Activity report:

I visited Tim for 3 weeks last May to audit the charity, and to enjoy a short break with Tim in Victoria Falls. My report was distributed last June. Fr. Tim visited the UK last August and September. We 4 trustees were able to meet on zoom while he was here. He visited Yate, Chipping Sodbury, Chatham, Anglesey and Bury St. Edmunds R C Churches to say Mass and meet the parishioners, many of whom gave him donations. He met with Ruth, Brendan and myself in person too, and Lesley, who we were delighted to welcome as a new trustee in November 2024.

Tim continues to keep very busy with various building projects, and his priestly duties as the area Dean. Dambwankulu Secondary School being sponsored by a private donor is progressing well. The irrigation system and dam at the Mission are complete, so vegetables are being grown, for 45 households to be able to grow vegetables for themselves, and to sell. The chicken project ended in January 2024, but we gave the children at the hostel a small grant to buy 25 chickens at point of lay, and they are doing well. Florence and Hardness who work in the sewing room, continue to make and sell garments, though Hardness recently had to take leave to care for her sick husband, who sadly passed away. The project was reviewed while I was visiting, and they were encouraged to be as self-sufficient as they can.

At Neshaya Secondary school, the children were growing vegetables, but a 6th Form is now being built on the site, and a new site has been found and developed for the garden. I visited the site while I was there. Following my visit, we raised sufficient funds for a school irrigation system for Makwa Primary school, and vegetables are being grown by the children. They now need to secure the fences however to prevent goats eating the crops.

We are sending £150 a month to them to provide a meal for each of the 250 children, 2 days a week in school term. This was made possible due to taking out a CAF donate account with our bank, and asking people to change their Direct debits to this account. Several donors kindly increased their giving and several new donors signed up. CAF donate claim back the Gift Aid for us every week, so I don't have to do this, which is great.

Our principal donor has again increased his amount of giving monthly, at Tim's request, which we are most grateful for. We are always looking for more people to kindly start a Direct debit however, so we can feed more children, 90% of whom only get one meal a day.

We have been able to send all monthly amounts due to Fr. Tim via the COOP and CAF banks, or money companies as needed. We continue to be challenged by the banking system, but have managed to overcome these, for collection every month in Zimbabwe. Sending to a business account has meant Tim's secretary can withdraw larger amounts, which saves him time and bank charges.

Fundraising and Publicity April 2024- April 2025

Fundraising

Regular contact with a benefactor resulted in a donation of £15,000. The twice-yearly newsletter we send out from Fr. Tim helps maintain interest, and generous donations on a one-off basis. We held several events including an African evening on Anglesey to raise funds for projects, for my trip to Zimbabwe in May 2024, and I was able to take £4,600 due to generous donations too, for any projects Tim felt he needed, it is a 'bottomless pit'!

We had a follow up evening for me to report back on my visit to Zimbabwe, and for donors to meet Tim, while he was on Anglesey; and a Quiz night at a pub, and raised £1170. In total we raised £4000 for Makwa school garden, and a further £1500 was donated to extend Mwemba Primary school library. Gift Aid claimed amounted to £1275 in March 2024. There are 20 Direct Debits in the CAF accounts, giving regularly, which we are most grateful for.

Proposed Fundraising for April 2025-April 2026

We were successful in gaining Match funding from the Big Give charity for £2,500, which was doubled up to that amount, at the end of April 2025. This enabled us to create an irrigation system for a second Primary school, at Mwemba. Next year we will organise an African evening for April 2026. Various activities have been planned and the website updated to encourage others to give donations. All the people on our mailing list are aware of the Match funding and have been encouraged to hold a fund-raising activity then.

I also made good links with Llandudno Rotary Club, when I spoke there in February 2025, and they are kindly offering other financial help, as they feel they can. I hope to speak at other Rotary Clubs and U3A clubs. It is a challenge to get a positive response, however.

Publicity

We will maintain contact with our regular donors as we send out Fr. Tim's newsletter twice a year, to over 200 people. The details of the website are included in the newsletter . The web site has been updated and is on Facebook.. Our updated tri-fold publicity leaflet is on our website. The events to be held during the Big Give week of 22nd-29th April 2026 in Holyhead will further publicise the charity.

Internal communications

The Trustees held meetings: May, July and November 2024, and March 2025 by Zoom. Our Annual General meeting will be held on the 26th May by zoom. We received three budgets from Fr. Tim requesting funds for 4 month periods, and were able to approve them all without alteration, as they came within the monies held and available. He requested extra funds, mostly for building, as detailed in his Annual Report, which were received with thanks from his benefactor.

Summary

Overall this has been a very successful eleventh year, with Fr.Tim being able to keep up with his projects in community development, for the poorest of families. The bequest of 2018 is diminishing, but we received extra donations from several benefactors. We would appreciate any support you can offer, and your prayers.

Thank you to all those who so generously support CFNZ.




Fr. Tim visited the UK last year. We were able to meet on zoom while he was here. He visited Yate, Chipping Sodbury, Chatham and Bury St. Edmunds R C Churches to say Mass and meet the parishioners, many of whom gave him donations.

Tim helps wherever he can. He arranges for blind people to have cataract operations, and others to receive medical assistance every month. The Secondary School being sponsored by a private donor is progressing well, as is the irrigation system and dam at the Mission, for 45 households to be able to grow vegetables for themselves, and to sell. The chicken project ended in January 2024. This is under review. Mercy whom we employed to sew school uniform to sell, left at the end of 2023, but her assistant Florence continued to make and sell garments. This needs reviewing.

Our principal donor has increased his amount of giving monthly, at Tim's request, which we are most grateful for.

At Neshaya Secondary school, the children were growing vegetables, but a 6th Form is now being built on the site, and a new site found for the garden.

We have been able to send all monthly amounts due to Fr. Tim via the COOP and CAF banks, or money companies as needed. We continue to be challenged by the system, but have managed to overcome these, for collection every month in Zimbabwe. Sending to a business account has meant Tim's secretary can withdraw larger amounts, which saves him time and bank charges.

Fundraising and Publicity April 2023- April 2024

Fundraising

Regular contact with a benefactor in Bristol resulted in a donation of £15,000. The twice-yearly newsletter we send out from Fr. Tim helps maintain interest, and generous donations on a one-off basis. It was Tim's 40th anniversary as a priest in May 2023, and several generous donations were received in recognition of this achievement. Gift Aid claimed amounted to £1279 in March 2024. The lead trustee organised an African evening for 13th April 2024, with a lot of interest. There are 13 Standing Orders in the CAF account, giving regularly, which we are most grateful for.

Fr. Tim did not visit the UK last year.

Tim helps wherever he can, since lockdown restrictions ended last year. He takes people for cataract operations and medical assistance every month. The Secondary School being sponsored by a private donor is progressing well. The chicken project is not doing well, as sadly a lot of chickens did in the extreme heat. This is under review. Mercy whom we employ to sew school uniform to sell, says the project is going well. Mercy has an assistant, Hardness, a single Mum, working with her. Lauren who we sponsored to do a diploma in sewing, which she completed, also joined the team.

St. Michael’s Primary School, Chatham is no longer fundraising for us, they have a new head teacher. Our principal donor has increased his amount of giving monthly, at Tim’s request, which we are most grateful for. Fr. Vincent has a new computer package for building design, to help Tim in the future. He is not coming with Tim to the UK this year.

Also due to lockdown, the garden fence sponsored by Yate RC Church had not been erected, or seed purchased, at the Secondary school for the children to grow vegetables. Tim confirmed the fence is now being built.

We have been able to send all monthly amounts due to Fr. Tim via the COOP and CAF banks when it has been possible, or money companies as needed. We continue to be challenged by the system, but have managed to overcome these, for collection every month in Zimbabwe.

Fundraising and Publicity April 2022- April 2023

Fundraising

Regular contact with a benefactor in Bristol resulted in a donation of £10,000. The twice-yearly newsletter we send out from Fr. Tim helps maintain interest, and generous donations on a one-off basis. Gift Aid claimed amounted to £646. Paypal through Facebook resulted in income of £20. There are 14 Standing Orders in the CAF account, giving regularly, which we are most grateful for. Sue requested donors to increase their giving.

Proposed Fundraising for April 2023-April 2024

The lead trustee will liaise with Tim to organise for him to speak in Chatham church when he is here in August, and possibly Yate church. It may be possible to do a presentation at the church in Bury St. Edmunds too, Sue to action.

The bequest of 2018 is diminishing, but we received extra donations from several benefactors. This means we have been able to send Tim a larger monthly amount of about £8800 a month to run the Mission, and £139,640, double the amount we sent last year , including building projects. In the year ahead 2023-2024, with our updated 5 year budget Plan, we will send Tim £8800 a month, but would appreciate any support you can offer for the building projects. The Safeguarding Code of Conduct was signed by all adults at the Makwa mission last October.

Activity report:

Fr. Tim did not visit the UK last year.

Tim helps wherever he can, since lockdown restrictions ended last year. He takes people for cataract operations and medical assistance every month. The Secondary School being sponsored by a private donor is progressing well. The chicken project is not doing well, as sadly a lot of chickens did in the extreme heat. This is under review. Mercy whom we employ to sew school uniform to sell, says the project is going well. Mercy has an assistant, Hardness, a single Mum, working with her. Lauren who we sponsored to do a diploma in sewing, which she completed, also joined the team.

St. Michael’s Primary School, Chatham is no longer fundraising for us, they have a new head teacher. Our principal donor has increased his amount of giving monthly, at Tim’s request, which we are most grateful for. Fr. Vincent has a new computer package for building design, to help Tim in the future. He is not coming with Tim to the UK this year.

Also due to lockdown, the garden fence sponsored by Yate RC Church had not been erected, or seed purchased, at the Secondary school for the children to grow vegetables. Tim confirmed the fence is now being built.

We have been able to send all monthly amounts due to Fr. Tim via the COOP and CAF banks when it has been possible, or money companies as needed. We continue to be challenged by the system, but have managed to overcome these, for collection every month in Zimbabwe.

Fundraising and Publicity April 2022- April 2023

Fundraising

Regular contact with a benefactor in Bristol resulted in a donation of £10,000. The twice-yearly newsletter we send out from Fr. Tim helps maintain interest, and generous donations on a one-off basis. Gift Aid claimed amounted to £646. Paypal through Facebook resulted in income of £20. There are 14 Standing Orders in the CAF account, giving regularly, which we are most grateful for. Sue requested donors to increase their giving.

Proposed Fundraising for April 2023-April 2024

The lead trustee will liaise with Tim to organise for him to speak in Chatham church when he is here in August, and possibly Yate church. It may be possible to do a presentation at the church in Bury St. Edmunds too, Sue to action.

Publicity

We will maintain contact with our regular donors as we send out Fr. Tim's newsletter twice a year, to over 200 people. The details of the website are included in the newsletter . The web site has been updated and is on Facebook.. Our updated tri-fold publicity leaflet is on our website.

Internal communications

The Trustees held meetings: May, July and November 2022 by Zoom. Our Annual General meeting was held on the 19th May 2022 by zoom. Sue's 5 year plan was discussed, and a proposed visit next year in 2024 by Sue and Brendan to Zimbabwe to review the project and celebrate our 10th Anniversary as a charity.

We will hold an extra meeting with Fr. Tim in August 2023 while he is staying at 'Pencae', the head Office for CFNZ, which will be very useful.

We received three budgets from Fr. Tim requesting funds for 4 month periods, and were able to approve them all without alteration, as they came within the monies held and available. He requested extra funds, as detailed in his Annual Report, for various building projects, for community development.

The ISA's held in a Santander account were transferred to the CAF account.

Summary

Overall this has been a very successful ninth year, with Fr. Tim being able to keep up with his projects in community development, for the poorest of families. The bequest of 2018 is diminishing, but we received extra donations from several benefactors. This means we have been able to send Tim a larger monthly amount of about £8800 a month to run the Mission, and £139,640, double the amount we sent last year , including building projects. In the year ahead 2023-2024, with our updated 5 year budget Plan, we will send Tim £8800 a month, but would appreciate any support you can offer for the building projects. The Safeguarding Code of Conduct was signed by all adults at the Makwa mission last October.

Activity report:

Fr. Tim was not due to visit the UK last year fortunately. Several of our regular benefactors kindly sent large sums of money to CFNZ during lockdown. We continued to send out the twice yearly newsletter from Tim, and did an extra appeal at the beginning of lockdown, when people in Tim's area were starving. As a result we were able to send extra money, although it was a challenge at times, when there was little or no money in Zimbabwe Western Union offices.

The chicken project is doing well, we received photos by Watts App of the chicks growing and now laying. Of the 100 chickens 98 survived, and are laying well. Due to lockdown in Zimbabwe, Mercy who we employed to sew sanitary wear for the girls, had to go home, but is now back at work. A second woman, Hardness, is working with her, and they are sewing masks too. All other employees are back at work and busy.

The school children were unable to attend school through lockdown, but Tim was able to supply food to the most needy families, and was kept very busy. Fortunately there have been few deaths from Covid 19 in his area, but a lot of people are hungry, and some are dying due to lack of medicines. Tim helps wherever he can.

St. Michael's Primary School, Chatham planned to fundraise for a twinning project with Katate Primary school, once schools returned following the Covid 19 pandemic. This has of course been longer than anyone could have anticipated this time last year, and I am awaiting news from the head teacher at the school in Chatham.

St. Michael's Catholic Church in Chatham has not yet reopened, so there has been no annual collection from them, but I am in touch with Vincent Sexton, who organised the collection last year.

Also due to lockdown, the garden fence sponsored by Yate RC Church had not been erected, or seed purchased, at the Secondary school for the children to grow vegetables. Tim has now arranged for the materials to be purchased, so the fence should soon be erected. I wait for news.

We have been able to send all amounts due to Fr. Tim via Western Union (WU) and Moneygram, for collection every month in Zimbabwe.

Fundraising and Publicity April 2020- April 2021

Fundraising

Regular contact with a benefactor in Bristol resulted in a donation of £12,000. The twice yearly newsletter we send out from Fr. Tim helps maintain interest, and generous donations on a one off basis. Gift Aid claimed of £4243. Paypal through Facebook resulted in income of £190. One new donors set up Standing Orders, making a total of 13.

Proposed Fundraising for April 2021-April 2022

Fr. Tim plans to visit the UK in September/October for 3 weeks, and will visit churches and possibly schools while he is here. I will try to arrange for him to visit both Yate and Chatham schools once he finalises dates. He is not able to bring a second priest with him, due to travel restrictions. He has to isolate in a hotel in Dublin for 10 days before he can visit anyone in the UK. We will ensure Gift Aid is claimed.

Publicity

We will maintain contact with our regular donors as we send out Fr. Tim's newsletter twice a year, to over 200 people. The details of the website are included in the newsletter . The web site has been updated and is on Facebook.. A tri-fold publicity leaflet is on our website.

Internal communications

The Trustees held meetings: May and November 2020 by Skype, November 2019; and March 2021 by Skype. Our Annual General meeting was held on the 21st May 2020 by Skype.

We received three budgets from Fr. Tim requesting funds for 4 month periods, and were able to approve them all without alteration, as they came within the monies held and available. He requested extra funds, as detailed in his Annual Report, for various projects and feeding programmes.

Summary

Overall this has been a very successful seventh year, despite problems initially getting money to Zimbabwe during lockdown, with Fr. Tim being able to keep up with his projects in community development, for the poorest of families. The bequest of 2018, and extra donations from several benefactors, means we are still able to send Tim a larger monthly amount.


