Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The charity continued to function throughout 2024 with 3 trustees (Guy Carter, Cath Mercer & Paul Mercer) in addition to a further 14 volunteers serving those in our community by crewing Besom in Haringey's van runs and 9 individuals who make up Besom in Haringey's prayer team.

1. Van runs

Altogether in 2024, we completed 20 van runs, enabling us to help 25 families by collecting items from 26 generous donors in our community. In 2024 these items included 19 beds (cots/toddler/bunkbeds/single/double beds - almost all with bedding too); 8 chest of drawers; 2 wardrobes; 5 sofas/armchairs; 3 dining tables; 12 dining chairs; 5 'kitchen basics boxes' (cutlery/crockery/pots and pans). Some families Besom supported just needed a single item (eg, a bed) while other families needed pretty

much everything, often those who had been assigned unfurnished social housing.

2. Prayer

All aspects of Besom in Haringey's work continue to be supported by its committed prayer team that regularly prays for our work, eg ahead of each van run and also regarding how we can meet specific needs received from social workers at Haringey Council and other charities (eg, the human rights charity The Helen Bamber Foundation, <https://www.helenbamber.org/>). We have numerous examples of how, once we have prayed, someone steps forward and offers us an item that we need, as well as how logistical obstacles are overcome following prayer.

3. Christmas Hampers

Our Christmas hampers project continues to be one of our highlights. A number of people support this initiative year-on-year enabling us to create a range of beautiful hampers of different sizes, all full of a mix of Christmas treats and everyday essentials. These are delivered to the individuals and families we have helped throughout the year, as well as vulnerable people in our community who our local social workers feel would particularly benefit from the 'lift' receiving a hamper provides. We were able to deliver 39 hampers in the weeks leading up to Christmas 2024, including some as part of our December van runs.

4. Van

We continue to be thankful for our friends at the Salvation Army in Wood Green providing free secure parking for Besom in Haringey's van. We are also thankful to St James church in Muswell Hill who now let us use some of their garage to store items that we are donated but are unable to rehome immediately. This has been particularly helpful for upholstered items which get damp/mouldy if stored in the van meaning that they then can not be rehomed with families.

5. Finances

Our financial position remains sound, helped by occasional donations of varying sizes, all of which we are so grateful for. We are therefore able to cover ongoing costs, mainly related to the van, ie, tax, ULEZ, insurance, and any repairs necessary for the van to pass its annual MOT. However, we are aware that as the van ages it may not be financially sensible to pay for further repairs and so we may need to buy a new-to-us van or further explore the feasibility of using ZipVan. We are grateful to a Besom supporter who had offered to provide us with some funding for either as/when the time comes. Other costs incurred are largely for bedding for when we provide beds for families, as we seek to go 'above and beyond' by not just providing a bed but also bedding, and where a bed is for a child then a homemade teddy bear too, crocheted by another Besom supporter.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

By the end of August 2022, the charity only had one remaining trustee and was therefore not making any material decisions whilst new trustees were found.

Going into 2023, the charity was still operating and executing the operational requirements of the charity commission, whilst exploring options to rebuild our volunteer base and recruit new trustees.

In April 2023, we were delighted that Paul and Cath Mercer, both long term supporters of Besom, decided to become Trustees and help to rebuild our operations.

From that point onwards, we were able to gradually gain momentum to start operating van runs and serving those around us in the community, rebuild our operations, start supporting families in our borough and seek out some more volunteers for our work.

1. Van Runs

We completed 3 deliveries to families at the end of 2023, helping 7 families and collecting items from 6 generous donors from the area. After a difficult year, it was wonderful to be able to help these families right before Christmas.

2. Trustees and Volunteers

Our trustee team recovered to 3 people and we are still looking to add 1 or 2 more, ideally from other churches in the borough. After a careful start, we also found about half a dozen volunteers for our van team schedule, including several new people.

3. Prayer

All aspects of our Besom's work continue to be supported by a small but committed prayer team that regularly prays for our work, in particular how we can meet specific needs. Time and again, we are amazed as to how, once we have prayed, someone steps forward and offers us an item that we need, as well as how logistical obstacles are overcome following prayer.

4. Christmas Hampers

Our hampers project is one of our highlights and was a priority for us even with limited capacity this year. With the support of many people who support this initiative year on year we were again able to create a wide range of beautiful hampers for individuals and families, working with social workers to identify those who would most benefit from them. We were able to deliver 32 hampers to families before Christmas.

5. Van

We continue to be thankful for our friends at the Salvation Army in Wood Green who provide free secure parking for us. The van, after many months not being used, had several major issues to be fixed before we could restart our deliveries. The possible offer of storage from Haringey Council did not happen, therefore we often need to store items in the van for short periods of time, which means using ZipVan isn't possible until we have a storage location, so we decided to get the van repaired. It is clear that we will need to replace it at some point or use ZipVan if we can find a solution for the need for temporary storage..

6. Finances

When Besom stopped working in late 2022, we informed our financial supporters and many of them paused their contributions. We still have ongoing costs, mainly related to the van (tax, ULEZ) and insurance, but our financial position remains sound. As we gain more momentum it is

likely we'll need to raise money for a replacement van at some point.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Despite the continued challenges due to the Covid-19 pandemic, in 2022, we were still able to successfully complete several van runs and another Christmas hamper project.

We continued to be guided by our 'Faith and Flow' principle, putting our focus on praying first and trusting that there will be the required matching of needs with donations. A healthy financial balance also enabled us to make new purchases of much needed items for families to fill any gaps. We continued to build relationships across the social worker base in Haringey who remain very grateful for the service we can offer their clients.

1. *Van runs:* A total of 4 van runs were completed. These were made possible by having one of our Trustees monitor and link up offers with needs, and a small but committed van team collect and deliver furniture as/when this was feasible. We are hugely grateful to these individuals who enabled us to continue to function during such challenging circumstances caused by the Covid pandemic and its restrictions.

2. *Trustees and Volunteers:* Our Trustee team sadly 2 of our 3 trustees due to moving and ill health. We are so grateful for the time they gave Besom whilst they could and they have offered to help with a smooth transition to new trustees when they have been found. As of the end of 2022, there was still only 1 trustee, so the organisation is not operating but is maintaining the necessary Charity commission commitments. As regards volunteers, as other volunteer-dependent charities have faced, we have seen a decline in the number of people who feel that they have time to support Besom through volunteering on a regular basis. In contrast, the 2022 Christmas hamper project received as much support and enthusiasm as in previous years.

3. *Prayer:* We continued to have a small and dedicated group of prayer supporters who regularly met online throughout 2022. The impact of Covid has reinforced that we operate through God's grace alone and it has been a period of strengthening our personal commitment to the work Besom does in a community which has been particularly hit by the pandemic, and more recently, the cost of living crisis.

4. *Christmas hampers:* The Christmas hamper project was once again a blessing for all involved. We again partnered with St Saviour's church in Finsbury Park. As in previous years, church families and home groups were extremely generous, and prepared 40 beautifully presented hampers full of goodies. These were delivered in the week leading up to Christmas by 4 Besom's volunteers in partnership with our Local Area Coordinator from Haringey Council's Connected Communities Team. Social workers again expressed their gratitude to Besom for blessing clients who they believed would particularly benefit from this festive gift; older vulnerable people as well as single parents and larger families alike.

5. *Van:* We are very grateful that the Besom van enabled us to collect and deliver furniture when we were in a position to do so in 2022. The van continues to be parked at the Salvation Army in Wood Green, whose generosity in this regard is greatly valued. Whilst it has been necessary to store some items in the van, we have sought to keep this at a minimum because of the ongoing issues we experience with the van in terms of damp and leaks. We are encouraged therefore by the possibility of having access to dry, safe and free storage space through Haringey Council, an opportunity that has come about through partnering with our Local Area Coordinator from Haringey Council's Connected Communities Team for the Christmas hamper project.

6. *Finances:* Our funds remained in a healthy state which enabled us to

cover operational costs (including the new ULEZ charge for the van) and fill priority gaps between donations and needs.

We remain completely dependent on volunteer time-givers and furniture to fulfill this much-needed work in Haringey.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Despite the continued challenges posed by the Covid-19 pandemic, we were able to achieve a very high and consistent level of operations throughout the year, culminating in another successful Christmas hamper delivery. This was due to a dedicated ops team volunteer and a small but committed van run team, both supported strongly by the Trustee team.

We continued to be guided by our 'Faith and Flow' principle, putting our focus on praying first and trusting that there will be the required matching of needs with donations. A healthy financial balance also enabled us to make new purchases of

much needed items for families to fill any gaps. We continued to build relationships across the social worker base in Haringey who remain very grateful for the service we can offer their clients.

1. A total of 19 van runs were completed - more than double achieved in 2020 (7) and higher than 2019 and 2018 totals. We were able to deliver on almost all occasions more than 1 requested item and received many messages of thanks from social workers on behalf of their clients. Apart from Easter and summer break, we had at least one van run a month and usually 2-3. This was made possible by having an ops team volunteer providing ongoing day-to-day support and a significant commitment from a van team of about 7 volunteers, excluding Trustees, who were also heavily involved. We were also fortunate to have a volunteer co-ordinator on van run scheduling in the early part of 2021 which reduced the Trustee operational burden. We are hugely grateful to this team who showed enormous generosity in time-giving, flexibility and adaptability to Covid regulations.

2. Trustees and Volunteers: Our Trustee team was largely unchanged in 2021, however in November, one of the team stepped down as she moved on to a new employment role outside Haringey. We are so thankful for her support of Besom and the efforts she made to introduce Besom in Haringey to other churches in the borough and connect with the national Besom organisation. As regards volunteers, one of our van team co-ordinators moved away from the area in the summer so sadly was no longer able to be involved. For Christmas hampers, the same volunteer who has led these over the past few years took the role again. We are delighted she continues to have a commitment to this wonderful annual event.

3. Prayer: We continued to be supported by a small and dedicated group of prayer supporters who regularly met online throughout the year. The impact of Covid has reinforced that we operate through God's grace alone and it has been a period of strengthening our personal commitment to the work Besom does in a community which has been particularly hit by the pandemic.

4. Christmas hampers: The Christmas hamper project was once again a blessing for all involved. We continued to partner with St Saviour's church in Finsbury Park. A team of 6 volunteers delivered 36 hampers to single people, single parents, as well as large families across Haringey. As before, church families were extremely generous, families and home groups preparing beautifully presented hampers full of goodies and also providing books and toys for children. This initiative is something social

workers are now very aware of and they are keen to put forward clients who they believe will particularly benefit from this festive gift.

5. Van: We are very grateful that our van was fully operational over the year. Regular van runs and our committed team at the garage helped ensure we did not have any issues. We also maintained very low levels of items stored in the van to reduce risks of water leak damage. The van continued to be parked at the Salvation Army in Wood Green, whose generosity in this regard is greatly valued.

6. Finances: Our funds remained in a healthy state which enabled us to cover operational costs (including the new ULEZ charge for the van) and fill priority gaps between donations and needs. Priorities remained items for children and, in particular, beds and bedding. We collected, delivered and built these via the van runs to maintain personal connections with the families receiving items.

We remain completely dependent on volunteer time-givers and furniture to fulfill this much-needed work in Haringey.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The challenges faced in 2020 as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic had a significantly detrimental impact on Besom in Haringey's scale of operation. With additional challenges of water leakage into the van interior and a limited number of active van team members, we were unable to support as many

families as we would have hoped. However, we have continued to be encouraged by God's grace in these difficult times, with a committed volunteer joining our operations team to prepare the van runs and a Christmas hampers initiative which brought joy to us, the social workers we engage with and the families who received these gifts at the end of a hard year.

1. A total of 7 van runs were completed - around half of the 2019 and 2018 totals - with 12 separate furniture collections/purchases and 13 separate deliveries to individuals or families. We were able to deliver on almost all occasions more than 1 requested item and received many messages of thanks from social workers on behalf of their clients. The significant decline in van runs was primarily due to the need to suspend operations across April-September due to Covid-19. It was also hampered in the first quarter by limited volunteer numbers. We remain hugely grateful to a small but dedicated van team who regularly commit Saturday mornings to these deliveries. Our meetings with other churches to discuss their involvement have continued, however with a greater focus on their Covid response, we are yet to see volunteers coming forward

2. Trustees and Volunteers: Our Trustee team was unchanged in 2020. On the ops side, we said goodbye to one of our volunteers early in 2020 on the birth of her baby, and another stepped back to focus on other Covid-related support activities at her church. However, when we re-started operations in September we were able to welcome a new volunteer to the team. Her ongoing, day-to-day commitment has made a difference to Trustee roles and has reduced the operational burden on some of the Trustees. As highlighted, an ongoing challenge to our operations is a limited number of active van run volunteers

3. Prayer: As we faced both ongoing and unique challenges in 2020, prayer continued to be a key focus in guiding our decisions. In February, we had a Trustee remote prayer session to pray into the challenges of limited volunteers and issues with water leaks in the van which caused damage to items. We also continue to be supported by a small group of prayer supporters who regularly met online throughout the year. The impact of Covid has reinforced that we operate through God's grace alone and it has been a period of strengthening our personal commitment to the work Besom does in a community which has been particularly hit by the pandemic

4. Christmas hampers: The Christmas hamper project was a blessing for all involved. Despite the ongoing challenges, following much prayer we went ahead - believing that, even if we were only able to show something of God's love to one

vulnerable family, then that was something. Within a couple of days of announcing the project to the church family at St James, a number of people offered to prepare hampers and we once again partnered with St Saviour's church in Finsbury Park, who were keen to contribute to both the assembly and distribution of hampers. Altogether we delivered 36 hampers to single people, single parents, as well as large families across Haringey. The Lord was good every step of the way: from being able to find recipients' homes and park easily, to gifting over 30 children's books that had been donated, to keeping everyone safe. Recipients were so pleased to receive a hamper, and as one of the social workers we liaised with commented: "Every bit of support you offer makes a difference to a client's life"

5. Van: Our van has experienced a number of issues this year alongside water leakage. We are very grateful to our garage who not only organised the MOT and service but also collected and returned the van after the work was completed. The van continues to be parked at the Salvation Army in Wood Green, whose generosity in this regard is greatly valued

6. Finances: Our funds are in a healthy state and this has enabled us to both cover the additional van costs but also fill any gaps between donations and needs. As a result, we have bought a number of new items, in particular beds, mattresses and bedding. We collect these and deliver them via the van runs so we can maintain personal connections with the families receiving items

We remain completely dependent on volunteer time-givers and furniture and financial donors to fulfill this much-needed work in Haringey.
