#### **Structure, governance and management Structure**

(3) to relieve financial hardship, distress and suffering among poor people, widows, orphans, refugees, victims of natural disasters and other people in need, by means of, but not exclusively, making grants for providing or paying for items, equipment, services and facilities, including the provision of food, water, clothing, medical treatment, rehabilitation, and accommodation for the said persons; and improve quality of drinking water and clean sanitation facilities. (4) to relieve sickness and to preserve good health among the poor, underprivileged and people in need in the UK and abroad, by means of, but not exclusively, the provision or assistance in the provision of services, facilities, equipment, clinics, medicines or grants for medical diagnosis and treatment, and provision of health education.

## **IWARF Yearly Report of 2023/2024**

The year 2023/2024, which began in October 2023, focused on two major projects: continued relief efforts in Turkey for Syrian refugees and emergency aid for the needy in Gaza, Palestine. These efforts were in addition to our ongoing initiatives, including orphan care and water projects, as well as seasonal programs such as Ramadan and Qurbani.

### **Gaza Appeal**

In October 2024, the International Waqf and Relief Foundation (IWARF) maintained its support for the earthquake-affected areas in Turkey. Initially, limited attention was directed toward the Gaza Emergency Appeal, following the crisis that erupted in Gaza in October.

By November and December 2023, greater emphasis was placed on supporting the people of Gaza. IWARF implemented a comprehensive relief program, including food parcel distribution, hot meal services, and the provision of clean water to families and children in need.

### **Winter Appeal**

In January 2024, the Winter Appeal became the main focus as part of our seasonal outreach. IWARF provided essential winter relief in several countries, particularly in two refugee camps in Turkey that were under our supervision. The relief included food, medicine, and shelter for those affected by the ongoing earthquake crisis.

### **Ramadan 2024**

Preparations for the Ramadan 2024 campaign began in February. The campaign officially started on March 12 and continued throughout March and April.

The Ramadan Project 2024 was launched to assist vulnerable communities in countries such as Yemen, Somalia, Pakistan, Syria, Lebanon, and both the West Bank and Gaza in Palestine. Our support included distributing food parcels, hot meals, and other essential aid. Thousands of families benefited from our efforts during the holy month.

### **Orphans and Social Welfare**

IWARF continued its year-round orphan care program, supporting over 200 orphans. We provide full sponsorship, including education, medical care, food, and support for their families, ensuring long-term social welfare and stability.

### **Qurbani Appeal**

By the end of June 2024, IWARF launched the Qurbani campaign, aiming to support underprivileged families during Eid al-Adha. Thousands of families in countries such as Yemen, Pakistan, and Palestine received Qurbani meat and other support through this initiative.

### **Conclusion**

As the year ended, IWARF remained committed to its daily and monthly operations, with a particular focus on sustaining its ongoing projects. These continued efforts reflect our mission to serve those most in need across the globe.

#### **1. Accounting policies**

##### **Basis of preparing the financial statements**

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities:

Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015);

Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The charity has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland':

##### **Critical accounting judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty**

There are no significant estimates having a material effect on the financial statements.

##### **Income**

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

##### **Donations**

This comprises all incoming resources from donations, grants of general nature provided by other charitable foundations which are not conditional on delivering certain levels of volumes of a service or supply of charitable goods and income from fundraising partners on the basis of that which is remitted to INTERNATIONAL WAQF AND RELIEF FOUNDATION (IWARF) in the United Kingdom.

##### **Expenditure**

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to

that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an

accrual basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category.

Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

## **INTERNATIONAL WAQF AND RELIEF FOUNDATION (IWARF)**

### **Raising funds**

Raising funds includes all expenditure incurred by the charity to raise funds for its charitable purposes and includes costs of all fundraising activities, events and non-charitable trading.

### **Charitable activities**

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and them. services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support

### **Governance costs**

Governance costs include those incurred in the governance of the Charity and its assets and are primarily associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the Charity.

### **Allocation and apportionment of costs**

Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories usage. on a basis consistent with the use of resources, for example, allocation property costs by floor areas, or per capital, staff costs by the time spent and other costs by their

### **Tangible fixed assets**

Fixed assets are included at cost. Items are capitalised if their cost or, if gifted their donated value, is over £1,000. Depreciation is provided on tangible fixed assets so as to write off the cost or valuation, less any estimated residual value, over their expected useful economic life as follows:

Office equipment 25% straight line basis

### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

### **Fund**

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees. Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity.

Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes. Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

### **Going concern**

The Board of Trustees have reviewed the Charity's financial requirements for a period of 12 months following the date of approval of these accounts and are satisfied that there are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue, therefore the Charity's activities will operate at a adequate level of surplus in the future.

### **Financial instruments**

The charity only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value.

### **Depreciation**

Depreciation has been provided at the following rates in order to write off the assets over their estimated useful lives.

## **IWARF Yearly Report of 2022/2023**

In October 2022, the International Waqf and Relief Foundation (IWARF) continued its campaign for orphans, with increased attention given to the Gaza Emergency appeal to help needy families of orphans and disabled children. However, the main activities were in Turkey, addressing the earthquake that hit the southern part of the country in February 2023.

This year was full of activities and projects, including emergency relief work and long-term projects. We can highlight the activities of the year as follows:

- The orphan sponsorship scheme provided education, medication, food, and clean water to the families of orphans as part of a comprehensive program IWARF focused on during the year 2022/2023.
- The winter campaign took place during the cold months of December and January.
- On February 6th, 2023, an earthquake hit Turkey. IWARF, like many organizations, reacted quickly to relieve people in the southern part of Turkey and northern Syria. Initially, we focused on relief as the extreme harsh winter deprived people of even the bare necessities. However, our duty at IWARF is to intervene during these difficult times, providing necessary relief such as food, medicine, and shelter. We then provided containers for the displaced and homeless people, managing to supply more than 65 containers to house families and their children.
  - By March, 2023 we started preparing for the main campaign of Ramadan 2023. The campaign continued through April and May 2023. The Ramadan project 2023 was launched to help the needy in many countries around the world, such as Yemen, Somalia, Pakistan, Syria, and Turkey, which were affected by the earthquake. We focused on food parcels, hot meals, and all projects needed during Ramadan. We reached thousands of families in more than 7 countries during the holy month of Ramadan.

IWARF has ongoing projects such as orphan care, supporting over 150 orphans year-round. We provide full sponsorship for orphans and their families, covering their necessities. In 2022/2023, IWARF reached hundreds of families with orphans and special needs in these countries, and we remain committed to providing further aid.

In May and June 2023, we launched the Qurbani campaign to support the needy in 10 countries, helping thousands of families in countries such as Yemen, Pakistan, Palestine, and others.

The rest of the year involved following up on ongoing projects, such as those for orphans and refugees in many countries.

#### **1. Accounting policies**

##### **Basis of preparing the financial statements**

**Over the last year**

Year 2021-2022 has been very eventful and full of activities. We have had happiness, sorrow and difficulties along the way, but despite this, we attempted in the International Waqf and Relief Foundation (IWARF) to remain ambitious with our targets and to bring the happiness on the faces of the needy in the unfortunate countries.

In our work we have our continues projects implemented all around the year such as orphans , and we have seasonal projects as Ramadan and Qurbani and we have emergency projects.

In 2021-2022, we reached more than 24,00 families which represent up to 150,000 beneficiaries in Yemen, Rohingya, Palestine, Bangladesh and Somalia, Pakistan, Palestine.

- We are sponsoring more than 130 orphans and we provide full sponsorship for the orphans and their families. The sponsorship covers education medication and food and clean water for the orphans and their families around the year. IWARF in 2021/2022 managed to reach hundreds of families of orphan and special needs in these countries and we are still keen to provide more aid to them.
- On November and December 2021 and January 2022 we launched winter campaigns to help the needy in many countries. We started with the winter campaign 21/22 project which was needed in all our courtiers we are working in. The extreme harsh winter meant people were deprived even from the bare necessities However, our duty at IWARF is to intervene during these difficult times and provide substantial appeal. In fact, this campaign, we managed to reach 3,500 families by providing each family with their winter needs ( winter kit).
- By February we started the preparation of the main campaign of Ramadan 2022. The campaign continued in March, April and May 2022. Hence, we decided to launch the Ramadan 2022 campaign with full introduction about IWARF work in all around the world then we started with IWARF Ramadan Campaign 2022 reached more than 15,000 families in the 10 countries during the whole month of Ramadan.
- By April 2022 we got very busy with the emergency flood in Pakistan. we managed to reach thousands of families affected with the flood.
- By June and July 2022, we launched our seasonal project the Qurbani 2022 to support the needy in 10 countries. We managed to support more than 1000 families in these needy countries and in the Qurbani project.
- By June 2022 as well we launched our orphan appeal to support the orphans and providing Eid gift for them.
- On August 2022 we gave more attention for Gaza Emergency appeal, we manged to reach 500 families in Palestine during the war on Gaza Strip. We have provided all needs of food, blankets, drinks and medical aid. Furthermore, we have expanded our emergency appeal in Gaza strip due to the high need for help




