The Trustees present their annual report together with the financial statements of the Redeemed Christian Church of God, Christ for Life (the charity) for the year ended 31 December 2024. The Trustees confirm that the annual report and financial statement of the charity comply with the current statutory requirement, the requirement of the charity's governing document and the provisions of the Statement of the Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued 16 July 2014.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

A. CONSTITUTION

The Church is constituted under a Trust Deed dated 17 March 2014

B. METHOD OF APPOINTMENT OR ELECTION OF TRUSTEES

The management of the Charity is the responsibility of the Trustees who are appointed and co-opted under the Trust deed.

C. POLICIES ADOPTED FOR THE INDUCTION AND TRAINING OF TRUSTEES

FINANCIAL REVIEW

A. RESERVE POLICY

The church continue to experience a significant growth in 2024 financial year and members continue to generous. The church is reporting a surplus for the year of **£40,087 which is a decrease from 2023 position (due to on-going project work)** and net assets of £155,631.

The Trustees have established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets ("the free reserves") held by the church should be 3 months of annual expenditure. At this level, the trustees feel that they would be able to continue the current activities of the church in the event of a significant drop in funding.

B. PRINCIPAL FUNDING

This is provided mainly through voluntary tithes and offerings by the church members.

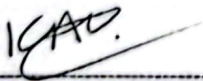

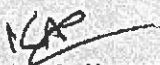

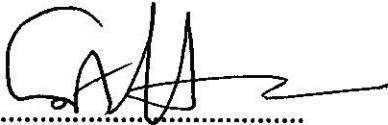
