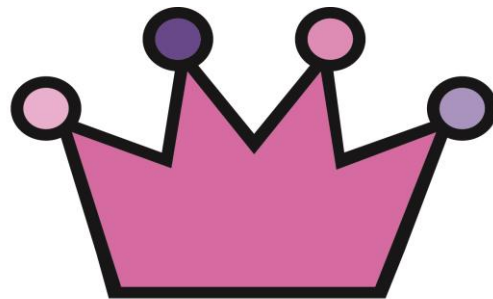

Annabelle's Challenge gained charity status on the 16th May 2014 and is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) governed by its constitution dated 11th March 2014 by a board of trustees.

The trustees delegate the day-to-day running of the charity to the founder & CEO Jared Griffin who in turn gains input from all trustees on major decision-making. Regular communication is maintained with all trustees.

The charity is managed by the trustee body and decisions carried with a majority vote. The trustees pay due regard to the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit in deciding what activities the charity should undertake.

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks. The charity is covered by £5,000,000 public liability and employers' liability insurance with Zurich.

Annabelle's Challenge Vascular EDS Charity



Annabelle's Challenge is the leading charity for vascular Ehlers-Danlos Syndrome (vascular EDS) in the UK.

At the heart of the charity is Annabelle Griffin, a brave 13-year-old girl from Bury who is the inspiration behind our challenge to raise awareness and support for patients and families touched by vascular EDS.

Annabelle's Challenge was founded in January 2013 by Jared and Sarah Griffin, proud parents of Annabelle who was diagnosed with vascular EDS (vEDS) in December 2012 aged three. The youngest to be diagnosed with vEDS in the UK at that time.

Vascular EDS is a life-threatening connective tissue disorder that affects all tissues, arteries and internal organs making them extremely fragile. Patients are at risk of sudden arterial or organ rupture. Vascular EDS (previously known as Ehlers-Danlos type IV) is a rare type of Ehlers-Danlos syndrome caused by an alteration, also known as a mutation in the *COL3A1* gene.

COL3A1 gene is the instruction for making collagen type III a tough fibre-like protein that makes up a third of our body protein. When this gene is altered, it causes a lack or deficiency of this collagen making the connective tissue less effective, particularly in skin, lung, uterus, intestine and the vascular system.

At present, the life span for affected individuals is a median age of about 51 years (49 for males and 53 for females) but with a very large range from 10 years to 80 years. The prevalence is estimated as 1/50,000 to 1/200,000. It is suggested 740 people in the UK have vascular EDS.

Our Objectives

EDUCATION

To advance the education of the general public and medical profession in all areas relating to vascular EDS.

RESEARCH

The relief of sickness and preservation and protection of good health by the provision of funding for the development of research and early diagnosis of vascular EDS.

SUPPORT

To promote and protect the physical and good mental health of sufferers of vascular EDS, their families, and carers through the provision of financial assistance, support, education, and practical advice.

Our Charity

Achievements and Performance

Most people who contact Annabelle's Challenge require information and support. We provide first-hand experience and advice to those who need emotional support especially with coping and adjusting to an uncertain future living with vascular EDS.

The charity works closely with the EDS National Diagnostic Service, a highly specialised service commissioned by NHS England and receives patient referrals to enable us to support individuals and families touched by vascular EDS. Membership is free and continues to grow and we now support over 360 members.

Our weekly e-newsletter had an open rate of 57.9%, we recognise that not all our members are on social media and will continue to use this resource to communicate with our subscribed members. Social media continues to grow with 5,831 Facebook, 2,712 Twitter and 1,396 Instagram followers.

As a small charity for a rare genetic disorder, we need to amplify our voice and continue to work with Genetic Alliance UK and Gene People. We work with Beacon and are also proud stakeholders in the VEDS Collaborative Group in the US.



The charity is an official partner with MedicAlert UK enabling us to offer free medic alert membership and discounts on medic alert jewellery exclusive to our vascular EDS members. We continue to raise awareness for research into vascular EDS and have a restricted fund and a designated fund available for future research projects.

In January 2022 we were delighted and honoured to receive a Community Champion Award from Ehlers-Danlos Support UK. The whole team were beyond excited when we were announced as a Community Champion.

Research

At Annabelle's Challenge, we are led by those affected by vascular Ehlers-Danlos Syndrome and work in partnership with the wider, global vEDS community.

With over 400 genetically confirmed patients registered on our database we are uniquely placed to facilitate research into this rare genetic condition.

What we've done so far:

- We have funded the creation of one of the largest vEDS research databases in the world.
- Worked closely with the NHS EDS National Diagnostic Service.
- We launched vEDS regional support groups and a vEDS steering group.
- We hosted the world's first ever conference for vEDS patients and clinicians.
- Proud stakeholders in the vEDS Collaborative Group.

We're here to give hope for the future by funding research, save lives and help people to live well with vEDS.



VEDS Support Programme

Our VEDS Support Programme is available to all our members touched by vascular EDS and offers advocacy, emotional and practical support. From the moment someone joins Annabelle's Challenge they will have free access to all our resources and advice:

VEDS Steering Group

The VEDS Steering Group will help to shape the future of the charity as it continues to grow providing support, guidance and overseeing the progress of all community-based projects including events and research in the UK.

The VEDS Steering Group is made up of volunteers who are directly touched by vEDS including patients, parents and carers, they are supported by genetic counsellors from the EDS National Diagnostic Service with representation from both clinics based in Sheffield and London.

Steering group aims:

- Provide input based on their direct experience of vEDS.
- Give strategic direction.
- Support the charity.
- Enable more people diagnosed with vEDS to fulfil their potential by working to address issues at the earliest possible stage through the VEDS Support Programme.

The steering group usually meets at key stages during the course of a project and influences strategic decisions including reviewing and advising on vEDS research proposals.

VEDS Regional UK Support Groups



Our regional support groups across the UK are for those who are touched by vascular EDS and all family members are welcome to attend.

The groups are managed by our volunteer regional coordinators creating a safe, relaxed environment where people can share experiences, advice and provide peer support creating life-long friendships with others.

Our patient coordinator, Christina Cooper works closely with the volunteer area coordinators to help plan suitable venues and logistics.





Queen's Award for Voluntary Service



Annabelle's Challenge are proud recipients of **The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service**. The unique UK national honour was created by Her Majesty to mark the Golden Jubilee in 2002 and to recognise the outstanding contributions made to local communities by groups of volunteers.

The award is equivalent to the MBE and is the highest award that can be made to a voluntary group.

Our founders Jared and Sarah received an invitation to attend a Buckingham Palace garden party hosted by Her Majesty The Queen and members of the royal family.

Jared "We are so proud to receive the Queen's Award on behalf of all our volunteers who support the important work we do for patients and families touched by vascular EDS, receiving this award is a real morale booster recognising the work of the volunteers."

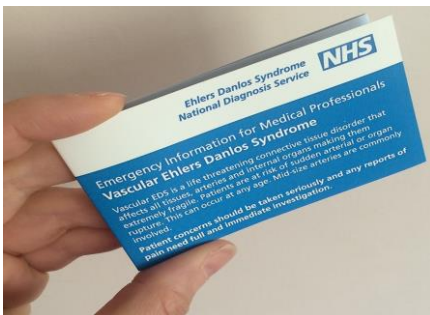
Annabelle's Challenge is among 27 other volunteer groups in the county to receive the award with 250 nationally announced on 2nd June 2018.





We are proud to work closely with the Ehlers-Danlos Syndrome National Diagnostic Service, a highly specialised service commissioned by NHS England for individuals and families who are suspected to have complex Ehlers-Danlos Syndrome (EDS).

Established in 2009 the service runs two specialist clinics for patients at Sheffield Northern General Hospital and the Northwick Park & St Mark's Hospitals in London.



The aims of the service

- Correctly investigate and diagnose cases of suspected rare EDS types. DNA analysis mainly currently in Sheffield lab.
- Develop guidelines and pathways of care for the different subtypes of EDS.
- Provide information about EDS for patients and their carers.
- Research regarding rare types of EDS.

They provide an excellent diagnostic service for adults and children with suspected complex EDS and strive to incorporate new diagnostic techniques and developments in their practice.

Referrals are accepted from NHS Consultants in Secondary or Tertiary care for both adults and children.

- The service sees patients who are suspected of having a diagnosis of classical, vascular or a rare type of EDS. The service will also see patients with a known diagnosis of classical, vascular or a rare type of EDS.
- Patients with hypermobile EDS or Hypermobility Spectrum Disorder are not seen in this clinic.
- The clinic does not offer management for hypermobility.

Financial Review

The accounts for the year ending 31st March 2022 shows a surplus of £101,544 and total funds carried forward of £171,633. We need to ensure our reserve policy is sustainable and provide the required funds so we can deliver a conference in May 2022 (postponed from May 2020 due to the pandemic), provide support for patients and families, and increase designated funds for future research into vascular EDS.

The fundraising by our members and supporters has gone extremely well post-pandemic with a total voluntary income of £93,531 (up £55,047 on the previous year), we are grateful to all our volunteers, members, and fundraisers for supporting the charity.

In August 2021 we were awarded £177,415 in National Lottery funding to support our work for the vEDS community in England.

We are now in a strong position to fund vital research into vascular EDS with £50,000 designated in reserves and continue to deliver our support programmes.

Reserves Policy

The trustees have reviewed the reserves of the charity. Our aim is to maintain reserves in unrestricted funds at a level of £18,000 to cover operational, support costs and unforeseen expenditure over at least a 6-month period.

Safeguarding Policy

We have reviewed and improved our safeguarding policy and undergone safeguarding training. This policy applies to anyone working on behalf of Annabelle's Challenge including senior managers, board of trustees, paid staff, volunteers and students.

- to protect children and young people who receive support from Annabelle's Challenge. This includes the children of adults who use our services.
- to provide parents, staff and volunteers with the overarching principles that guide our approach to child protection and safeguarding for children and adults.

Privacy Policy

We take privacy very seriously. For that reason, we have set out a privacy policy, so patients and families can make sure they understand how and why we use the information they give us. The charity is also registered with the Information Commissioners Office (ICO) number ZA450659.



Equality & Diversity Policy



Annabelle's Challenge is an equal opportunity charity taking into account the diversity within our community, staff, members and volunteers.

Fundraising Promise

This promise outlines the commitment made to our donors and the public when fundraising and we are registered with the Fundraising Regulator. We agree to ensure our fundraising is legal, open, honest and respectful. The standards for fundraising are set out in the Code of Fundraising Practice.



National Lottery Funding

In August 2021 we were awarded £177,415 in National Lottery funding to support our work with individuals living with vascular EDS. The charity will use the funds to deliver the VEDS Support Programme across England over the next 3 years.

The new funding from The National Lottery Community Fund, which distributes money raised by National Lottery players for good causes and is the largest funder of community activity in the UK, will see the charity reach and connect further individuals and families across the vEDS community. It aims to develop confidence and capacity for self-help, build relationships, reduce risk to health, save lives and improve quality of life.

At the same time, the charity will be able to expand its holistic support and increased collaboration with health and educational professionals.

Jared Griffin, founder of Annabelle's Challenge, says: "We're delighted that The National Lottery Community Fund has recognised our work in this way. This is a massive boost for Annabelle's Challenge and the vEDS community we serve. It gives us the security and confidence to deploy our VEDS Support Programme, thanks to National Lottery players."

Securing this National Lottery funding also has the benefit that all future fundraising events carried out by our members and supporters can potentially go directly towards vEDS research.

Jared "We welcomed the Mayor of Bury, Councillor Tim Pickstone to the office. The visit included a cheque presentation and the opportunity to meet with some of the volunteers to learn more about the work we do and spoke about being recipients of The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service."





Fundraising Highlights

Our fundraisers, volunteers and supporters have been working tirelessly to help raise awareness of vascular EDS and vital funds for Annabelle's Challenge. Total income for this year was £165,971 an increase of £104,043 on the previous year.

I had to leave him there as the heat was too intense to hang around in if you didn't have the shade of the medical tent. That was the lowest point for me. I was up throughout night 3 with sickness meaning I had to start (and somehow finish) the 51 mile stage without eating for over 24 hours and having had only 5 hours sleep in previous 72 hours. We learned a lot about how strong the body and mind can be!

Mia – Mums on a mission

Throughout the month of November, Bonnie and Charlotte along with colleagues across MUFG Bank hosted a number of awareness campaigns and fundraisers including a REDS4VEDS day and RUN FOR VEDS.

"My beautiful daughter Mia (age 7) was diagnosed with Vascular Ehlers Danlos Syndrome in August 2021.

Mia was born 5 weeks premature and first started showing symptoms of VEDS at only 5 months old which have progressed as she has grown; including but not limited to significant bruising, severe fatigue, blood in stools, heavy nose bleeds, vein rupture and bleeding, hyper-mobility, body aches and pains.

Since Mia's diagnosis MumsOnAMission has raised over £15k for Annabelle's Challenge to continue VEDS research. The experience is so unique and inspiring when we all come together to encourage each other's efforts and immerse ourselves in a world of possibility, knowing that what we have set out to achieve is something bigger than ourselves

I am very passionate about raising awareness so that both the public and professionals know more about this condition. Whilst living in the unknown, self-doubt can be brutally difficult, knowing that something is definitely wrong with your child but having people not understand the seriousness of the condition, nor providing a diagnosis.

Therefore an important part of the mission is to prevent and protect families/children affected by VEDS from adversity and challenges they may face on their own journey so that they too can be more resilient. I am a MumOnAMission, and I will never give up for Mia and for everyone affected by this cruel condition.

Mums...always trust your instincts."



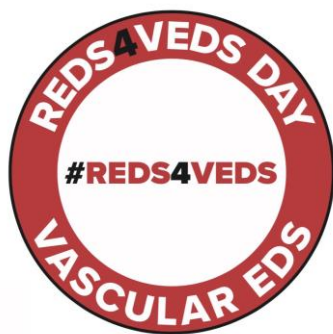


REDS4VEDS

Plans for Future Period

We are proud that Annabelle's Challenge and Ehlers-Danlos Support UK will be jointly hosting the next vascular EDS Conference, unfortunately due to COVID-19 it has been postponed until May 2022.

A designated fund of £50,000 for future research projects has been generated from funds raised by the vEDS community. We also plan to invest in future training & development for our staff and volunteers.



We are looking to engage with pharmaceutical companies to hopefully launch vEDS clinical trials soon.

The charity is also working towards re-launching retreat weekends for those affected by vEDS across the UK and increase availability of support groups.

Thanks to National Lottery funding we will be recruiting two additional staff members from Quarter 2, 2022 to help increase the level of support and resources for the vEDS community.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF ANNABELLE'S CHALLENGE
