The Directors/Trustees of Camp Hill Community Centre present their report, together with the Financial Statements for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March 2025.

### **Structure, Governance and Management**

Camp Hill Community Centre is a Company Limited by Guarantee, having no share capital. Directors operate under the Memorandum and Articles of Association.

There are 6 Directors/Trustees who have the final say on organisational and financial matters; elected from General User Committee nominations.

There are currently 6 directors in place.

General User Committee: made up of one representative from each organisation that regularly uses the centre.

Directors are appointed and re-elected at the AGM and retire on a rotation basis. On appointment new Directors/Trustees are advised of their responsibilities, included in the induction process are copies of the articles, processes and procedures, guidance notes from the Charity Commission and Companies House.

### **Principle Objectives**

- Promote the benefit of the inhabitants of Camp Hill and the surrounding areas without distinction of gender, sexual orientation, race or of political, religious or other opinions, by associating together the said inhabitants and the local authorities, voluntary and other organisations in the common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation and leisure-time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants;
- Establish, or secure the establishment of a community centre and to maintain and manage the same co-operation with the Northampton borough council and any other person or body in furtherance of these objects;
- Promote such other charitable purposes as may from time to time be determined

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### **Achievement and performance**

2024-25 covered a quiet year. Although bookings are slightly up, they are still are not at pre-covid years level. We have been working with different people over the year, and a local business has been given Ofsted approval to start a new nursery at the centre, this will start in April 2025. So going forward we will be back to a position of being financially positive.

During the latter part of the year, we started on a programme of changing all our light fittings to LED type. The bill for this will be in the next financial year to the sum of approx £2,750, but will see a saving of approx £150 in electricity costs, so a relativity short payback time of 18 months.

### **Financial Review**

Financially the company is still in a good position with around £95k of reserves at bank (down from £98k on the previous year). Expenditure was well above Income, mostly due to high energy costs.

The actual income from bookings was approx £29k, ideally this needs to around £33k/annum, so burden is not on cash reserves. Building up cash reserves helps us plan for replacement of equipment and upkeep of the building.

All invoicing and accountancy is now done via Xero, which has lessened the time burden on the volunteers.

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Risk is managed by

- All cheques and bank transfer payments require 2 signatures
- Internet banking is used for all payments
- Regular user groups are encouraged to pay by BACS
- Cash is not handled
- The treasurer has full access to the internet bank account with one of two other directors/trustees having access to monitor the account and to second payments.
- Small sundry items are now purchased by CAF Bank debit card, and other items pre-authorized as per minutes of directors meeting. [Card currently issued to C.Robinson-Smith only]

The company has no debts and does not have a policy of securing finance.

#### **Public Benefit**

The organisation provides a safe and secure building for a wide variety of clubs and groups. These include Women's Institute, Squirrel, Beaver, Cub and Scout groups, Theatre school, Karate, Bowling groups, as well as Model Aircraft, Clubbercise, Socratots and Extra education classes. There is no discrimination and we cater for all age groups in NN4 and the surrounding areas of Northampton. Children's parties and family parties occur mostly at weekends.

#### **Reserves Policy**

It is the intention of the management team to ensure that sufficient funds are available to cover future commitments and to build a general reserve of 4 years worth of running costs.

#### **Risk Policy**

The board of directors has conducted a review of the major risks to which the company is exposed. Where appropriate systems or procedures have been established to mitigate the risks the company faces.

#### **Company special provision**

The report of the Directors has been prepared in accordance with the special provisions of the Companies Act 2006 relating to small companies.

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The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) (102), 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in January 2015, applicable UK Accounting Standards and the Charities Act 2011.

The principal accounting policies of the charity are set out below.

**Format**

The company has taken advantage of the provisions of the Companies Act 2006 and presented an income and expenditure account in the form of a Statement of Financial Activities on the grounds that it enables the financial statements to show a true and fair view of the result for the year.

**Fixed Assets**

Depreciation is calculated on a straight line method to write down the cost of all tangible fixed assets by instalments over the expected useful lives.

Buildings 4%

Fixtures, fittings and Equipment 25%

Short Life Asset 50%

**Stocks**

Any stocks of cleaning materials and stationery held are valued at cost.

**Incoming Resources**

Income is brought into account on a receivable basis.

**Investment Income**

Interest is brought into account on a receivable basis.

**Gifts in Kind and Donated Services and Facilities**

Gifts in kind, donated facilities and voluntary help, are not included in the financial statements since it is not considered practical to quantify such income.

**Resources Expended**

Expenditure is stated inclusive of value added tax, and brought into account in the year in which it is due.

**Designated Funds**

Designated funds – these are funds set aside by the trustees out of unrestricted funds for specific future purposes or projects

**Reserves**

The current reserve policy is to maintain sufficient cash flow for known commitments, and the replacement of certain assets.

**Risk**

The Directors/Board of Trustees do not believe the organisation is subject to any substantial risk beyond those disclosed in the Annual Report and Accounts.

### **Structure, Governance and Management**

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### **Achievement and performance**

2023-24 covered a quiet year. Centre use is still not at pre-covid years level.

No major repairs or improvements were made to the centre. This was directly in response to the forecast income for the year.

During the year, we took the decision to employ a site supervisor; taking on cleaning duties and ensuring day to day operation of the facilities.

### **Financial Review**

Financially the company is in a good position with around £98k of reserves at bank (down from £105k on the previous year). Expenditure was well above Income, mostly due to high energy costs.

The actual income from bookings was approx £25k, ideally this needs to around £32k/annum, so burden is not on cash reserves. Building up cash reserves helps us plan for replacement of equipment and upkeep of the building.

The use of the accountancy software package Xero during the year, has reaped benefit in the management of invoices and bills, and payment thereof.

- All cheques and bank transfer payments require 2 signatures
- Internet banking is used for all payments
- Regular user groups are encouraged to pay by BACS
- Cash is not handled

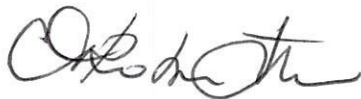

### **Structure, Governance and Management**

Camp Hill Community Centre is a Company Limited by Guarantee, having no share capital. Directors operate under the Memorandum and Articles of Association.

There are 6 Directors/Trustees who have the final say on organisational and financial matters; elected from General User Committee nominations.

There is currently 5 directors in place. We a vacancy for 1 director.

General User Committee: made up of one representative from each organisation that regularly uses the centre.

Directors are appointed and re-elected at the AGM and retire on a rotation basis. On appointment new Directors/Trustees are advised of their responsibilities, included in the induction process are copies of the articles, processes and procedures, guidance notes from the Charity Commission and Companies House.

### **Principle Objectives**

- Promote the benefit of the inhabitants of Camp Hill and the surrounding areas without distinction of gender, sexual orientation, race or of political, religious or other opinions, by associating together the said inhabitants and the local authorities, voluntary and other organisations in the common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation and leisure-time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants;
- Establish, or secure the establishment of a community centre and to maintain and manage the same co-operation with the Northampton borough council and any other person or body in furtherance of these objects;
- Promote such other charitable purposes as may from time to time be determined

### **Achievement and performance**

2022-23 covered another period of ups/downs. Fortunately Tots Play now use our facilities, and although the income increase is warmly welcomed, however we are still not up to levels seen pre-covid with the loss of some U3A groups and Tree Tops nursery.

The increase in minimal wage and the knock-on costs with the cleaning company, lead us to engaging a site-supervisor direct as a cost saving exercise.. The site supervisor also has responsibilities for facilities testing, engaging subcontractors for repairs and meeting parties, ensuring we have cover for unlock/lock for parties, as well as cleaning duties.

More financial bad news, saw us embracing the hike in gas and electricity charges imposed on us, with our 'normal' monthly winter bills going from around £600 to £1900!

With all the uncertainty, we did however cover our normal running costs to some extent. The big overspend that we did have though, was due to the procuring and installation of the new shutters (£20k+), the cost of which we took from reserves. During the year, we also saw the installation of a new water heater for the kitchenette, water heater for the main kitchen, new pressurisation unit for the central heater, all purchased the previous year.

Director/Trustee meetings have been minimum with financial decisions discussed/agreed typically via 'whatsapp' group chat.

At the time of this report AGM for 2023 will happen in October (and will cover financial periods 2021-22 & 2022-23), and bring us to date with the post-covid catch-up.

### **Financial Review**

Financially the company is in a strong position with around £105k of reserves at bank (down from £130k on the previous year) . Income is in line with expenditure and all centre maintenance is mostly up to date.

The actual income from bookings was approx £24k, Ideally this needs to around £30k/annum, so we can get further monies into reserves, so we can maintain services.

Risk is managed by

- All cheques require 2 signatures
- Internet banking is used for regular payments and utilities bills
- Regular user groups are encouraged to pay by BACS
- Cash is banked regularly and no money is left at the centre
- The treasurer has full access to the internet bank account with one of two other directors/trustees having access to monitor the account and to second payments.
- Small sundry items are now purchased by CAF Bank debit card, and other items pre-authorised as per minutes of directors meeting. [Card currently issued to C.Robinson-Smith only]

The company has no debts and does not have a policy of securing finance.

#### **Public Benefit**

The organisation provides a safe and secure building for a wide variety of clubs and groups. These include Women's Institute, Squirrel, Beaver, Cub and Scout groups, Theatre school, Karate, Bowling groups, as well as Model Aircraft, First Aid, Clubbercise, Health groups and Tots Play. The Directors/Trustees of Camp Hill Community Centre present their report, together with the Financial Statements for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022.

### **Structure, Governance and Management**

Camp Hill Community Centre is a Company Limited by Guarantee, having no share capital. Directors operate under the Memorandum and Articles of Association.

There are 6 Directors/Trustees who have the final say on organisational and financial matters; elected from General User Committee nominations.

There is currently 5 directors in place.

General User Committee: made up of one representative from each organisation that regularly uses the centre.

Directors are appointed and re-elected at the AGM and retire on a rotation basis. On appointment new Directors/Trustees are advised of their responsibilities, included in the induction process are copies of the articles, processes and procedures, guidance notes from the Charity Commission and Companies House.

### **Principle Objectives**

- Promote the benefit of the inhabitants of Camp Hill and the surrounding areas without distinction of gender, sexual orientation, race or of political, religious or other opinions, by associating together the said inhabitants and the local authorities, voluntary and other organisations in the common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation and leisure-time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants;
- Establish, or secure the establishment of a community centre and to maintain and manage the same co-operation with the Northampton borough council and any other person or body in furtherance of these objects;
- Promote such other charitable purposes as may from time to time be determined

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### **Achievement and performance**

The year 2021-22 covered another period of uncertainty, with the corona-virus pandemic coming near an end, the return of existing groups has not reached the same level as pre-pandemic. The nursery closed its business (a major source of income to the centre), and a few other groups (mostly older generation groups) have ceased activities.

Fortunately, we have gained another groups: Styles Stars musical theatre school, alongside Dance with a Difference.

Director/Trustee meetings were not held, and financial decisions were discussed/agreed typically via 'messenger' group chat. A list of decisions are itemised within the financial section.

At the time of this report the belated AGM for 2021 (covering financial periods 2019-20 & 2020-21) has happened on April 4th 2022. During this AGM Ella Styles was welcomed to the Director/Trustee board, whilst Marie Gale stood down.

### **Financial Review**

Financially the company is in a strong position with around £132k of reserves at bank. Income is in line with expenditure and all centre maintenance is mostly up to date.

Whilst total income is healthy, the actual income from bookings was £17,598, which is well below a normal level. The government covid business grants and donations to a value of £12,187 during the year gave us enough to remain on a level balance.

Financial decisions were made by director/trustees virtually via 'messenger', and are recorded now in this annual report for transparency:-

£2,200 for new water heater for kitchenette, hot water for kitchen.

£1,300 for new pressurisation unit for centre heating system.

Both these purchases are waiting to be fitted during warmer weather, where heating can be switched off without consequences.

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Risk is managed by

- All cheques require 2 signatures
- Internet banking is used for regular payments and utilities bills
- Regular user groups are encouraged to pay by BACS
- Cash is banked regularly and no money is left at the centre
- The treasurer has full access to the internet bank account with one of two other directors/trustees having access to monitor the account and to second payments.
- Small sundry items are now purchased by CAF Bank debit card, and other items pre-authorized as per minutes of directors meeting. [Card currently issued to C.Robinson-Smith only]

The company has no debts and does not have a policy of securing finance.

#### **Public Benefit**

The organisation provides a safe and secure building for a wide variety of clubs and groups. These include Women's Institute, Beaver, Cub and Scout groups, Art Group, Youth Club, Art and Card Groups, Dance group, 2 Bowling groups and Keep Fit, as well as Model Aircraft, First Aid, Clubbercise and Health clinics. There is no discrimination and we cater for all age groups in NN4 and the surrounding areas of Northampton. Children's parties and family parties occur mostly at weekends.

#### **Reserves Policy**

It is the intention of the management team to ensure that sufficient funds are available to cover future commitments and to build a general reserve of 4 years worth of running costs.

#### **Risk Policy**

The board of directors has conducted a review of the major risks to which the company is exposed. Where appropriate systems or procedures have been established to mitigate the risks the company faces.

#### **Company special provision**

The report of the Directors has been prepared in accordance with the special provisions of the Companies Act 2006 relating to small companies.

Company law requires the members of the Board of Directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of the affairs of the Company and of the income and expenditure of the Company for that period. In preparing these financial statements the members of the board are required to:

- 
- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently
  - Make adjustments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent
  - Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Company will continue its activities

The members of the board are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. **Format**

Designated funds – these are funds set aside by the trustees out of unrestricted funds for specific future purposes or projects

**Reserves**

The current reserve policy is to maintain sufficient cash flow for known commitments, and the replacement of certain assets.

**Risk**

The Directors/Board of Trustees do not believe the organisation is subject to any substantial risk beyond those disclosed in the Annual Report and Accounts.
