FOUNTAIN OF LIFE CHURCH COUNCIL-- ASHILL

Report for the year ended 31st December 2020

Throughout 2020 the Fountain of Life Church (FoL) has continued to work hard at offering ministry and outreach to its congregation and to the communities that it serves. With the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic FoL began to develop digital or online church too. While the pandemic caused many problems and issues, especially in the areas of pastoral care, isolation and mental health it also created some new opportunities. During the course of the year we invested in camera and computer equipment and began to livestream services through our website and on YouTube. Our Youth and Children's ministries also created a variety of services and online content and began to reach out to different age groups with a view to keeping people connected and fed through the difficult Covid season.

Pastoral care was reduced to phone calls, emails, video conference calls where possible and between lock downs some doorstep conversations. The Kidz Klub visiting rounds continued maintaining valuable connections throughout. The number of home groups declined a little during the last 12 months mainly due to the difficulties arising from not being able to meet during lock down. It is hoped that some will restart and new ones will begin once the restrictions have been lifted.

The need to maintain Covid safety meant that the AGM was not possible and so in accordance with published guidance was cancelled for 2020. The restrictions also meant that every 'in building' meeting had to be risk assessed reducing the numbers permitted to attend to a maximum of 70. Those restrictions are expected to continue well into 2021 as will the safety measures that accompany the risk assessment. The earliest we can expect to gather restricted numbers in person will be from Easter 2021. It is expected that this will present some problems if the numbers wanting to book seats exceeds 70. Discussions have already been held on doubling the number of services offered on a Sunday morning and how youth and children's provision might be made. The Kids and families workers ran an outdoor adventure trail which attracted a good number of new contacts and created an activity for whole families to engage with. This is to be developed further in 2021.

Staffing

Rev'd Joy Fernando moved on during 2020 to take up a wider ministry in the Deanery following her ordination as a Priest in June. Freddy Hedley left us in the summer to pursue a career in academia with Westminster Theological Centre. The Debt Centre appointed Angela Clark as a part time Community Links Coordinator and we had 1 intern join us in September but otherwise staffing has remained the same.

The Diocese agreed to place a curate with us beginning in 2021 and after interviews and a visit Adam Poole was offered the position which he duly accepted. He and his family will move to Ashill in June 2021. Adam will be ordained Deacon in June 2021 at Norwich Cathedral. We also applied to add 2 further AWA's to the team, Matt Beckett and Graham Cracknell, to be appointed in early 2021.

The church continues to be blessed by a large number of very active volunteers who assist or in some cases run a wide variety of ministries and activities. A great debt of gratitude is owed to all staff and volunteers for the work they do.

Membership

Membership increased during the year which is very encouraging given the difficulties imposed by the pandemic. We also became aware that some people were joining the services from their homes who we have never met and some from much further afield. During the year we have had contact from various places in the UK, Cyprus, the USA, Australia and New Zealand.

In addition to its regular membership the church continues to invest in missional communities that are established and operating in a variety of areas. They have formed and continue to operate on different criteria. Some are informal expressions of church founded on geographical locations, some have formed around demographic groups or particular interests while others meet particular social needs or connect with people for other reasons. The electoral roll does not include those who attend the missional communities.

Training

With regard to training the church has continued to run Alpha which has attracted people from our own membership and from elsewhere.

Children and Families Work

Kidz Klub (KK) in Ashill and Scarning have continued to work well developing new forms of online ministry as noted above. The Saturday morning gathering haven't been possible since the first lock down came into being but it is hoped that this will resume in 2021 when restrictions permit. Holiday clubs couldn't happen in the usual way but a series of successful online activities were implemented in their place.

Pre-School and Noah's Ark

The pre-school, First Steps, has continued to work with a good number of younger children through the two academic years. As was the case with many other activities the Pre-School and Noah's Ark had to stop during the lock down periods. Noah's Ark provided online stories and activities and will continue to do so into 2021. Pre-School reopened with safety measures in place and will continue to run as long as restrictions permit.

Youth Work

The youth team have continued to work with a range of young people and have organised, run and participated in a wide range of activities online and in person as restrictions have allowed. During the summer the Youth team renovated the Portakabin creating a great space for the various youth groups.

Debt Centre

The Debt Centre, run in association with CAP (Christians Against Poverty), has continued to provide significant support to people struggling with unmanageable debt. During the year Angela Clark was appointed as a part time Community Links Coordinator and despite the problems caused by the pandemic the work continued by phone consultations and video conferencing. Some CAP Money training was also conducted on a small scale.

Cornerstone Building Trust

FoL has benefitted from the continuing relationship with CBT which exists with the sole responsibility for providing and maintaining the premises from which FoL Church operates. CBT have worked hard at maintaining the properties and keeping them in a good state for the ministries offered by FoL.

For the most part the maintenance work has gone remarkably well although it has become increasingly apparent that the roof of the bungalow is deteriorating. It is estimated that re-felting and tiling would cost in the region of £12 - £15k so its condition is being monitored for the time being.

Other Areas

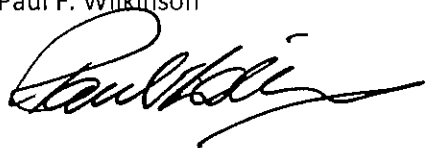
There are a multitude of other areas in which FoL operates which, as already mentioned, are led by people who volunteer their time and energy and to them we are extremely grateful. Some ministries such as Good Companions, Bezalel, EAT and Gen X have had to pause during the pandemic but we have every hope that they will restart or be reinvented in the fullness of time.

Finance

The church has had an overspend during 2020 although the balance sheet still shows a healthy reserve. There have been some areas where expenditure has been needed to address some unexpected areas; for example the installation of new cameras and computers which hadn't been budgeted for. A comparison of the budget verses the end of year accounts will indicate that while savings were made in some areas costs in other areas were a little higher than anticipated. The result is that the 2021 budget has been set to reflect the need to steward our resources well.

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the year ended 31st December 2020

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 using the R & P Basis Regulations together with applicable Accounting standards and the Charities SORP.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Funds

General funds represent the funds of the Fountain of Life Fellowship Ashill, that are not subject to any restrictions regarding their use and are available for application on the general purposes of the Fellowship. Funds designated for a particular purpose by the Fellowship are also unrestricted.

The Accounts include all Fellowship transactions, assets and liabilities for which the Fellowship is responsible in law. They do not include the accounts of church groups that owe their main affiliation to another body or those that are informal gatherings of church members.

Incoming Resources

Voluntary income and capital sources

Collections are recognised when received by or on behalf of the Fellowship. Planned giving receivable under Gift Aid is recognised only when received. Income tax recoverable on Gift Aid donations is recognised when the income is recognised. Grants and legacies to the Fellowship are accounted for as soon as the Fellowship is notified of its legal entitlement, the amount due is quantifiable and its ultimate receipt by the Fellowship is reasonably certain.

Funds produced by church events are accounted for gross.

Sales of books and magazines from the church bookstall are accounted for gross.

Other Income

The Kidz Klub, First Steps Pre-school, Noah's Ark, Debt Centre and Wayland Carers activities are accounted for as separate Accounts see note (2f).

Income from Investments

Interest entitlements are accounted for as they accrue. Tax recoverable on such income is recognised in the same accounting year.

Gains and losses on Investments

Realised gains and losses are recognised when investments are sold.

Resources used

Grants

Grants and donations are accounted for when paid over, or when awarded, if that award creates a binding obligation on the Fellowship.

Activities directly relating to the work of the Church

The diocesan parish share is accounted for when paid. Any parish share unpaid at 31st December is provided for in these Accounts as an operational (though not a legal) liability and is shown as a creditor in the Balance Sheet.

Fixed Assets

Consecrated property and moveable church furnishings

Consecrated and beneficed property of any kind is excluded from the Accounts by s.96(2)(a) of the Charities Act 1993.

Moveable church furnishings held by the Vicar and Churchwardens on special trust for the Fellowship, and which require authorisation from the trustees for disposal, are accounted as inalienable property unless consecrated. They are listed in the church's Inventory which can be inspected (at any reasonable time). For inalienable property acquired prior to (2006) there is insufficient cost information available and therefore such assets are not valued in the Accounts. Items acquired since 1st January (2007) have been capitalised and depreciated in the Accounts over their currently anticipated useful economic life (initially over 4 years) on a straight line basis.

All expenditure incurred in the year on consecrated or beneficed buildings, individual items under (£1000) or on the repair of moveable church furnishings acquired before 1st January (2006) is written off.

Other fixtures, fittings and office equipment

Equipment used within the church premises is depreciated on a straight line basis over 6 years. Individual items of equipment with a purchase price of £1000 or less are written off when the asset is acquired.

Investments

Investments are valued at market value at 31st December.

Current Assets

Amounts owing to the Fellowship at 31st December in respect of fees, rents or other income are shown as debtors less provision for amounts that may prove uncollectable.

Short term deposits include cash held on deposit either with the COIF or at the bank.

Independent Examiners Report

In connection with my examinations, no matter has come to my attention:

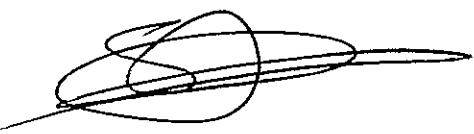
- (1) which gives me reasonable cause to believe that in any material respect the requirements to keep accounting records in accordance with Section 41 of the Act and:-
