Structure governance and management

Type of governing document: Trust Deed

The governing document is a Trust Deed. LIN is a non profit charity, founded in May 2013, and became a registered charity 19th May 2014. The Trust Deed was signed in April 2014.

How the charity is constituted:

LIN is a non profit organisation/charity trust. There must be at least 3 trustees. The first trustees shall hold office for 5 years respectively. The Trustees give their time voluntarily and receive no benefits from the charity.

Trustee Selection Method:

The trustees hold at least 2 ordinary meetings each year. At least one such meeting involves the physical presence of the trustees holding office. At said meetings, a vote will be taken from each trustee with regards to appointing another eligible trustee.

Eligibility for a trustee: No one shall be appointed as a trustee if he or she is under the age of 18 years old, or if he or she would at once be disqualified from office under the provisions of clause 11 of the trust deed.

Objectives and activities

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

Labradors In Need and its members are non-political, non sectarian and non-racial.

The objects of Labradors In Need shall be to promote humane behaviour towards Labradors by providing appropriate care, protection, treatment and security for those which are in need of care and attention by reasons of sickness, maltreatment, poor circumstances or ill usage and to educate the public in matters pertaining to animal welfare in general and the prevention of cruelty and suffering to animals.

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit

LIN established and maintained rescue/foster homes for the care, treatment and re-homing, of unwanted, homeless, stray, ill-treated, injured and sick dogs and provided a permanent home for life for all those that could not be re-homed. Long term foster homes have been established in these cases.

The trustees ensured that no mentally and physically healthy dog taken into the protection of the rescue/foster homes were destroyed.

Supporting and actively proposing the control of the national dog population by advocating neutering dogs whenever practicable or desirable to do so, and to make funds available whenever possible to provide financial assistance to members of the public for this purpose.

Maintaining a continuous campaign via the internet and other methods to educate members of the general public to have a responsible attitude towards dogs and their welfare. For this purpose, pamphlets, posters, social media groups and websites have been printed and published and distributed as necessary.

To aid persons of limited means in so far as their dog's welfare is concerned.

To maintain special funds for any of the above objects and aims.

Raise funds, to borrow money and to give security for loans (but only in accordance with the restrictions imposed by the Charities Act 1993)

To co-operate with and to establish working arrangements with any kindred associations or organisations.

To care in exceptional circumstances for other breeds, animals or birds until alternative provision for their care can be made.

Conduct research into, and gathered information relating to matters affecting dogs and dog behaviour.

Achievements and performance

Since founding LIN, the charity has successfully re-homed 905 Labradors and Labrador Cross Breeds (at the end of May 2022), into family homes. This number includes the long term family foster homes, for dogs that cannot be re-homed due to age or ill health. One such example, we were asked to take in a 6/7yr old black female Labrador stray. Annie went into emergency foster with one of our experienced foster ladies, and shortly after arriving, it was found that Annie was suffering with diabetes and nearly lost her life. After many vet visits, Annie is now thriving and her emergency foster carer fell in love and decided to become her long term foster carer. All in all, we currently have 12 long term foster dogs of various ages, with various health conditions needing ongoing vet care.

Covid-19 continued to have a significant impact on the running of the rescue, including the rehoming of dogs, carrying out home checks, dog assessments etc. Once lockdown was again eased somewhat, each dog needing to come into rescue continued to be assessed on a case by case basis, with self-assessment forms being used in the first instance, and face to face assessments carried out in an outside area, adhering to safe distancing and using longline dog leads. We also had to take into consideration travel restrictions and ensure any dog being rehomed was taken to a home within these boundaries. Thankfully lockdown restrictions eased enough for us to operate the rescue on a more normal basis and homechecks, dog assessments and the rehoming of dogs started to increase. We are currently experiencing a larger than normal amount of "teenage" dogs needing to be rehomed now that lockdown restrictions are over and people start to return to normal working patterns and family life situations.

Continuous raising of funds through internet campaigns, social media groups, for on-going vet bills including vaccinations, neuter, spaying, micro chipping, flea & worm treatment, the unexpected larger vet bills that often occur, and the continuous health checks or medication for Long Term Foster Dogs. During the Covid-19 lockdown period, our fundraising team again managed to create various events using social media, Zoom, Skype and Teams to raise these much needed funds. Spreading the word of the charity was also done using these methods. The fundraising team also managed to attend 2 family dog show events when Covid-19 restrictions were eased.

Working with other registered animal charities, and together successfully managed to re home a number of dogs together. Again we are proud to have managed to re home quite a few more bonded pairs, of Labrador and non-Labrador breeds, ensuring they were kept together, and living out their twilight years as a family.

Again, we increased the number of volunteers through successful advertising and campaigning via the internet and other social media methods. Early lockdown meant that more people were able to offer their services via social media, internet, online meeting platforms etc. Labradors In Need successfully expanded its volunteer base during the year, and has become an established, well known charity, which has enabled us to help re home a larger amount of dogs. Due to this expansion, it was agreed at LIN's AGM that we needed to address the number of Admin members and Coordinators, and also due to the increase of the amount of volunteers in the Rehoming Team, we again reshuffled and created more location area rehoming teams which made it easier to manage and control dogs coming into each area. The rehoming team has since increased in numbers again, and the volunteers involved are proving to be an invaluable service to the rescue.

The fundraising volunteers are again proving to be an extremely well managed team, and are always looking at different ways in which we can actively fundraise, and how to gather more help with future fundraising. We forecast that we will possibly lose a small number of volunteers as things get back to normal and people return to their working lives. We will tackle each situation as it arises.

Research & training undertaken into the welfare, wellbeing and behaviour of dogs. Including agility training and canine first aid. We continue to have 2 qualified dog trainer/behaviourist volunteers who have already proven themselves by providing excellent advice and guidance to our foster and adoptive families. Both volunteers are on hand to help and advise with any issues that arise such as anxiety or behavioural problems.




