October 2024 – Covid Inequality project commenced in Schools with the running of a Boxing Tutor course and GB Padwork and Boxing Drills Course .23 Adults and Young people were qualified to work on the project and 12 went on to attend self harm awareness days run by the NHS mental Health Midlands Trust

January 2025 – We held a Boxing tutor Course at Alleyne's Academy, Stone and qualified 14 young people and adults as Boxing Tutors. Enabling them to volunteer on the Right Stuff, Projects

February 2025- - Right Stuff Boxer Amy Nolan attended category at the Golden Girl Box Cup female championship in Boras, Sweden in the first weekend of February. She then won her first senior 63 Kg match before losing in the Semi Finals Medals .



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Summary of the main achievements during the period

April 2021– A School Easter Holiday Programme was run as part of the Stafford Borough Council Schools early intervention grant for 2 weeks. Separate sessions were put on for males and females referred by schools and other local agencies . In total 18 females attended over the holidays and 28 males aged 11 -17 years old.

May -July 2021- The school intervention Project was delivered in Weston Road Academy, Walton High School and at the Right Stuff gym. Over this period the project worked with 45 different individuals both male and female from years 7 to Year 11 using the ASDAN Certificate of Personal effectiveness GCSE equivalent in Amateur Boxing in School and the National Boxing Awards programme at the Right Stuff Gym.

July – August 2021- in Partnership with the Office of the Police and Fire Commissioner for Staffordshire a school summer holiday "SPACE" programme was delivered for 5 weeks of the school Summer holidays. Three sessions a day were delivered Monday to Friday as part of the grant. A junior session 7-10 years, a male session 11-19 years and a female session 11-19 years old. Sixty young people in total attended over the Summer many referred by schools and local agencies including many looked after young people. The Project was visited during the holiday by the Commissioner Mr Ben Adams.

August 2021 – Riviera Box Cup two female Boxers competed in the Riviera Box Cup in Torquay the first boxing tournament to take place after the Covid pandemic. Emily Pugh won Silver and Amy Nolan secured gold in them after 18months out of the ring.


September 2021- The School Intervention Project continued with the start of the new school year 2021/2022. With the Right Stuff continuing to work Monday to Friday in schools as well as working with referred young people at the Right Stuff gym during the evenings and weekends. In total 42 new young people were referred in for the start of the new school year for the project to work with.

October 2021 – The first Boxing Tutor Course was held since the outbreak of the Covid pandemic. In total 16 individuals attended including 10 young people who the project works with as part of its school's early intervention project. All those young

people passed and qualified as Boxing Tutors enabling them to volunteer on Right Stuff Projects and gain essential life and employment skills.

January – March 2022- Several scheduled Box Cups that the Right Stuff had signed up to were cancelled due to Covid outbreaks and restrictions. The Project continued to focus on working on the schools intervention project and building attendance back up at the Right Stuff gym following the lifting of all Covid restrictions. Demand for services was high and it was difficult to meet this demand with long term Right Stuff Coach Amy Hollingshead not returning to the gym due to a serious illness .

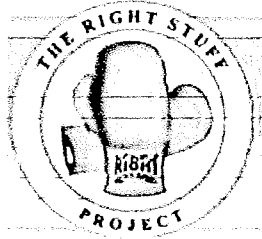

Governance and Management

The project is managed by a management committee who are drawn from the membership,

Candidates are elected by paper ballot at the AGM and will serve office for a 12-month period until re-elected at the next AGM in accordance with the Projects constitution dated 25th February 2021. The Trustees determine the general policy of the project. The day to day running of the project is delegated to the Project Manager, supported by the Trustees. The Project Manager undertakes the key leadership role overseeing Volunteer recruitment, and training and administrative functions in consultation with the Trustees. The day-to-day administration of the project is undertaken within the policies and procedures approved by the Trustees, which provide for only significant expenditure decisions and major capital projects to be referred to the Trustees for prior approval.

The Trustees did not meet physically over the period covered by this report due to Covid restrictions, but phone calls and zoom meetings were held amongst the management committee.

Volunteers

We would like to thank all our volunteers both adults and young leaders without whom we would not have been able to run the projects we did over the last 12 months. In particular those volunteers who assisted with the outside Mental Health cross country walks and outdoor exercise sessions which took place during the National Lockdowns and in compliance with Covid restrictions and social distancing making them particularly challenging events. But at a time of great need for young people's mental and physical Health.,

Other Relationships

The Project Manager, two of the Trustees and all coaches at the project are registered members of England Boxing. The National Governing body for Amateur Boxing in England this registration is renewed annually. As is the Right Stuff's affiliation to England Boxing, this enables individuals to access training in Boxing Coaching, First Aid and Safeguarding. It is also further regulation and oversight of how the activities of the project are run setting high standards in participant safety

Risk Management

The Trustees are responsible for the overseeing of the risks faced by the project. Detailed considerations of risk are delegated to the Project Manager. Risks are identified, assessed and controls established throughout the year. A formal review of the charity's risk management processes is undertaken on an annual basis. Risk is managed under the headings of financial sustainability, venue safety, participant welfare, employment, boxing trips and events and community access.

The main risks that the Trustees have identified and the plans to manage those risks are reputation. The Projects success is built on its reputation for the development and well-being of our participants. We manage this risk through safeguarding policies, staff recruitment policies, and active identification and resolution of health and safety related issues. Risk capacity of the Project manager to carry out all the

necessary day-to-day duties of the project and being over reliant on one individual having all the knowledge to keep the project operating successfully. Building greater resilience .. Through the risk management processes established for the project, the Trustees are satisfied that the major risks identified have been adequately mitigated where necessary. It is recognised that systems can only provide reasonable but not absolute assurance that major risks have been adequately managed.

Aims and Objectives

To divert young people and adults away from criminality , anti-social behaviour and substance abuse including alcohol, by raising self-esteem , discipline and positive activities through the sport of Boxing and other positive activities and involving other professional agencies to assist where particular specialist issues have been identified .

Summary of the main achievements during the period

March – Sept 2020 – The Right Stuff Gym was closed due to the First National Lockdown of the Covid Pandemic. This meant that no boxing or other activities took place at the gym during this time. We did manage to run a SPACE Summer Holiday activity scheme for Staffordshire's Police and Fire Commissioner outdoors at various locations around Stafford in Compliance with National Covid restrictions and with social distancing restrictions in place.

Sept – Dec -2020 – Again due to restrictions the Right Stuff Gym was closed for most of this period and when open numbers were severely restricted to meet Covid Safety measures. We were awarded a grant from Sport England's Covid Emergency Inequalities fund and undertook numerous weekly cross country Mental Health walks and Outdoor Boxing and sports activities. These proved highly popular with many young people attending young people from the BAME communities.

Supporting students at Stafford's Secondary schools through the Stafford Borough Council Early Intervention Grant resumed in September 2020. There was massive demand for interventions from the schools, due to the National Lockdowns. Which had caused numerous mental Health issues amongst young people. Including Social Anxiety, self-harm, depression and eating disorders


Jan – Mar 2021

Our school intervention project continued at Stafford secondary schools, with a mixture of outdoor walks and physical activity both in the school and outdoor countryside settings. Very limited activity took place at the Right Stuff Gym due to National restrictions and lockdowns.

We would not have been able to survive as an organisation during 2020/21 if it had not been for Government and Local council emergency grants and rates grants. These provided us a vital life line to pay rent, utility bills, insurances etc .As we had virtually no income coming into the gym from Boxing activities .This actually enabled

us to make a surplus of funds over the financial year and has created a reserve for possible future uncertainties .
