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Trustees' Report:

The aim of the charity is:

To advance the education of the public, particularly but not exclusively those residing in Gateshead and the surrounding area by developing key literacy skills with the aim of advancing education and employment prospects and life skills.

Achievements and Performance:

Over the last year, Bringing Words to Life, has continued to deliver a wide range of literacy workshops in schools and with community groups.

Over the last year Bringing Words to Life has continued to deliver a wider range of activities in and around the North East, as well as working with a number of schools in Manchester.

- We worked with 634 young people across four different settings in Newcastle and Gateshead.
- We provided tutoring support for three young people who had been excluded from school through Gateshead Council.
- We ran a Christmas Poetry competition which involved eleven schools.
- Over 265 articles were written through the support of our programmes.
- We employed two young people through the Kickstart programme.
- We provided volunteer opportunities for 43 young people.

Plans for the future:

Having developed one of our key programmes as a stand-alone resource, the organisation is now working on a sales strategy to generate unrestricted income.

Risk Management:

The Trustees are examining the major risks, which the organisation faces in relation to external factors, governance, and internal operations of the organisation. They are considering the likelihood and the impact of risks and reviewing what systems should be in place to control and reduce those risks.

Reserves Policy:

It is the policy of the charity to try and build up unrestricted funds, which are free reserves of the organisation, to a level that equates to approximately 3 months unrestricted expenditure. This would provide sufficient funds to cover the management and administration support costs and any emergencies that may arise from time to time.

The Directors/Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy the financial position of the charity, which enables

them to ascertain the financial position of the company and enable them to comply with applicable law. The Directors/Trustees are also responsible for the safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The Trustees are also responsible for the safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

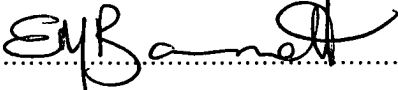
For the year ending 31/8/2022 the company was entitled to exemption from audit under section 477 of the Companies Act 2006 relating to small companies.

Independent Examiners Report:

I report on the financial statements of Bringing Words to Life Ltd for the year ended 31st August 2022, which are set out on pages 7-9.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner:

The charity's trustees (who are also the directors of the company for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011, and an independent examination is needed.

Having satisfied myself that the charity is not subject to audit under company law and is eligible for independent examination; it is my responsibility to:

Basis of examiner's statement:

My examination was carried out in accordance with General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners. 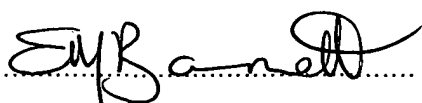

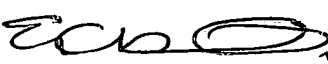
