




Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The year has been busy with income remaining steady and above budget.

Apart from continuous business or regular maintenance of the park our main project has been the development of what we term 'Phase 2' to this end we planted 6000 trees in January and February. We then had a major capital expenditure on creating an access roadway and Carpark and then continued our planting programme in December. Tree planting is planned to be completed early 2025.

The increasing workload necessitated employment of an additional groundsman who started employment in February. Concern over the safety of groundsmen working in a large area resulted in provision of radios and bodycams to provide reassurance in the face of aggressive dogwalkers. Vandalism is a constant problem and CCTV was installed at the advice of local police.

In other matters our monthly family coffee mornings remain popular and income from this allowed a charitable donation of £250 to MND charity. As an interesting diversion we also arranged and supervised our first Muslim Burial.



The Burial Park continues to attract clients on a regular basis and our income is commensurate with our budget allowing the Charity to continue a gradual and sustainable development of the park.

We have increased the hours of our two administrative Employees to cope with increasing public demand and also increased the hours of our two ground maintenance staff.

Plans are well advanced for an extension of our park (Phase 2) with grants being sought for funding from various sources

To this end , and in anticipation we assumed tenancy of what we call phase 2 of the agricultural land, we have purchased a ride on tractor mower and trailer to assist with grounds maintenance and reduce reliance on local council operations.

We started planting of trees in the latter stages of the year and plans are in place to plant a further 6000 trees in the spring of 2024.

The Burial Park continues to attract clients on a regular basis and our income is commensurate with our budget allowing the Charity to continue a gradual and sustainable development of the park.

We have increased the hours of our two administrative Employees to cope with increasing public demand and also increased the hours of our two ground maintenance staff. One being transferred from self-employed casual hours to a full time permanent contract.

We have engaged a qualified horticulturalist on a self employed basis (6 month contract) to advise on tree maintenance and also wild flower propagation throughout the park.

In the latter part of the year we have allocated funds and set in motion an expansion plan to provide a private room for clients and also a disabled toilet. This is awaiting planning consent.

We were also successful in obtaining a grant from Tesco's under their bags for life scheme.

This was awarded to fund development of wild flower glades in the woodland area and has been successfully discharged.
