Trustees' Annual Report – 2025

1. Objectives and Activities

Engera UK supports sustainable primary healthcare and development initiatives in southern Ethiopia, with a particular focus on maternal and child health. The charity works directly with healthcare providers and communities in under-resourced rural areas to improve access to essential services and strengthen the local health system.

Our principal activities include:

- Training and capacity building for nurses and midwives
- Providing medical equipment and supplies to rural health clinics
- Supporting maternal and newborn care
- Strengthening outreach and referral systems
- Supporting nutritional and educational programmes for school-aged children

All activities directly serve the public benefit by addressing preventable illness, improving the quality of care in rural areas, and promoting long-term health equity. In setting these objectives and activities, the trustees have had due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

2. Achievements and Performance

In 2025, Engera UK focused on strengthening maternal and newborn care, improving essential clinic infrastructure, and supporting child nutrition through school-based programmes. Activities were delivered in close collaboration with health workers, educators, and community partners in southern Ethiopia.

Solar Power for Rural Clinics

A major achievement this year was the installation of solar panel systems at four of the rural health centres we support. These systems now provide a stable, uninterrupted source of electricity for essential clinical services.

Health workers report:

- Consistent lighting during night-time deliveries

- Reliable power for sterilisation, diagnostics, and emergency procedures
- Fewer service interruptions due to grid outages
- Greater confidence in managing complications on-site

This investment significantly strengthens the resilience of rural clinics and directly improves the safety and quality of maternal and newborn care.

Essential Newborn Care – Zizencho and Galeya Clinics

Engera UK also funded the purchase of two baby warmers, one for Zizencho Clinic and one for Galeya Rogdha Clinic. Previously, both clinics relied on improvised methods to keep newborns warm, particularly premature and low-birth-weight infants.

The new equipment enables:

- Safe thermal regulation immediately after birth
- Improved management of vulnerable newborns
- Reduced risk of hypothermia-related complications

These additions support better outcomes for the most fragile babies in both communities.

Galeya School Meals Project

In 2025, Engera UK also supported the **Galeya School Meals Project**, providing regular nutritious meals to children attending the elementary school adjacent to Galeya Clinic. The programme aims to improve child nutrition, support school attendance, and enhance learning outcomes in a community affected by food insecurity.

Since the start of the project, **school enrolment has increased by approximately 30%**, indicating improved access to education and stronger engagement from families.

Teachers and community members report that the provision of meals has:

- Improved children's concentration and participation in class
- Encouraged more consistent school attendance
- Reduced hunger among vulnerable pupils

The school meals project complements Engera's healthcare work by addressing nutrition as a key determinant of child health and development.

Other Support

Although no training programmes or additional community-based initiatives were delivered this year, Engera UK remained in close contact with clinic and school partners to ensure that funded equipment, infrastructure, and nutrition programmes were effectively integrated into daily services.

3. Structure, Governance, and Management

Engera UK is a registered charity (no. 1158053) and is governed by a board of volunteer trustees. The charity operates under a constitution and is regulated by the Charity Commission for England and Wales.

Trustee Recruitment and Appointment

Trustees are appointed in accordance with the charity's governing document. All trustees serve in a voluntary capacity and receive no remuneration. Each new trustee is provided with an introduction to the charity's mission and operations.

Governance and Oversight

The board of trustees meets regularly to:

- Review strategic direction and programme delivery
- Monitor project performance
- Approve grant disbursements and budgets
- Ensure compliance with all statutory obligations

The trustees are also responsible for oversight of the charity's finances and reserves, ensuring funds are applied solely in furtherance of the charity's objectives.

Project implementation in Ethiopia is overseen through close relationships with health workers and community leaders, supported by regular reporting and documentation.

Risk Management

The board reviews key risks annually, including operational, financial, and reputational risks. Risks are mitigated through project-level due diligence, diversified funding, and strong communication with in-country partners. The charity maintains appropriate insurance and ensures compliance with safeguarding policies.

4. Plans for the Future

In 2026, Engera UK plans to:

- Fund the installation of solar panels at Shebraber Health Center, the remaining clinic in our network still without a reliable power supply
- Fund essential medical equipment, including chemistry machines, delivery sets, and resuscitation kits
- Continue and strengthen the Galeya School Meals Programme, subject to funding availability
- Increase engagement with UK-based supporters and institutions to grow the charity's impact

Future projects will continue to be developed in direct collaboration with frontline workers and communities in Ethiopia, with a focus on sustainability and impact.

1. Objectives and Activities

Engera UK is dedicated to supporting sustainable primary healthcare and development initiatives in southern Ethiopia, with a particular focus on maternal and child health. The charity works directly with healthcare providers and communities in underresourced rural areas to improve access to essential services and to strengthen the local health system.

Our principal activities include:

- Training and capacity building for nurses and midwives
- Providing medical equipment and supplies to rural health centres
- Supporting maternal and newborn care
- Strengthening outreach and referral systems
- Supporting nutritional and educational programmes for school-aged children

All activities directly serve the public benefit by addressing preventable illness, improving the quality of care in rural areas, and promoting long-term health equity.

2. Achievements and Performance

Engera UK made meaningful progress during the year, particularly in the areas of clinical training, antenatal care, outreach, and child nutrition. These activities were delivered in close collaboration with health workers and school communities in southern Ethiopia.

Advanced Nurse Training – Burdett Trust for Nursing

Thanks to generous support from the **Burdett Trust for Nursing**, sixteen midwives participated in a **month-long advanced training programme** at Attat Hospital, under the guidance of Sister Rita. The training included placements in the emergency ward, outpatient clinic, delivery suite, and minor operating room.

"I used to only assist with minor surgical procedures, but now I have had the opportunity to perform these procedures myself under close supervision. I feel fully confident that I can carry out these skills independently when I return to my health center."

"Working in the minor operating room was a particularly eye-opening experience. Previously, we referred patients elsewhere for even basic procedures. Now, after receiving hands-on training, we feel confident in performing these services ourselves."

Midwifery Training – BEmONC

Four midwives completed a **Basic Emergency Obstetric and Newborn Care (BEmONC)** programme at Attat Referral Hospital. Funded in partnership with the **Veta Bailey Charitable Trust**, the three-week course focused on:

- Maternal and newborn resuscitation
- Assisted delivery techniques
- Emergency obstetric care
- Neonatal care and ultrasound diagnostics

The training was instrumental in strengthening the quality of care provided at rural clinics.

Improved Antenatal Care – Galeya Rogdha Clinic

Engera funded an **ultrasound machine** for the Galeya Rogdha Clinic. Frezer, the clinic's lead midwife, has used the equipment to improve diagnostic capability and antenatal monitoring. As a result:

- Women are more likely to attend early and regularly for antenatal care

- Potential complications are being identified earlier
- Health outcomes for mothers and babies are improving

Outreach Capacity – Galeya Rogdha Clinic

To support health workers in reaching remote communities, Engera funded a **motorcycle for Galeya Rogdha Clinic**. This new outreach vehicle enables:

- Follow-up and postnatal care
- Community antenatal visits
- Health education in hard-to-reach villages
- Emergency referral coordination

This simple but vital investment extends the clinic's reach to the surrounding population.

School Nutrition and Learning Environment – Galeya Primary School

This year, Engera UK also began supporting the **Galeya School Meals Programme**, helping to provide **daily nutritious meals** to children attending the local elementary school. Regular meals have already led to improved school attendance and classroom engagement.

To further support a positive learning environment, Engera also funded:

- Dining tables and chairs
- Desks and chairs for teachers
- Cupboards for learning materials
- A carpet for children to sit on during lessons

Together, these efforts promote both child health and educational equity.
