STRUTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The Fenix Training Trust is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) governed by its Constitution adopted at its inaugural meeting on 9th May 2013 following confirmation by the Charity commission of its registered charity status on 29th April 2013.

Appointment of Trustees

As set out in the constitution, there must be at least three charity trustees and not more than twelve. The trustees are also the members of the CIO and have no liability to contribute to its assets if it is wound up and no personal responsibility for settling its debts and liabilities. Apart from the initial trustees, every trustee so appointed for a term of three years although they can offer themselves for re-appointment and retire by notifying the CIO in writing. Appointment is by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting of the CIO trustees.

Organisation

The board of trustees administers the charity and meets at least twice a year.

In planning our activities, we kept in mind the Charity Commissioner's guidance on public benefit. We have continued to communicate on a regular basis by phone and meet as required.

Risk Management

The trustees conducted a review of the major risks which the charity was exposed and continue, where appropriate, have systems or procedures to mitigate the risks the charity faces. Procedures are in place to ensure compliance with health and safety of staff, volunteers, clients and visitors to the centre.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objects of the charity for the public benefit are set out in the CIO Constitution:

- To advance in life and help young people (under the age of 25) through the provision of facilities for horse riding, carriage driving and other amateur equestrian sports in the interests of social welfare with the object of improving the conditions of life.
- To relieve the needs of disabled people through the provision of facilities for horse riding, carriage riding and other amateur equestrian sports with the object of improving their conditions of life.
- To advance the education of the public in the subject of horse drawn transport through lectures, demonstrations, events and by the establishment and maintenance of a museum of horse drawn vehicles

We have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commissioner's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing our aims and objectives and in planning our future activities.

We welcome anyone who can benefit from the resources on offer regardless of personal background, faith, gender, age, financial means or personal circumstances.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

This year has been another productive year. The unique museum which is the main feature of the Trust has again enthralled visitors on arranged visits as well as those who visit the facilities on a more regular basis. The collection continues to grow as carriages are restored and housed in the museum. There have been visits this year from two London Livery companies both of whom enjoyed an educational day. A new event for the Trust was the annual presentation by the Coachmakers Company to young students interested in the arts and crafts of "four in hand coaching" was held at the Trust which included a two day instructional course.

We continue to receive donations and numerous telephone enquiries and requests for advice and assistance.

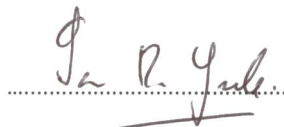
A new event for the Trust was a visit from The Exeter Flotilla and Royal Navy Officers who arranged a very successful visit and the Trust received a donation.

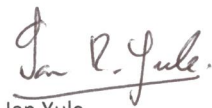
