The facility informed us that they were in receipt of maintenance funds from the government and would be able to maintain the facility after we were finished with the project to ensure sustainability.

The project started in March 2022 and continued through the year.

We hired a reputable local company who provided us with weekly to fortnightly updates on the projects.






All events and activities carried out this year were in association with our constitution and the guidance issued by the charities commission.

No fundraising events were carried out this year.

Following our restructure in 2018, we contacted a variety of hospitals in Nigeria to help start work on developing guidelines till November 2018. In November 2018, we made contact with a primary healthcare center in Kuje, Abuja, Nigeria. They were very receptive and we proceeded to begin groundwork. Meetings were held with key players in the Federal Ministry of Health (FMOH) in Nigeria in the non communicable diseases sector to help tailor our guidelines to local and national needs.

We completed our pilot project at Kuje Primary Healthcare Center in March, 2020. Two members of the team visited the primary health center and provided training on the hypertension guideline.

We also obtained ethical approval and carried out survey of both staff and patients to understand the needs of the community and lay groundwork for our future work to improve access to primary health care within Kuje.

We met with the FMOH in Abuja, Nigeria regarding rolling out the hypertension project within Nigeria.


We attempted registration of the Charity within Nigeria to allow ease of work for future projects- however, due to the COVID pandemic, we were unable to complete this registration.

Work was halted for the latter half of 2020 due to the COVID pandemic.




All events and activities carried out this year were in association with our constitution and the guidance issued by the charities commission.

Following our restructure in 2018, we contacted a variety of hospitals in Nigeria to help start work on developing guidelines till November 2018. In November 2018, we made contact with a primary healthcare center in Kuje, Abuja, Nigeria. They were very receptive and we proceeded to begin groundwork. Meetings were held with key players in the Federal Ministry of Health (FMOH) in Nigeria in the non communicable diseases sector to help tailor our guidelines to local and national needs.

We completed our pilot project at Kuje Primary Healthcare Center in March, 2020. Two members of the team visited the primary health center and provided training on the hypertension guideline.

We also obtained ethical approval and carried out survey of both staff and patients to understand the needs of the community and lay groundwork for our future work to improve access to primary health care within Kuje.

We met with the FMOH in Abuja, Nigeria regarding rolling out the hypertension project within Nigeria.


We attempted registration of the Charity within Nigeria to allow ease of work for future projects- however, due to the COVID pandemic, we were unable to complete this registration.


