The range of 'Quick & Easy Bibles', comprising 365 selections retold in story form from the English Bible with dyslexic-friendly pastel coloured pages, has been extended. Fresh versions have been published and printed with new artwork allowing customised covers to be printed welcoming readers in specific areas or churches.

The sale and distribution of selected republished works of Prof. FF Bruce has continued in conjunction with F.F. Bruce Copyright International based in Nashville, www.ffbruce.com. Twenty two of his academic books have been published digitally and ten of his popular books have been published and printed. A new edition of Prof Bruce's 'Paul's Gospel of Jesus Christ' in the epistle to the Romans has been published and printed.

Easy-reading gospels of Mark, Luke and John have been created with new artwork and 'Our English Bible' has been made available.

Substantial numbers of books have been sent free of charge to Kenya and distributed by churches and other Christian and educational agencies.

The Trustees have read and had regard to the guidance on public benefit

issued by the Charity Commission and have considered this and reviewed it at Trustees' meetings to ensure that the projects developed by the Trust are relevant and topical for the public benefit.

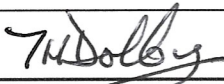
