Charity Objectives

The objective of our charity is to rescue and rehabilitate domestic animals who have been abandoned or neglected. We primarily take in cats and dogs. We aim to relieve the suffering of animals in need of care and attention and maintain rescue home or other facilities for reception and care of such animals. We also take in animals from home where the owners are unable to care for/keep them anymore for a variety of reasons. We also help animals' owners who wish to keep their animals but are struggling financially with high veterinary bills.

Activities and Achievements

We, again, have found this year to be proving challenging. We have seen a high rise in people wishing to surrender animals due to the cost of living. People neutering their animals is at a low which in turn has caused a higher influx of stray pregnant cats for us.

We also sadly lost some of our long-term foster animals due to ill health or old age. We have seen a huge decline in people donating to and purchasing from our main charity shop which has led to a substantial difference in takings from previous years. Our volunteers there continue to work hard, and we are grateful to their continued dedication. We also decided to close one of our charity shops as it was proving to be non-profitable.

We were happy to welcome back a previous, much loved and respected trustee after having to resign for a while due to ill health. We were also joined by a new trustee who has a wealth of experience with animal rescue and joins us with a lot of knowledge to help our charity grow and expand for the better. We said goodbye to two of our trustees. We thank them for their time and the time they dedicated to our charity. We chose this year to use some of our donations to build new cat pens which are a warm, safe space for the cats coming into our care. We also were very lucky to be given a substantial donation in memory of a huge cat lover, so in her memory we built a wonderful Catio at one of our foster homes for extra enrichment and exercise for the cats/kittens in our care. This also provides a wonderful meet and greet space for potential adoptees. Again, we have chosen to use some of our money with helping the public who are struggling with their vets' bills. We are proud to be able to help owners be able to keep their pets when faced with a costly and unexpected veterinary bill. Our dog field continues to be a good asset allowing fosterers to allow their dogs off lead time in a safe and secure space.

Our fundraising team put on two wonderful and very successful dog shows again this year. They were well attended and helped us raise much needed funds for the animals we help. We are very lucky to have some wonderful volunteers. We are always very grateful to them for giving their time and for their dedication to the charity. Without them we wouldn't be able to help as many animals as we do.

The objective of our charity is to rescue and rehabilitate domestic animals who have been abandoned or neglected. We aim to relieve the suffering of animals in need of care and attention and in particular maintain rescue homes or other facilities for reception and care of such animals. We also take in animals from homes where the owners are unable to care for/keep them anymore for a variety of reasons. We also help some animal owners who wish to keep their animals but are struggling financially with high veterinary bills.

Activities and Achievements.

Another difficult year for the rescue especially with the rising costs of veterinary bills and the cost of living affecting our two charity shops and also in finding forever homes for some of our animals. One of our long standing trustees also had to resign due to ill health which was also a huge loss to our charity. We have had more animals coming in needing more extensive and costly veterinary treatment. We have also found due to rising living costs more animals have been abandoned and needed emergency rescue space. We sadly lost our cattery this year so have had to fundraise to be able to provide more foster pens in private foster homes. We are very lucky to have some amazing new foster homes who always go above and beyond for the animals in their care. Our dog field has been a huge success and provides that much needed safe space for some of the more challenging foster dogs we have in our care. We have definitely received more calls from the public this year to help financially with unexpected veterinary bills above what their insurance will pay for. Where possible we have helped as much as we can as we, as a charity, would rather have animals stay in their loving homes rather than being taken into our foster care homes to have them treated and then rehomed once they are able to be. We always work with the best interests of all animals. Our fundraising team have worked hard this year and we have enjoyed some amazing dog shows.

Activities and Achievements

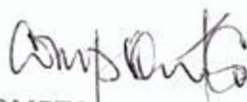
It has been a difficult year for the charity this year with the resignation of 3 of our long-standing trustees but with the appointment of new trustees, who hold the same values as existing ones, we feel the rescue has gone from strength to strength. We have been able to obtain a dog field for the exclusive use of our long-term foster dogs so they have a safe space to have some exercise. Many of our long-term foster dogs are unable to be walked in spaces where other dogs are present so our dog field allows them the freedom to run around safely. Our cattery is doing well and we have been able to take in and rehome more cats than ever. The cattery provides a safe space for the majority of the cats that come into our care. The cattery also receives a twice monthly visit from a local vet who is able to carry out some treatments on site. We have also found this year we have been called upon to help members of the public with rising costs of veterinary bills for their animals. We have helped where we can with the sickest of the animals. We have also provided support for people who own XL Bully dogs after the change in legislation and them now being a banned breed. We have helped people apply for exemption certificates and with the costs of neutering.

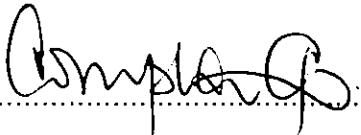
