We also support individual's emotional needs by offering a free counselling service.

We provide donations primarily of furniture to those in need following crisis or challenging life events.

The main achievement of the year is we have set up a regular outreach day each week to work with the local community. We have expanded in donating products such as sleeping bags, tents, clothing etc that we also collect ready for distribution.

We are also offering a free of charge counselling service to those in need by one of our trustee's who has a degree in counselling and psychotherapy.

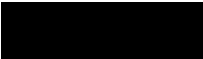
