Structure, governance and management

Brionys Gift is an unincorporated charity, registered with the Charity Commission and governed by way of a trust deed, adopted 13 March 2013.

The affairs of the charity are managed by the trustees, who may exercise all the powers of the charity. The liability of the members of Brionys Gift, in the event of winding up of the charity, is limited to a sum not exceeding £100 per trustee.

Appointment of trustees

In accordance with the terms of the constitution, trustees can only be appointed by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting, or a decision of all of the trustees.

The trustees who served during the year are shown on page 3 of this report.

Charitable aims and objectives

The objects of the charity are:

To relieve the sickness and distress of children who are suffering from life limiting illness and conditions such as cancer in such ways as the trustees shall think fit, in particular by the provision of gifts and the granting of wishes.

Public benefit

In shaping the objectives for the year, the trustees have paid due regard to the public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission. The trustees consider that all activities as outlined in this report meet the public benefit requirement.

Review of the year

Brionys Gift continued to support children and young adults with cancer and other life limiting and life threatening illnesses and conditions in accordance with charity's aims.

The fundraising shops in Wombwell continue to be part of the heart of the community promoting the charity and building community spirit. Alongside this the shops save items from landfill, promoting sustainability and give the local community access to low cost items. The awareness which the shops bring to the cause has been key to several large donations which have benefited the children. This includes not only money but new items to be donated directly to the ward and craft packs which we have been able to donate.

One again we continue to make positive connections with families of children on treatment and continue to offer support moving forward. We continue to offer free magic shows and other entertainment as well as free photography in order to capture time for the families and provide lasting memories.

Brionys Gift continues to be a positive presence within the community offering volunteering opportunities for the unemployed people as well as those suffering with anxiety and depression alongside those wishing to fill their time supporting a worthwhile cause.



Basis of the preparation of the accounts

The financial statements have been prepared on a Receipts & Payments basis which summarises the movement of cash in and out of the organisation. In this context 'cash' includes cash equivalents, such as bank accounts where cash can be readily available to pay debts as they fall due. This format of accounts is available to non-company charities with gross annual income of £250,000 or less.

Classification of income & expenditure

Income and expenditure has been analysed in the accounts using natural classification.

Funds structure

The charity maintains an unrestricted fund which represents funds which are expendable at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. Unrestricted funds may arise from general donations, grants of a general nature, fees for service provision and payment for service delivery contracts.

Restricted funds may be provided to the charity for particular purposes and may only be spent for the purposes for which they were given. Any balance remaining outstanding on a restricted fund at the end of the year is carried forward as a balance on the fund, unless permission has been given by the funder to remove the restriction on the balance outstanding. Restricted funds will arise from grants and donations given to the charity for specific purposes.

Taxation

Brionys Gift is a registered charity and is exempt from UK corporation tax on income from its charitable activities.

We still strive to increase the funds being raised for the charity's alms. However, the awareness which is being created is positive and income has been raised to provide gifts and grant wishes for children.

Brionys Gift continues to be a positive presence within the community, providing volunteering opportunities for unemployed people and a source of confidence and skill building for those seeking to gain employment, or for people struggling with depression and anxiety. Volunteering also provides opportunities for people who want to fill their time in a positive role, for a worthwhile cause.

Through the charity shops, we are also helping to keep unwanted goods out of landfill, thus giving them a second chance at life. We achieve this by collecting and accepting donations of these items and selling them on to raise funds. There is also a positive knock on effect, whereby the local community is benefiting from being able to buy good quality, low cost, used goods.

The shop is raising awareness of our charity and this allows us to reach out to the members of our community who may not be able to access online services as yet.

We continue to make positive connections with the families who we support and carry this contact and support on, way past the gift-giving stage. We continue to offer free entertainment for the children on treatment, whether it be a visit to the ward to do some bedside magic, or an end of treatment or birthday party. This has been significantly less this year as a direct result of the impact of the pandemic.



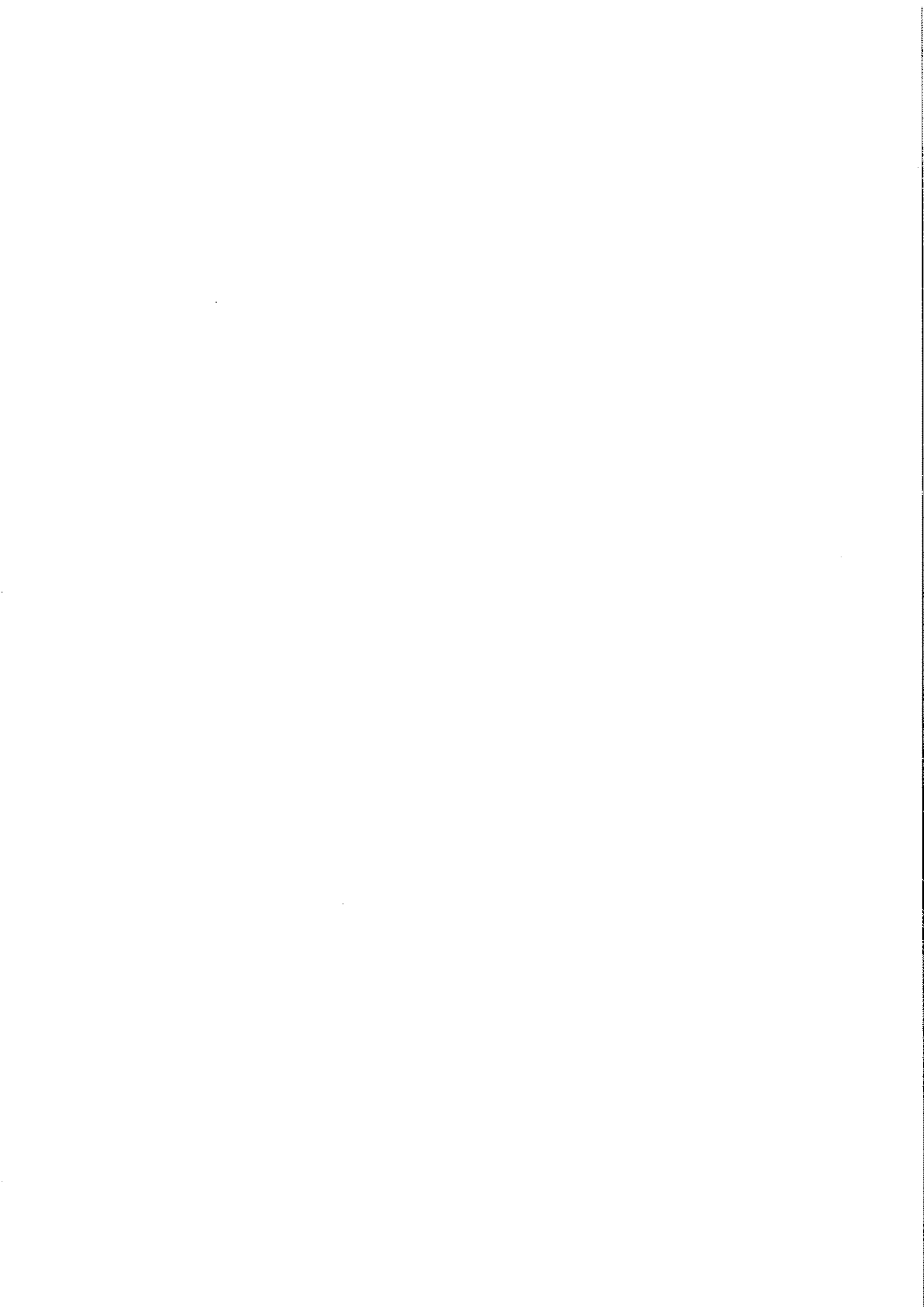

Volunteering also provides opportunities for people who want to fill their time in a positive role, for a worthwhile cause.

Through the charity shops, we are also helping to keep unwanted goods out of landfill, thus giving them a second chance at life. We achieve this by collecting and accepting donations of these items and selling them on to raise funds. There is also a positive knock on effect, whereby the local community is benefiting from being able to buy good quality, low cost, used goods.

The shop is raising awareness of our charity and this allows us to reach out to the members of our community who may not be able to access online services as yet.

We have once again been able to accept every application which we have been given. We continue to make positive connections with the families who we support and carry this contact and support on, way past the gift-giving stage. We continue to offer free entertainment for the children on treatment, whether it be a visit to the ward to do some bedside magic, or an end of treatment or birthday party. This has been significantly less this year as a direct result of the impact of the pandemic.

The Charity's policy on reserves

The trustees recognise the need to keep reserves at a level which will give the charity stability to enable it to continue to operate in the future and aim to hold a minimum of £7,500 in reserve at any one time. The actual level of reserves held by the charity on 18.02.2021 was £19,564. Reserves have increased from the previous year, due to the receipt of government support funding.

Related Parties

The trustees consider that there are no related parties to the charity.

Trustees responsibilities for the financial statements

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records, which disclose with reasonable accuracy the financial position of the charity at any time and enable the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud or other irregularities.

Financial Position

The Receipts and Payments Account shows a surplus for the year of £9,191 (2020: £4,092)
Total funds of the charity at year-end stand at £19,564 (2020: £10,373).

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 18 FEBRUARY 2021

1. Accounting policies

Basis of the preparation of the accounts

The financial statements have been prepared on a Receipts & Payments basis which summarises the movement of cash in and out of the organisation. In this context 'cash' includes cash equivalents, such as bank accounts where cash can be readily available to pay debts as they fall due. This format of accounts is available to non-company charities with gross annual income of £250,000 or less.

Classification of income & expenditure

Income and expenditure has been analysed in the accounts using natural classification.

Funds structure

The charity maintains an unrestricted fund which represents funds which are expendable at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. Unrestricted funds may arise from general donations, grants of a general nature, fees for service provision and payment for service delivery contracts.

Restricted funds may be provided to the charity for particular purposes and may only be spent for the purposes for which they were given. Any balance remaining outstanding on a restricted fund at the end of the year is carried forward as a balance on the fund, unless permission has been given by the funder to remove the restriction on the balance outstanding. Restricted funds will arise from grants and donations given to the charity for specific purposes.

Taxation

Brionys Gift is a registered charity and is exempt from UK corporation tax on income from its charitable activities.
