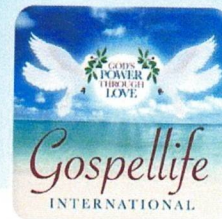

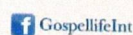

#### Graduation fee.

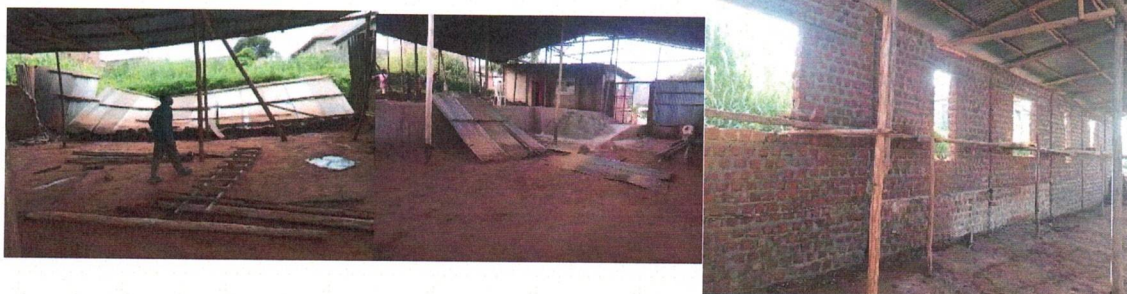
December 2023, Gospellife International contributed to the graduation fees for Mr. Aaron Wakholi, who was so grateful for his support in his graduation.
