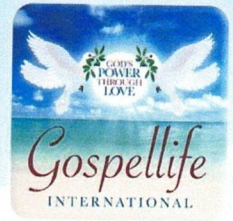

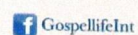

Life Healing Rehabilitation Centre (LHRC), Gospellife International continue to support financially and socially LHRC in its work with children.

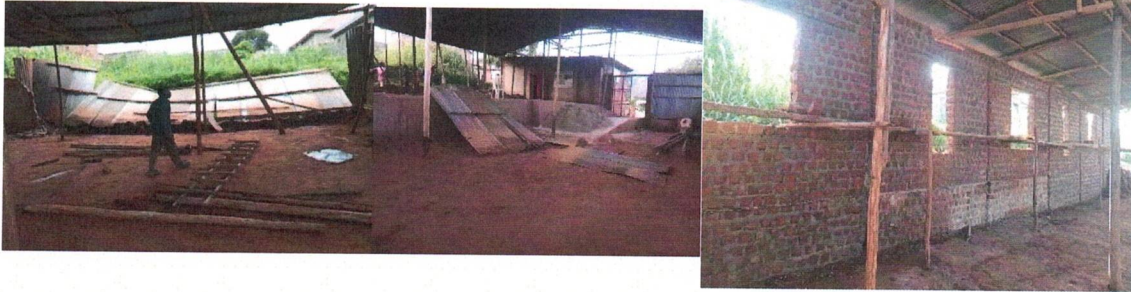
Graduation fee.

Children’s Ministry “Alina’s Kids”

During 2022, Discussions were made as to the way forward for this section of the Ministry.

The Director of Alina’s Kids proposed to take the Ministry forward as an independent NGO under the name of Life Healing Rehabilitation Centre (LHRC) with a completely new board locally represented.

The Trustees of Gospellife International agreed with the proposal, and the children’s director formed a new board named Life Healing Rehabilitation Centre. (LHRC) and applications were submitted to the Ugandan NGO board for registration. And was approved in the Autumn of 2022

Gospellife International has gifted the Vehicle used by Alina’s Kids to transport the children to further the work of LHRC.

For now, Gospellife International continues to provide financial support to LHRC. LHRC, a fully Independent Registered Ugandan NGO, will submit its accounts and annual report directly to the Ugandan Revenue Authorities and the Ugandan NGO Board.

Continued P2

Ministry & Missions

The Christian Bookshop/office continues to be a valuable resource for the Ministry. More office services have been added as proposed in 2022, enhancing its service in the community.

Rev Robert Baker and Mr Jonathan Isbell visited five regions in Uganda, covering Kampala, Jinja, Manafwa District, Ibanda and Hoima, speaking with some 750 church Leaders of various denominations with discussions of the need for training and supporting the local church in the community.

Gospellife International has communicated with Rev Gerald Kasajja, senior pastor of Grace Family Church, Kakari, to support the construction of a school in the district and the financial commitment for such a project starting mid to late 2023.

Support is also being given to sink a Well in the proposed school grounds, which will supply clean drinking water for the school and the village residents living around the vicinity.

In March 2023, Gospellife International purchased a replacement vehicle for the one donated to LHRC; this was made possible from donations made for this purpose.

March 2023, Rev Dr. Richard Nkunze visited the believers at Life Healing Church, Kamuli. Eastern Uganda to assist in forming a leadership structure and plan on training for this young church body, ministering and encouraging in both spiritual and physical food.

Throughout the year, Gospellife International has been able to discreetly help families meet School fees, exam fees, and training skills payments.

Whilst the aim of the Ministry is to proclaim. Further, the gospel of God concerning his Son Jesus Christ our Lord Gospellife International also puts importance on the community, Serving where it is needed.

In conclusion

The work among the ministers and church leaders will continue to grow, emphasising serving village communities. Meeting needs where it is able. Support will continue in children's education and hygiene work as in the past years.

Rev Dr. Richard Nkunze has continued to be a resource and influence within the Christian leadership communities. As always, the Ministry looks forward to 2023-24 with great expectations.

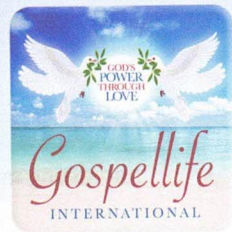

Gospellife International has come through the past two years in strength, and we can thank God for His faithfulness. Although the general trend has been a reduction in support to charitable organisations during the Covid period Gospellife International has seen itself flourish financially from unexpected sources.

Through the Ugandan office, the Ministry has continued to distribute Food Aid throughout Uganda as undertaken in 2020-21. We are now seeing the communities gradually recover from the devastation caused by the Covid Pandemic restrictions.

Friendships have been strengthened, and new friendships have been built through the aid given.

As the travel and local operational restrictions are lifted in Uganda, Mr Jonathan Isbell and Rev Robert Baker will arrange a visit to connect to these new Communities.

Children's Ministry "Alina's Kids"

It has been a good year for this part of the Ministry. All the children were kept at home safe to avoid being infected with the coronavirus. The children in the home are 13 [7 girls, 6 boys], with 30 children supported in the community.

Devotion;

This activity is the pillar of Gospellife International ministry. Devotion empowers children with truth from the word of God spiritually, mentally, morally and socially. We have seen God moving among the children and ministering healing.

Feeding program;

The children receive three meals a day. The food contains proteins, vitamins, fats, carbohydrates, fruits etc. It has strengthened their immunity system, allowing them to develop physically and look healthy.

Observing hygiene;

The teaching of the children the importance of personal and home hygiene.

Medical program;

Supported are two children with cerebral palsy with treatment and registered with Agape Physical and Orthopedic Rehabilitation in Namakwekwe for physical exercise to improve their physical development.

Three children with specialist counselling as they are on daily medication on ARVS.

One boy is a single cellar and on medication.

One girl was brought into the home severely malnourished with mild cerebral palsy and very sick with pneumonia, but she is now responding to treatment.



2020 into 2021 The Covid19 Pandemic has proved to be challenging for everyday ministry matters, particularly East Africa, where most physical ministry is. Offices closed for extended periods, restriction of movement, curfews and school closures have all affected the ministry.

The ministry has continued strong; the Children's programme Alina's Kids continues to thrive in the community; the ministry has been equally effective in Uganda with relief programmes in 5 areas across the nation.

Although Funding and Fundraising have been challenging throughout this year, Gospellife International has seen itself flourish financially from sources unexpected.

Children's Ministry "Alina's Kids"

The Move to its new home in 2019 has proved to be invaluable, with the more extensive facilities both inside and out throughout the Covid 19 Pandemic.

Schools closed and no online teaching facilities, work suspended, and public transport severely curtailed; the number one issue was keeping the children and staff members safe using all preventative measures recommended by the UG.Gov.

Education;

Facilities to undertake online learning were donated to enable the children to keep their academic education active.



Online Education, activities in the garden, learning to grow their own food to supplement their diet, regular games, and exercise to keep them physically fit, learning teamwork, and relating to each other have been the emphasis of the lockdown.

The home also received as a gift of a swimming pool and two bicycles for the children.



With Eleven (11) children in the home plus Twenty-Two (22) children on community support; (Sixteen (16) girls and Seventeen (17) boys in total).

The care and support have been there throughout the pandemic for those not resident in the home.

With the support of the resident social worker, the children received counselling and emotional healing for the traumas the children have been through in their lives before coming into care.

Two new children were brought into the home and have settled in well.

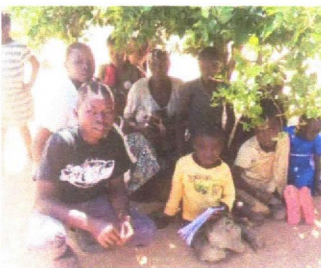
In addition, three children, two girls and a boy, were brought to the home with severe Malnutrition; all were treated with Nutrients and a balanced diet and are now doing well, now reunited with their parents and receiving ongoing support.

Challenges.

Two of the children at home lost their only parent, their father, who had been ill, died, which brought some challenges in their lives, but counselling has improved well.

After a lot of groundwork by the staff at Alina's kids, searching out a family, followed by supervised visits under the careful watch of the resident social worker and social services. One of the older boys has now been reunited with his family, where he now lives with ongoing support.

Activities

Birthdays, Easter, and Christmas are all celebrated as special events for the children that bring much joy. Outings have not been permitted through the Lockdown for children's safety but have enjoyed the times of organised games in the garden.

Way Forward

The staff at Alina's Kids continue to see the children working and growing together as a loving family, in a Godly way, ensuring they are there for the benefit of the children.

Conclusion

Whilst the year has been challenging with the restrictions caused by the worldwide Covid 19 Pandemic; Alina's Kids has thrived; its ability to move forward, the children flourishing, challenges overcome, and there have been achievements in its progress. God has been faithful in all aspects. The children have continued to thrive in the home as we see them come together as a family, and the partnership with the Police and Social Services Mbale has been invaluable.


