- CO-OP – Training: To support the building of a Drone Team within NSART, by purchasing equipment, training personnel. To support the training of volunteers to national standards.
- CO-OP Local Community Fund – Mental Wellbeing - In order to continue our vital work searching for vulnerable missing people, we want to be able to invest in maintaining and advancing our team's skills and the equipment we use. We rely on life saving specialist equipment to search for, rescue and recover vulnerable missing people including drones, mountain bikes, radios, thermal imaging cameras, stretchers and other first aid and medical kit. This all needs to be maintained, insured and repaired/replaced or upgraded. We need to train our volunteers to nationally recognised standards in the specialist skills needed.
