1. Welcome and Introduction

Carolyn Wheatley (CW) hosted the AGM. She welcomed everyone and thanked them for attending.

2. Approval of Minutes of the last AGM held on 8 November 2025

Minutes agreed and signed.

3. Treasurer's Report

The financial performance of PINNT CIO for the year demonstrates a positive outcome, with a net surplus of £5,517.01 after all expenses.

Income for the year totalled £24,325.15, driven mainly by:

Donations and Gift Aid: £12,049.83 combined
Corporate Donations: £6,200.00
Interest Income: £2,368.75
Study Days: £4,156.57

Expenditure amounted to £18,808.14, covering a range of administrative and operational costs. The most significant areas of spending included:

Advertising & Marketing: £5,469.50
Postage, Freight & Courier: £2,596.25
Audit & Accountancy Fees: £2,412.50
Printing & Stationery: £1,929.15
Travel (National): £1,493.79

Other costs such as admin work, general expenses, and communication were maintained at reasonable levels, supporting efficient operations throughout the year.

The organisation continues to maintain a healthy and sustainable financial position, enabling PINNT CIO to support its objectives effectively while managing expenditure carefully with appropriate reserves.

4. Chair's Report

PINNT was delighted to be part of the inaugural 1F event in Manchester on 1st February 2025. It is a new campaign organised by a European group who are seeking to campaign to make intestinal failure visit across countries and professions. A campaign will run again next year – the theme and activities have yet to be announced. It was a day where PINNT met others with IF, spoke to people keen to find out more and together with our fellow partners who raised awareness on many levels.

Delighted that our Travel and Holiday Guidelines have been updated and are now available to members.

HAN Week 2025 ran in August.

In response to member feedback, we used the week to also include activities relating to HAN waste, necessary and unnecessary. We saw crafting, repurposing and recycling ideas.

The data gathered from the survey we did in 2024 was published (on the left-hand side), we produced a short information video too which was widely viewed and have started conversations that we hope to continue.

On the right-hand side, we share the report also published in association with BAPEN relating to the experiences of those living with an enteral feeding tube. This report has once again generated a lot of interest and will be used to influence how enteral homecare could be shaped as we look at what the plan for the new NHS looks like.

Both reports have been shared on our social platforms, if you would like copies, please let us know.

During HAN Week we launched a report in collaboration with Level Playing Field to give guidance to sports groups and venues in terms of enabling people on HAN to feel part of normal events by offering a contact point, a safe place to use should they so wish and have a contact in case of event where they need support or advice. People want to be part of normal life despite having to feed.

The 3rd edition of Online showcased all the activities for HAN week as usual.

The Tracy Hill Patient Champion Award 2025 saw the addition of one-off award for those making a difference for those on HAN in relation to the impact of HAN waste and sustainability.

Mary Williamson is the recipient of the main award; this will be presented in the coming weeks.

Certificates of Recognition will be presented next week along with others being presented on a one-to-one basis.

We are pleased that the Zoom meetings are going well. They have generated support, information sharing and a genuine community for those on HAN. Some local Zoom meetings have been arranged to bring contact with people closer to home and PINNT continue to look to setup Zoom drop ins where people feel they need support related to their own locality/policies.

Our PINNT Partners are an important part of our network. PINNT advocates for members and the wider HAN community by engaging with national and professional organisations, decision and policy makers as well as product designers and manufactures including service providers. Far too

often what people think people on HAN need or want, is not necessarily the case. Where we can contribute to a better experience for those living with HAN we will.

2. Approval of Minutes of the last AGM held on 13 January 2024

Minutes of the AGM held on 13 January 2024 were agreed and signed.

3. Treasurer's Report

Donations were £18,296.10. Corporate donations were at £12,550

Expenses remain very low at £20,552. Overall profit of £11,050.76. The charity was carrying around £140K of cash at year end.

4. Chair's Report

Pleased to report that our awareness week in August 2024 was a success.

We launched a survey to investigate aspect of the waste, both clinical and non-clinical generated from homecare, thanks to Emily Walters from BAPEN for her support. We had 443 responses, and the results are being analysed. There is a lot to process; thanks to those who responded. We will share initial findings as soon as we can.

We introduced a new Talking Points 4 booklet: this can be found on the website and copies can be requested.

In addition to this we updated 2 other resources: our VNT guidance and Transition for young people with intestinal failure. Thanks to the members of our Virtual Nutrition Team and Angela Cole for all this work and commitment to our booklets.

We also shared the information we supported with the British Pharmaceutical Nutrition Group relating to Medicines and enteral tubes.

We also appointed our first Charity Ambassador, David Bolton who hopes to raise awareness about PINNT and HAN.

During Awareness week we shared different stories as each day had a theme, we also had patient stories, the reality of life on HAN.

We also produced a video showing how our PINNT Medical Tag can be used with an inclusive approach to living with artificial nutrition. Thanks to Warrington Wolves for their support. Most people want to be part of life, no special treatment but lots of understanding and accommodating people's needs as much as possible. Thanks to Adam and Mary for starring in the video and special thank to Moira Kallis for continuing to be a valuable member of TeamTAG.

Special thanks to Calea, Eitan Medical and Inspiration Healthcare for supporting the production of the video. PINNT had full editorial control and we will be sharing this video again during 2024.

The 2nd Tracy Hill Patient Champion Awards were presented in August 2023. More difficult decisions for the adjudication panel. We are delighted that Tracy's daughter Lisa is part of this process. Again, one winner wasn't enough! 2 awards were presented:

- Mia Small, Nurse Consultant Nutrition and Intestinal Rehabilitation, St Mark's at Central Middlesex Hospital.
- Mrs Cruise, Head teach, St Pius 10th Catholic Primary School, Consent, Co Durham.

In addition, the panel awarded 5 Certificates of Recognition:

Sarah Bailey, Moira Kallis, Phil Roberts, Lorna Leaston and Ezekiel Martin.

Being a patient champion comes in many different guises – PINNT invites nominations from a wide range of people and places that champion an individual or group of patient's needs. Nominations will open earlier this year, so look out for the announcement!

Our PINNT Partners are an important part of our network. PINNT advocates for members and the wider HAN community by engaging with national and professional organisations, decision, and policy makers as well as product designers and manufactures including service providers. Far too often what people think people on HAN need or want, is not necessarily the case. Where we can contribute to a better experience for those living with HAN we will.

Together with BAPEN we have reworked the Quality Standards resources launched by PINNT back in 2013 as part of awareness week. There are 2 resources available, both can be found on the website.

Also, as part of our role within BAPEN as a core group, I am pleased to announce that there is now a Special Interest Group, the Patient Network Group (PNG) and I am going to chair this. The remit and updates will be shared via the newsletter.

Our LITRE committee – Looking into the Requirements for Equipment (and Services) has been busy during 2023. The users experience is so important, LITRE's remote is growing all the time:

- PN pump technology consultation.
- Impact of being nil by mouth on enteral tube feeding.
- Impact for carers of a loved one being nil by mouth on enteral tube feeding.
- 2022/23 PN pump user assessment reviews.
- Advising on patient information leaflets for professional groups.

PINNT has always supported blended diets and supported the initial work done by The Association of UK Dietitians (BDA) Paediatric and Parenteral and Enteral Nutrition Specialist Groups, to develop a position paper. This led to the launch of their Practice Toolkit: The Use of Bended Diet With Enteral Feeding Tubes in November 2022. BDs are thankfully well recognised, and we will be ensuring it's a conversation we include on our agenda. As we say during Awareness week – every feeding story matters!!!!

PINNT resources continue to be popular. Travelling is often something many people want to do. As I always say 'it's not the distance you travel but the journey you take' – we encourage people to have a trip or holiday in the way that works best for them. Our materials will be reviewed and update during 2024, and a new travel check list is being considered!

Our trio of Transition booklets are being reviewed by Angela Cole and we hope to complete this during 2024.

As part of our network, our groups are slowly coming back and growing.

Talking about travelling, we have been campaigning to find a solution to the law now since we left the European Union as it changes the transportation of medical feeds. There is a 2kg limited. Together with a stakeholder group we have been making wide representation to not only find a viable solution for people leaving the UK but for those who wish to visit the UK. 4. Treasurer's Report

Donations are higher this year and include, £10k from Calea, £15k Takeda, Anthony Collins £3.5k and Baxter £2k. Some donations are linked to projects as with Baxter. Takeda and Calea supported the refresh of the website, which will continue in 2022/23 together with supporting the position of our admin support.

Expenses remain very low at £24k. Overall profit of £33k. The charity was carrying around £110k of cash at year end.

All donations are gratefully received, the addition of extra donations via Amazon Smile really make a difference to PINNT as well as the individual sponsored events, so thank you very much.

The charity is exceptionally well positioned to incur harder years including loss making as we go through turbulent years ahead with a recession likely and now, we are currently at a loss in 2022 of £4.3k.

PINNT reviews its expenditure at regular intervals in line with practicalities and sustainable factors to maintain the charity.

The trustees are very happy with the financial position of the charity.

5. Chair's Report

I am starting my report with positive note, I am pleased to report that our face-to-face meetings have started again. We have also supported some patient/carers events that will become PINNT groups in time.

Our executive committee (EC) met face-to-face in August again, it was great to see each other. We will balance face-to-face meetings with virtual ones as we can be as productive meeting virtually.

In August we had a successful Home Artificial Nutrition awareness week. Great personal stories were shared, many **#thisime #thisisus** posters gave insight into the lives of so many people on HAN. What stood out to PINNT was the many amazing people who are doing their utmost to adjust and live with their feeding and conditions.

During awareness week we named the winners of The Tracy Hill Patient Champion awards. Established in honour of our much love friend and colleague Tracy Hill who we sadly lost earlier this year. The intended one winner, developed into two along with two Certificates of Recognition. Congratulations to Kimberly Pett, Carolyn Wheatley – award winners and Angela Cole and Martine Hartley as Certificate of Recognitions winners. This will be an annual award and we thanks Tracy's family for their support during this process.

Our website has had a small makeover and will be continuing this for the next 12 months.

PINNT continues to have an active role in advocating for people on HPN, the current landscape is still rocky due to capacity and staffing issues as the virus still impacts supplies and services. There is also engagement on the impact on home enteral tube feeding patients, in terms of supplies and products too. Further work with BAPEN will be coming in the months ahead.

Our advocacy role has allowed us to represent enteral feeding people who face the changes to what feeds they can legally take to Europe when travelling following our departure from the EU. It's slow but we have given feedback there may be further communication at some point soon.

Our virtual nutrition team launched guidance on 'Swimming and other recreational water-based activities with an intravenous catheter or an enteral feeding tube' this year. As a clinical team they were able to offer guidance to ensure that anyone wishing to take part should consider the pros and cons and have a conversation with their clinical team to determine what is best for them.

Our LITRE committee (Looking into the Requirements for Equipment) completed a User Assessment of a new ambulatory PN pump, the report is on the website. LITRE will be meeting tomorrow to carry out another User Assessment on another ambulatory PN pump. This panel provide a vital role as the voice of the users is vital when equipment is being considered for use in the home. Thanks to LITRE for their continued support to our programme of activities.

Thanks to our volunteers who send out the birthday cards. I would like to thank our trustees and EC members for another year of voluntary work for PINNT.

We engaged a new admin support role this year and I am delighted to say that Rachel has fitted into PINNT and will be developing her role within PINNT to support the EC.


