Objectives and Activities

My Time's objective is to provide for the relief of young carers (young carers being defined as persons up to the age of eighteen years who lives are affected in some way because of the need to care for someone at home), in particular but not exclusively by offering respite activities and support for such young carers in surrey and the surrounding area.

My Time's current activities are sessions of respite for young carers in and around Epsom and Ewell and Mole Valley. The charity runs activity clubs for children and young people aged between 7 and 15 in Ewell, Dorking, Leatherhead and Dorking. Off-site holiday activities are organised as well.

Achievements and Performance

My Time has had another fun filled year full of new experiences and making new friends and partners. We have enjoyed good membership across all clubs during 24-25. With current membership around 90, Ashtead seniors is becoming more established as young carers move up from the Leatherhead junior group. We have stuck with the format of one junior group having one senior group to move up to and this has worked well in Epsom&Ewell and Mole Valley, although we always welcome any new members, but experience has shown that the members that enjoy juniors tend to stay with us as teenagers for longer. In December we said goodbye to our bank session leader Sarah Alexander and welcomed Julie Marskell to the team. Julie had been a volunteer at Leatherhead juniors but is now a session leader, although she continues to volunteer at Dorking seniors as well. In Sept 24 we introduced a My Time uniform with session leaders now wearing logo sweatshirts and t-shirts, and volunteers purchasing if they so choose. The session leaders have provided a varied programme of events which has included crafts, with yet again a special mention to Jenny our arts & craft director and her fantastic creative talents. However, all our session leaders work hard to create a varied programme the children will enjoy which includes scavenger hunts, park play and thematic party nights. The emphasis though is that the club is theirs and we aim to deliver a programme the members want, so we take time to listen and adapt each club to the space and the member's personalities. Taking the seniors camping to Polyapes scout campsite in Cobham for a weekend camp is now an annual event. With the help of volunteers and staff we enjoyed two nights in the large scout hut and provided a programme that included 'My Time Hunted',

orienteering with walkie-talkies, tomahawk throwing, grass sledging and decorating baseball caps and mugs. A very huge thank you goes out to all our volunteers who give up their time and a lot of sleep to make this happen! Without their support we would be unable to give the seniors such a well deserved break and all these new experiences for free. Over the year our older young carers have also enjoyed laser quest, rock climbing and bowling. Holiday activities for our juniors have included a day camp at Polyapes campsite and laser tag at Campaign, Cobham, plus pantomime with visits from Father Christmas, not to mention the wonderful art opportunities supplied by Epsom & Ewell council, when they funded artists to attend the Ewell clubs to lead on new art projects, like mosaic and sculptures. A big shout out to the fantastic support we receive from volunteers. We have wonderful teams across all clubs, and cannot thank them enough for their kindness and ongoing support. They provide not only their time and cars, but compassion and support and are always willing to help out with last minute requests. With a special mention to David Robinson who received a Volunteer award for services to My Time from Community Surrey Voluntary Action last October. We have received very generous financial support from St. Faith's Trust and Children in Need. These funds provide the charity with much needed security and significantly contribute to the core costs which ensure we can use the spaces and employ the staff to deliver the activities the young carers need. Bookham Bowling Club, and recently Epsom Golf Club Ladies Team have been working hard raising funds to help us deliver the fun stuff . We have had continued support from Epsom Rotary Club who donate our Christmas pantomime trip to Epsom playhouse for our junior members and have also given a generous cash donation, thanks to a centenary ball.. Last year they rallied other Rotary Clubs in Ashted and Ewell so My Timers from Leatherhead and Dorking could attend. Truly Giving a partner charity, for another year have organised and supplied all the Christmas presents (80 plus) which Father Christmas distributed at either our Pantomime trips, or our Christmas parties. These generous donations represent a very large saving to the charity and generate especially delighted faces at Christmas. Support also comes from smaller local organisations and local people who play bingo and run lunch clubs. Ewell scouts continue to let us use their facilities for free and Dorking Quakers make regular donations or nominate us for further support. It's this community kindness and support that really helps us achieve our mission of giving young carers the time out they deserve. So, as I sign off from this brief resume of all the fun, kindness and community spirit, I would also like to make special mention of our most important success stories and that is our young carers that stay with us as mentors and volunteers when they become adults. Two came to the AGM, Logan and Bella who have been with My Time as children but now volunteer at either Dorking seniors or Leatherhead juniors, plus both come to camp. Those that are not here but are equally awesome are Rosie who helps at Leatherhead juniors and Daniel and Vaughan who are the exuberant children entertainers at Dorking juniors. They are all impressive and brilliant members of the My Time team and we are hugely grateful they have stuck with us.

Financial Review

The charity's financial situation is robust and there are no concerns regarding the future of the organisation. Our financial reserves are more than sufficient to cope with any unexpected shock or to meet our obligations if forced to close. As a voluntary management committee, we are active in applying for grants and fundraising

My Time's current activities are sessions of respite for young carers in and around Epsom and Ewell and Mole Valley. The charity runs activity clubs for children and young people aged between 7 and 15 in Ewell, Leatherhead and Dorking. Off-site holiday activities are organised as well.

Achievements and Performance

In 2023-24 My Time has had another fun filled year full of new experiences and making new friends and partners.

We have enjoyed good membership across all clubs during 23-24, with the biggest change being our new Ashted senior club to support teenage young carers in Leatherhead and Ashted, funded by a NHS Surrey Heartlands grant. The ambition was to mirror the support we provide young carers up to the age of 16 years in other areas. We have gained new membership, but finding more teenagers remains a work in progress, however over time we should see the success of long term support as children move up from the junior club in Leatherhead and we reconnect with young carers once at Trinity School. In spring we stopped the Monday Ewell junior club as the membership did not justify the additional expense, however this will be monitored as clubs are most successful when attendance is restricted to 15-20 max. If the demand starts to regularly exceed this number, then a case will be presented to trustees to consider restarting the Monday club.

The session leaders have provided a varied programme of events which has included new crafts, with yet again a special mention to Jenny our arts & craft director and her awesome creative talents and Nickie, who continues to create a varied programme for our members which regularly features baking, parties and picnics.

Taking the seniors camping to Polyapes scout campsite in Cobham for a weekend camp is now an annual event. With the help of volunteers and staff we enjoyed two nights in the large scout hut and provided a programme that included an obstacle course, water fight and slides, orienteering and our best purchase ever of walkie-talkies which kept the members entertained as they headed off exploring the woodlands. Jenny provided some fabulous crafts which allowed the children to try their hand at creating and decorating walking sticks. A very huge thank you goes out to volunteer David who has made this all possible. He is very generous with his time, ideas and sharing contacts to make it possible for us to expose the members to new experiences for free.

Over the year our older young carers have also enjoyed rock climbing, a DJ experience, a pottery session, a drumming session plus laser quest.

Holiday activities for our juniors have included a day camp at Polyapes campsite, to get them used to the venue for when they go camping, an activity day with nerf gun fun at Henfold Lakes, a DJ experience, plus pantomime with visits from Father Christmas, not to mention the summer BBQ and all the parties! The Activity day was generously supported by Bookham Bowls Club whose members sponsored a child to attend, so a very big thank you for their kindness.

As always, none of this can happen without the fantastic support we receive from volunteers. We have awesome teams across all clubs, and I cannot thank them enough for their kindness and ongoing support. They provide not only their time and cars, but compassion and support and are always willing to help out with last minute requests. They have also recently given up their time to participate in training, so we can ensure everything we deliver is safe and maintains the appropriate standards for a children's charity. With a special mention to Jenny Petersen who introduced us to St. Faith's Trust and more recently The Golf Foundation.

Over the year we have had continued support from Epsom and Dorking Arts Society, who applied for grants and received funding for the pottery session and DJ Experience.

Other supporters of note are Epsom Rotary Club who donate our Christmas pantomime trip to Epsom playhouse for our junior members and Truly Giving a partner charity, who for another year have organised and supplied all the Christmas presents (80 plus) which Father Christmas distributed at either our Pantomime trips, our Christmas parties or rock climbing. These generous donations represent a very large saving to the charity and generate especially delighted faces at Christmas.

During the last year we have received very generous donations from St. Faith's Trust, Children in Need, The Welfare Trust, Bookham Bowling Club, and Epsom Rotary Club. A special mention to Matt Oldale, an ex- trustee who nominated our charity to his employer Colliers International, who recently completed the infamous mud run this September on an extremely wet day raising over £4K.

This mud run was completed by our own young carers in summer 23 to raise money for the charity. We took a break this year knowing Colliers would be doing it on our behalf, but as far as the children are concerned, this was a poor decision as they love it and demand that we resume to normal muddiness next year!

A more emotional donation was raised by St.Johns Wood school, Leatherhead, after a pupil who was a close friend of Jenny, a member who sadly took her own life a few years ago, nominated My Time as a beneficiary after a year of fundraising. We were delighted to attend the school and thank pupils personally for their £1800 donation.

Support also comes from smaller local organisations and local people who play bingo and run lunch clubs. Ewell scouts continue to let us use their facilities for free and provide their minibuses very cheaply on request. Every kindness helps us achieve our aim, in giving the young carers a break from their role and is very much appreciated.



2022-23

My Time has had another fun filled year full of new experiences and making new friends and partners.

We have enjoyed good membership across all clubs during 22-23, with the biggest change being our departure from Trinity school and moving to Leatherhead Community Hub for one of our Mole Valley junior clubs. The ambition was to support more young carers in the Leatherhead area and not only children attending Trinity school. We have gained new membership, but engaging with all the different schools remains a work in progress due to the lack of a local Home School Link Worker. Membership at all other clubs is 15 plus children, with Ewell remaining the busiest, running a junior club on Monday and Wednesday and a senior club Tuesday.

The session leaders have provided a varied programme of events which has included new crafts, with a special mention to Jenny our arts & craft director and her awesome creative talents, continuing to showcase the abilities of our members. They have tried a variety of crafts, including candle holders, denim craft, bead work and 3D animals to name a few!

The other session leaders have kept the children entertained with parties, park play, crafts, games and with the help of a long-standing volunteer who has scout connections, we have tried air rifles, archery, and clay pigeon shooting. Horton Country Park, Epsom and Meadowbank, Dorking are a favourite for park play, with a joint BBQ being held only this week for Ewell & Leatherhead clubs and a children's entertainer supporting an end of year party at Dorking.

Last summer in the very hot weather we took the seniors camping to Polyapes scout campsite in Cobham. This was new for us, but with the help of volunteers and staff we enjoyed one night in the large scout hut and provided a programme that included team building skills, axe throwing, water fights and remote-controlled cars for entertainment. We sweltered, but had enormous fun, which we will be repeating this August but this time for two nights. A very huge thank you goes out to

volunteer David who has made this all possible. He is very generous with his time, ideas and sharing contacts to make it possible for us to expose the members to new experiences for free.

Holiday activities for our juniors have included a trip to Bocketts Farm, a session at Art K in Stoneleigh, pantomime with visits from Father Christmas and finally a day out to Hampton Court to enjoy the Magic Garden and the Easter Bunny.

Our seniors also enjoyed a Christmas party and bowling with Christmas presents. We went on a trip to Epsom theatre to see Sister Act and tackled some taxing puzzles in escape rooms, followed by lunch at McDonalds in Epsom.

As always, none of this can happen without the fantastic support we receive from volunteers. The fact they give up their time for clubs and holiday activities, plus undergo the training so this can all happen safely with limited costs to the charity, means everything we aspire to do can be delivered. They bring their skills and passions, and the drivers their cars free of charge, which means we can provide meals, delicious cakes, crafts and expose the members to new experiences. They are willing to clear out cupboards, repair kit, go shopping and wash up pots, just so our members have time out and help us keep costs down. We have awesome teams across all clubs, and I cannot thank them enough for their kindness and support.

A special thanks goes to Helen at Ewell and her husband Ben, who delivered another Quiz night for us at Ewell United Reformed Church earlier this year raising over £1.1K and to our own trustee, George who whilst studying for his Masters and holding down a job, also trained and run the London Marathon to help raise funds.

Over the year we have had continued support from Epsom Arts Society, who applied for grants and received funding for the Art K and theatre trip to Epsom playhouse.

Other supporters of note are Epsom Rotary Club who donate our Christmas pantomime trip to Epsom playhouse for our junior members and Truly Giving a partner charity, who for

another year have organised and supplied all the Christmas presents (80 plus) which Father Christmas distributed at either our Pantomime trips, our Christmas parties or bowling. These generous donations represent a very large saving to the charity and generate especially delighted faces at Christmas.

At the end of 22 we said temporarily goodbye to the Co-op community fund, so launched a successful Christmas appeal on social media and amongst friends, plus we also received generous donations from Anthony Wakefield & Company Solicitors, Dorking and The Welfare Trust, Ashted. We were very lucky to be chosen as a beneficiary charity by the Sacred Heart Chorus and Orchestra at St. Joseph's Church, Wimbledon for their annual classical concert and received a £1K donation from Wyfold Charitable Trust.

Support also comes from smaller local organisations and local people who run Christmas craft stalls, and the places we visit who give discounts, such as Bocketts Farm and Hampton Court, who provide free entry. Ewell scouts let us use their facilities for free and provide their minibuses very cheaply. Every kindness helps us achieve our aim, in giving the young carers a break from their role and is very much appreciated.

Finally, a huge thank you to Nickie and Camelot Events in Beare Green, Dorking who beat the previous year's fundraising Mud Run total and raised over £3K in 2022. We had a large team of young carers, their friends, family, and staff, getting dressed up, muddy and wet on a Sunday morning. It is fantastic to see nervous members really grow in confidence after successfully completing an arduous course with the support of their My Time friends and club leaders. And whilst the mud levels were lower than usual due to the hot summer, it was still challenging to complete and will be done again this year!

The 2023 Mud Run will be our final year and we hope it will be our best. I am hoping that local businesses can be encouraged to sponsor us the price of a club (£100), so if you know anyone who might be willing to help please let me know!

In the early part of 2023, we reviewed our contracts with staff to reflect their hard work but also to create more resilience

during times of leave and ill health. With that in mind we recruited Sarah Alexander to the team as a bank team member for Ewell. She has been brilliant at volunteering at clubs to get to know the children, volunteers, and processes, but has also stepped into a Session Leader's shoes in their absence. We have been very lucky to find such a fantastic and qualified team member and we welcome her.

So, as we look forward to another year of providing valuable respite and entertainment for our members, finding new young carers and making new friends within the community I thought I would leave you with some words from our young carers who were asked this week what My Time meant to them.

'I like My Time, it is nice to meet different people and to get away from family. It's just different and nice.'

'It is great to have time out with mates where no-one judges anyone.'

'My Time is a safe haven away from stress and family.'

'It's my little bit of freedom after working hard helping everyone else.'

'It is escape from home for me and I like it. I have good friends.'

'I like meeting new people who relate to me and trying all the activities.'

'I like coming to My Time, it gets me away from my sister. I really like hanging out with my friends.'


'I love My Time, it's great to get out of the house and try doing different things. I must love it I have been coming for years!'
