Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31st December 2024

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st December 2024. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Significant activities

1. Education support: Education remains the focus of charity activities. The charity supports students in their education on regular basis through payments of fees and other school expenses. The charity currently supports more than 300+ students. All students are from shaheed families or under privileged background. All students progressed to the next year of education during 2024. The spectrum of students are from class 1 to university level and specialised subjects

In 2024, we managed to get 10 of our students on Baluchistan government Fees Scholarship. This is valid for a year.

The cost of school fees varies based on nature of school and the level of education, for example, the total cost of graduate program is around £40-50 per month. Based on current distribution of students, the average monthly cost is £30 per month per student.

2. Ramazan ration support: Like last year, charity distributed basic Iftar ration to 300 families in Pakistan for the month of Ramazan. The ration included flour, rice, different varieties of lentils, oil, tea, milk, sugar, concentrated drinks, vermicelli, gram flour and dates etc. The distribution was done in Skardu, Parachinar, northern Punjab, and Karachi.

3. Qurbani support: The charity helped community in performing their Eid ul Azha duties by performing 42 qurbanis on their behalf. The meat was distributed amongst more than 400 families. The qurbanis were performed in Parachinar, Skardu, Karachi and Wah in Pakistan.

4. Winter support: The charity provided more than 100 blankets, quilts and fire wood to the people in need in Pakistan. Firewood was provided to some homes in Skardu, Northern Pakistan

5. One-off support:

a. The charity contributed the cost of 250 pairs of shoes for "Malls of Smile" orphanage market. Charity has been supporting this campaign for last few years. This is once a year event held in Karachi by Cure Pakistan. About 500 orphans are invited to the marketplace. They are given paper token money to buy things. The marketplace has all kinds of necessities for the children.

b. The charity provided financial support for weddings of 5 different families.

c. Charity provided regular family support to 2 families and one off support to 2 families. In addition, Charity provided funeral support for one family.

Trustees express sincere thanks to all the Donors for their support. Without their support the above would not have been possible.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

ACTIVITIES DURING THE YEAR

1. Education support:

Education remains the focus of charity activities. The charity supports students in their education on regular basis through payments of fees and other school expenses. The charity currently supports more than 310 students. All students are from shaheed families or under privileged background. All students progressed to the next year of education during 2023. One girl completed B.sc, in international education. Few other students are in there last year of graduation.

In 2022, when we started working with Hazara children, we moved 25 children from various local locality government schools to higher quality English medium school. This was a substantial change for the children. Alhamdulillah, it was a highly successful move. With exception of 2 children, who could not cope with the higher standard, all the others progress well. Some on them have not moved to college after successfully completing school education.

The cost of school fees varies based on nature of school and the level of education, for example, the total cost of graduate program is around £40-50 per month. Based on current distribution of students, the average monthly cost is £25 per month per student.

The charity started to support students from Hazara group in Quetta. Other schools which are supported by charity are Rahnuma Public School, New Hope School, Skardu in-house school and Al-Madimatul Ilm School.

The cost of school fees varies based on nature of school and the level of education, for example, the total cost of graduate program is around £50-60 per month. Based on current distribution of students, the average monthly cost is £25 per month per student.

- 2. Ramazan ration support:** The charity provided basic Iftar ration to 330 families in Pakistan for the month of Ramazan. The ration included flour, rice, different varieties of lentils, oil, tea, milk, sugar, concentrated drinks, vermicelli, gram flour and dates etc.
- 3. Qurbani support:** The charity helped community in performing their Eid ul Azha duties by performing 34 qurbanis (animal sacrifice) and distributing meat amongst more than 300 families in 2022. The qurbanis were performed in Parachinar, Skardu, Karachi and Wah in Pakistan.
- 4. Winter blanket support:** The charity provided more than 110 blankets and quilts to people in need in Pakistan.
- 5. One-off support:**
- The charity contributed the cost of 250 pairs of shoes for “Malls of Smile” orphanage market.
 - The charity provided financial support for weddings of three different families.

- Covid medical support

The meetings are held in London regularly. Charity does not have any office or setup other than the principal address.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

1. The prevention or relief of poverty including provision or the assistance in the provision of education and healthcare.
2. The relief of financial need and suffering among the victims or natural other disaster in the form on money (or other means deemed suitable). For persons, bodies or organisation in the affected areas of UK, India and Pakistan.

ACTIVITIES DURING THE YEAR

- 1. Education support:** Education remains the focus of charity activities. The charity supports students in their education on regular basis through payments of fees and other school expenses. The charity currently supports more than 250 students. All students are from under privileged background. All students progressed to the next year of education during 2021. The charity started to support students from Hazara group in Quetta. Other schools which are supported by charity are Rahnuma Public School, New Hope School, Skardu in-house school and Al-Madimatul Ilm School.
The cost of school fees varies based on nature of school and the level of education, for example, the total cost of graduate program is around £50-60 per month. Based on current distribution of students, the average monthly cost is £25 per month per student.

- 2. Ramazan ration support:** The charity provided basic Iftar ration to 330 families in Pakistan for the month of Ramazan. The ration included flour, rice, different varieties of lentils, oil, tea, milk, sugar, concentrated drinks, vermicelli, gram flour and dates etc.
- 3. Qurbani support:** The charity helped community in performing their Eid ul Azha duties by performing 28 qurbanis (animal sacrifice) and distributing meat amongst more than 300 families in 2021. The qurbanis were performed in Parachinar, Skardu, Karachi and Wah in Pakistan.
- 4. Winter blanket support:** The charity provided more than 110 blankets and quilts to people in need in Pakistan.
- 5. Covid medical support:** The charity worked with CRICIS Alliance, a collaboration of Charities (SAFA and Helping Hands) to raise funds and provide free medical aid to people in need. The charity raised over £2,000 for this cause.
- 6. One-off support:**
 - The charity contributed the cost of 250 pairs of shoes for “Malls of Smile” orphanage market
 - The charity provided financial support for weddings of three different families

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The meetings are held in London regularly. Charity does not have any office or setup other than the Registered office.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

1. The prevention or relief of poverty including provision or the assistance in the provision of education and healthcare.
2. The relief of financial need and suffering among the victims or natural other disaster in the form on money (or other means deemed suitable). For persons, bodies or organisation in the affected areas of UK, India and Pakistan.

ACTIVITIES DURING THE YEAR

1. **Education support.** Education remains the focus of charity activities. The charity supports students in their education through payments of fees and uniforms. The charity currently supports more than 180 students. All students are from under privileged background. All students progressed to the next year of education during 2020.
The charity started to support students at New Hope School in Quetta and Madimatul Ilm School in Karachi. Other school which is supported by charity is Rahnuma Public School.
2. **Ramazan ration support.** The charity provided basic Iftar ration to 220 families in Pakistan for the month of Ramazan. The ration included flour, rice, different varieties of lentils, oil, tea, milk, sugar, concentrated drinks, vermicelli, gram flour and dates etc.
3. **Qurbani support.** The charity helped community in performing their Eid ul Azha duties by performing 28 qurbanis and distributing meat among more than 300 families in 2020. The qurbanis were performed in Attock, Hangu, Parahpur, Skardu, Parachinar and Wah in Pakistan.
4. **Winter blanket support.** The charity provided more than 150 blankets and quilts to deserving people.
5. **House building support.** The charity helped to build 2 houses in Skardu for people in need. First house was for a disabled man who lives alone and he cannot use both of his hands. Second house was for a widow with 5 kids who who was living at her brother's house in the small room. Basic house structure had been raised, making it liveable during winter months.
6. **Other one-off support.**
 - a. The charity provided Covid-19 ration to 100 people in Pakistan
 - b. The charity provided financial support for a wedding
 - c. The charity supported 3 different people for medical needs

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Report of the Trustees and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice) including Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland"

The law applicable to charities in England and Wales, the Charities Act 2011, Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 and the provisions of the trust deed requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charity for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charity SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Total income for the year amounted to £54,938 (2019: £28,928) including restricted funds of £14,122 (2019: nil).

The excess of income over expenditure was £7,965 (2019: £3,395) as at the year end. There has been steady support from members in terms of subscriptions and donations.

The financial statements have been prepared on the basis that the charity is a going concern. The trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue as a going concern due to resources held and forecast income and expenditure.

The trustees are not aware of any post balance sheet events requiring disclosure.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

GOVERNING DOCUMENT

The charity is controlled by its governing document, Trust Deed, dated 23 June 2013.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.
