ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

TRINITY WORLD MINISTRIES TRUST has successfully delivered a programme of spiritual upliftment for Christians and non-Christians in the UK through talks and gatherings. A regular Sunday prayer gathering service served 50 people. In addition, we provided hot food weekly benefiting over 40 people to those in hardship. We continued to provide religious guidance and counselling via phone contact to many Christians to deal with issues encountered by them in their personal and social lives.

PUBLIC BENEFIT STATEMENT

The Trustees have considered the general guidance on public benefit issued by the Charity Commission and has taken due regard of that guidance. The Trustees consider that they are satisfied that the charity's activities have benefited the public as it has allowed Christians to develop greater spirituality and helped to meet the basic necessities needs for needy people in the UK.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

TRINITY WORLD MINISTRIES TRUST secured funds for their activities and which were largely comprised of cash donations from trustees and other philanthropists and gift aid. The majority of the costs this period were on rent, speakers fees and catering. A total of £30,763 was raised as income. Total expenses for the period amounted to £38,358 which resulted in a deficit of £7,596. At the end of the period, the charity had no reserves.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

The charity would like to continue to develop their services further by attracting more people and users. This will help to meet the needs of the public.

TRINITY WORLD MINISTRIES TRUST has successfully delivered a programme of spiritual upliftment for Christians and non-Christians in the UK through talks and gatherings. A regular Sunday prayer gathering service served 50 people. In addition, we provided hot food weekly benefiting over 40 people to those in hardship. We continued to provide religious guidance and counselling via phone contact to many Christians to deal with issues encountered by them in their personal and social lives.

PUBLIC BENEFIT STATEMENT

The Trustees have considered the general guidance on public benefit issued by the Charity Commission and has taken due regard of that guidance. 



This has helped over 25 people per week, which have included homeless people. The charity provided religious guidance and counselling to many Christians to deal with issues encountered by them in their personal and social lives and provided a place for prayer for them.

PUBLIC BENEFIT STATEMENT

The Trustees have considered the general guidance on public benefit issued by the Charity Commission and has taken due regard of that guidance. The Trustees consider that they are satisfied that the charity's activities have benefited the public as it has allowed Christians to develop greater spirituality and helped to meet the basic necessities needs for needy people in the UK. It has also benefitted the wider public by allowing them to improve their health and to relieve their suffering from health conditions from which they are at risk.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

A restricted grant was also secured at the end of the period from National Lottery to be expended in the coming year. The majority of the costs this period were on rent, speakers fees and repairs which exceeded the donations. A total of £35,813 was raised from donations, gift aid and grants. Total expenses for the period amounted to £40,324. At the end of the period, the charity had reserves of £9,984 (net of liabilities) which were mainly the restricted grant funds (£9,973). Apart from this, there were no free reserves. The liabilities were professional charges outstanding at the end of the period totalling £1,000.


