ANNUAL REPORT – 2023

Unfortunately after covid we were looking to undertake our final 2 Cultural youth exchanges. One was funded to take place in St Peterburg with the 2nd one to take place in Norfolk. As you will understand we were having issues because both projects involved Russia. This unfortunately could not happen because of the war with Ukraine. We asked our National Agency if we could change the venue from St Peterburg and find another country to host. Also replace Russia from the Norfolk Project with another organisation from another country. The National Agency want us to come up with paperwork signed by our Russian partner to say they will not take part in the programmes. Russia would not do this as they wanted to take part. But it was impossible. So we had to return the money to the National Agency

Norfolk Youth Project were also unable to plan and organise holiday programmes funded by the government. Unfortunately false claims from Norfolk County Council we were unable to do this work. This was very disappointing as we had a group of up to 50 Young People looking to take part in this project.

So 2023 was a none event for Norfolk Youth Project after a very successful 20years of fantastic work with over 3,000 young people

TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT-2022

Norfolk Youth Projects is a small Inclusive Charity working with young people age 8 to 30 years old. We have a board of 3 Trustees including the chairman. Norfolk Youth Projects has a Chief Executive who is a fulltime volunteer who is responsible for the day to day running of the Charity. We also have a group of volunteers who work with the Chief Executive. Some of the young people we work with become our new volunteers.

The main aim of Norfolk Youth Projects is to plan and organise Cultural youth exchanges both in Norfolk and around Europe. These are funded by the European Union's Youth Programme Erasmusplus. In 2021 we were awarded Funding for 2 cultural youth exchanges one in Norfolk and one in St Petersburg Russia. During 2021 we were unable to carryout these projects because of the covid situation. Towards the end of February 2022 we got the all clear to start the planning of the projects with the 1st one being in St Petersburg. We contacted our travel agent to organise the flights for the pre visit in St Petersburg but the next day Russia invaded Ukraine so the projects had to go back on hold. For the rest of 2022 we were trying to work with the National Agency to organise and plan these 2 projects with out Russia. Unfortunately the N/A would not help and left it for us to plan. Unfortunately which ever way we tried to work it we could not be certain of the outcome i.e Visas. This could have meant we could have paid out money which we would not have been able to claim back. So at the end of 2022 we have not been able to move the 2 projects forward. These 2 projects will be the last Norfolk Youth Projects will be able to be involved with as the UK are no longer in the European Union who fund and manage the Erasmusplus programme.

During the Easter holiday Norfolk Youth Projects took part in the Governments School Holiday programme. This we done over 9 days working with up to 30 young people each day. This was very successful and we were asked by Active Norfolk to run the scheme for the 6 week summer holidays. So we worked out a very interesting programme of activities and visits. We had over 1,000 places booked and it was going very well with the young people age from 5 to 16 years old enjoying the activities. We also had a very good relationship with the parents who were also very happy with the programme. Unfortunately we had the funding pulled after 2 weeks because of un proven accusations. So we had to tell the young people and their parents that the programme had to end.


We have not done any work since the end of August apart from trying to resolve the Youth Exchanges

TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT – 2020

Norfolk Youth Projects is a small charity working with young people age 8 to 30 years old. We have a board of 5 trustees including a chairman.

Norfolk Youth Projects has a chief Executive who works full time as a volunteer running the organisation on a day to day basis with a group of volunteers. During the year we did employ a youth worker to work along side of the chief executive but this did not work out and it only lasted for 3 months.

The main aim of Norfolk Youth Projects is to organise and plan cultural youth exchanges through the European Union's youth programme Erasmusplus. Unfortunately, we were unsuccessful with our applications for the first two rounds but were successful with funding for 2 projects to undertake in 2021. One will be based in Norfolk, and one will take place in St Petersburg. Each project will host 60 young people. With UK no longer in the erasmusplus programme these 2 projects will most probably be the last international cultural projects the young people of Norfolk will be able to take part in.

We had an EVS volunteer from Spain volunteering with us but this had to finish with because of the Covid situation. The EVs had to return to Spain. Norfolk Youth Projects had to call a halt to most of work we were doing or had plans to undertake because of the Covid virus. This meant a halt to the youth club, the very successful Mile Cross Luncheon club plus the annual kinderdorp projects which we have hosted at the Catton Grove Primary school with our partners from Holland. So rather than looking back we should now look forward to undertaking all our regular projects plus new projects with new partners in the future.
