The church-based shelters are supported by 200 volunteers from across the London Borough of Ealing. Homeless guests are referred by local outreach agencies and we play a unique, and integral role as part of the borough's response to the critical level of homelessness. ECWNS seeks to support shelter guests into permanent and dignified accommodation and signposts towards essential medical, legal and other services. We provide the borough's only Christmas and New Year shelter.
