



Unfortunately in March 2020 we went into covid lockdown and were unable to continue with other planned events.

The awards made this year were:

£100 to a young person and his mother so they could visit family members over Christmas that had moved away. This had a huge impact on the student mental health.

£200 for a young lady who's mother passed away suddenly and was taken into emergency care with no belongings.

£155 to subsidise a payment for the making of specialist equipment for a young person.


