During the year, the Sikh Awareness Society carried out a range of activities for the public benefit focused on education, community support, and welfare in line with our charitable objects.

These sessions promoted understanding of Sikh teachings, values, and principles, encouraged positive community engagement, and supported greater awareness of social issues affecting families and individuals.


