**Annual Report for the year ending 31<sup>st</sup> March 2025**

The Wendover Community Library Trust (“WCLT”) is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation approved for registration as a charity by the Charity Commission on 8<sup>th</sup> July 2014. The Objects of WCLT in its Constitution (dated 26<sup>th</sup> November 2013) are:

“In partnership with the Buckinghamshire County Library Service, to manage the operation of the Wendover Community Library and to increase the use of the library building for a wider range of educational, community and commercial activities and events for the benefit of the residents of Wendover and the surrounding areas.” The WCLT works alongside the Buckinghamshire County Library Service in the day to day running of the Wendover Community Library. Buckinghamshire County Library Service provides essential paid professional staff, who work alongside community volunteers, and have important management responsibilities. We have a ‘Group Manager’ and two part-time ‘Library Assistants who work alongside our volunteer staff. This sharing of responsibilities between public service employees and community volunteers is an important part of our purpose.

Trustees are selected for appointment according to their skills, knowledge and experience relevant to the requirements for the effective administration of WCLT. Meetings of the trustees are held on a regular basis to review matters such as the library facilities and activities, services, volunteers, fund raising and the relationship with

Buckinghamshire County Library Service. Nominated trustees additionally attend meetings of the Executive Committee, which consists of an equal representation of trustees and executives of Buckinghamshire Council.

### **Policies Adopted by the WCL Trustees.**

Since our last report all the policies adopted by the Trustees remain in place.

### **Summary of Activities.**

During this year, our annual calendar, created through the annual photograph competition, was again very well received. It is a wonderful reflection of Wendover and the surrounding countryside. The magazine Shelf Life, usually produced every two months, gives regular accounts of the activities that take place in the library. It also provides articles that cover the purpose and ideas behind the Community Library's place in the Wendover community.

The much enhanced, 'Wendover On Screen' has continued throughout this year. 'On Screen' continues to show films targeted at particular age groups, and also to show more than the previous 'one film per month'. It is important to add that there is no charge to see these films. Those seeing the films can make a voluntary contribution to the cost if they wish.

### **The Extension of the Community Library.**

As noted in last year's report; after the successful application for funding support from the Libraries Improvement Fund, we have been able to put forward plans to make significant improvements to the Community Library and to the range of services that will be offered from the building. The extension will provide space to increase the range of community based activities that will be provided. A new children's area, larger than the existing area, will enable a wider range of children's activities, the computers available to library customers will be more flexible in how they can be used. The local tourist information area will be enhanced, the upstairs section of the library will have better access, but above all the provision of new furniture and the redecoration of the whole library will

enhance the ambience of the library and increase its attractiveness to all age groups in the community. It is also anticipated that the planned changes to the library's windows will improve the light inside the Library, and enhance considerably the functionality of our Library.

We are now able to confirm, (because this report is being written in August 2025), that after all the plans were agreed and confirmed, and contracts for the work were issued, the library closed in September 2024 for construction work to begin. This work was overseen by Buckinghamshire County Council, and after the work's successful completion, our Library reopened during April 2025. During this unavoidable period of closure we were grateful to the Wendover Parish Council, who allowed us to use their offices to operate 'a borrow and return service' of library books. Since the reopening of the Community Library, we have only received positive comments from members of our local community. I very much look forward to completing next year's report, (2025-2026) and being able to comprehensively report on Wendover's 'new' Community Library. Perhaps we will be able to include a number of photographs?

In conclusion, it is important to add that Trustees continue to be pleased that so many members of the local community continue to support their local library.

"In partnership with the Buckinghamshire County Library Service, to manage the operation of the Wendover Community Library and to increase the use of the library building for a wider range of educational, community and commercial activities and events for the benefit of the residents of Wendover and the surrounding areas." The WCLT works alongside the Buckinghamshire County Library Service in the day to day running of the Wendover Community Library. Buckinghamshire County Library Service provides essential paid professional staff, who work alongside community volunteers, and have important management responsibilities. The 'Group Manager', who shares her responsibilities between Wendover and Princess Risborough libraries, also manages the 'Home Library Service. Two, part time Assistant Librarians are also employed at Wendover Community Library. This sharing of responsibilities between public service employees and community volunteers is an important part of our purpose. Trustees are selected for appointment according to their skills, knowledge and experience relevant to the requirements for the effective administration of WCLT. Meetings of the trustees are held on a regular

basis to review matters such as the library facilities and activities, services, volunteers, fund raising and the relationship with Buckinghamshire County Library Service. Nominated trustees additionally attend meetings of the Executive Committee, which consists of an equal representation of trustees and executives of Buckinghamshire Council.

### **Policies Adopted by the WCL Trustees.**

Since our last report all the policies adopted by the Trustees remain in place.



### **The Planned Extension of the Community Library.**

As noted would be the case in last year's report, a lot of time this year was devoted to planning the extension to the Community Library that will be provided through the successful application to the Libraries' Improvement Fund. We have had to make adjustments to the plans in order to reduce costs, that have risen because of inflation, but we are still able to make significant improvements to the Community Library and to the range of services that will be offered from the building. The extension will still provide space to increase the range of community based activities that will be provided. A new children's area, larger than

the existing area, will still enable a wider range of children's activities, the computers available to library customers will be more flexible in how they can be used. The local tourist information area will be enhanced, the upstairs section of the library will have better access, but above all the provision of new furniture and the redecoration of the whole library will enhance the ambience of the library and increase its attractiveness to all age groups in the community. In next year's report we will be able to give complete details of these improvements. The funds have been awarded through the Libraries Improvement Fund, managed by the Arts Council, and they have to be spent on the agreed plans by the end of the financial year. That is by the end of March 2025.



Trustees are selected for appointment according to their skills, knowledge and experience relevant to the requirements for the effective administration of WCLT. Meetings of the trustees are held on a regular basis to review matters such as the library facilities and activities, services, volunteers, fund raising and the relationship with Buckinghamshire Council. Nominated trustees additionally attend meetings of the Executive Committee, which consists of an equal representation of trustees and executives of Buckinghamshire Council.

### **Policies Adopted by the WCL Trustees.**

Since our last report all the policies adopted by the Trustees remain in place.

This year's report is inevitably dominated by the restrictions that had to be put in place because of the Covid 19 pandemic. The Community Library itself had to be closed for a time, and when it could be opened it was under very specific conditions. A one-way system had to be in place and library users could only use the service to take out and return books. The computers, for example were not available. Returned books had to be 'quarantined' for a number of hours before they could go back on the shelves.

The Meeting rooms were not available for use by local groups, and fund raising activities were not possible.

During this financial year, April 2020 to March 2021, the Trustees were not able to meet formally.


One activity that did continue was that the gardens were well looked after by members of the local Women's Institute. Our thanks are due to the organisation and to the people involved.

#### **A Planned Extension of the Community Library.**

The process of putting together an application for funding to support this project continues, but during this year was much slowed down.

To conclude the following quotation from last year's report seems fitting. 'As we reached the end of this financial year we were increasingly aware that the Covid 19 Pandemic had reached the UK and that, whilst the main concerns were for public health, it was clearly going to affect various local community initiatives. This will no doubt be a major feature of next year's report.'

In conclusion, it is important to add that Trustees were just so grateful to the many members of the community who supported their local library, during a year which was not the easiest.


