The trustees present their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charitable company's Memorandum and Articles of Association, the Companies Act 2006, the Charities Act 2011 and 'Accounting and reporting by charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)', effective January 2015 (the Charities SORP FRS 102).

Objectives and activities

The objects of the charity, as set out in its governing document, are:

To foster and promote the education of the general public in the application and practical study of the development, preservation and restoration of industrial, agricultural, marine, commercial and domestic equipment and machinery.

Regular meetings and activities are held by the society, including an annual rally.

There has been no change in these objectives and activities during the year.

Public benefit

The trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the charity should undertake.

Activities

The trustees have met formally on a regular basis putting plans in place and designing projects to take us forward as a society.

Achievements and performance

Significant activities and achievements against objectives

The Society was able to hold its annual Rally again. Overall the Rally was a success but was also hit by rising costs. As always the organisers of the Rally worked tirelessly both before and during the Rally and deserve a huge vote of thanks. Work on the 2025 Rally is, as usual, well under way.

The Rally at the Showground for 2026 has provisionally been moved from the usual weekend in May due to a clash with the National Urdd. This may prove to be a problem financially due to the unknown availability of attractions and traders for the revised date. The Trustees are aware of this and are looking at ways to mitigate any possible loss of income to the Society.

The Society's bus has been returned re-sprayed and with new tyres, it was used during 2024 to promote and attend the Rally, also to transport members on outings.

The meeting room continued to be used by the Society for its monthly meetings and it has been available for local groups to use. Two separate groups have been taking advantage of the facility and they have made donations to the Society.

The Trustees were able to fulfil their commitments and held meetings to ensure that the Society was being managed.

The plan for installing better toilet facilities and additional storage and working space is still ongoing.

The Members' Shed, which is the meeting of various members on Tuesday mornings to enjoy each other's company and to work on renovating various pieces of equipment has proved popular and continues. The weekly meetings have enabled the fire engine to be partially renovated (ongoing with a view to exhibiting it at the next Rally). Work on the wheeled hut has now started. The area around the buildings is also being cared for on a regular basis.

A Christmas meal was organised for members and was held at the Bulkeley hotel in Beaumaris and with the proceeds from the raffles held in December the Society was able to donate £121.50 to the Welsh Air Ambulance charity just before Christmas.

Financial review

The trustees consider that the charity is on a sound footing with adequate resources to continue its activities in the future.

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the society that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six month's expenditure. The trustees consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the society's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the year.

Major risks

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2024

1 Accounting policies

Charity information

Anglesey Vintage Equipment Society is a private company limited by guarantee incorporated in England and Wales. The registered office is Unit F1, Intec Ffordd Y Parc, Parc Menai, Bangor, Gwynedd, LL57 4FG, United Kingdom.

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the charity's Memorandum and Articles of Association, the Companies Act 2006 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)" (as amended for accounting periods commencing from 1 January 2016). The charity is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

The charity has taken advantage of the provisions in the SORP for charities applying FRS 102 Update Bulletin 1 not to prepare a Statement of Cash Flows.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, [modified to include the revaluation of freehold properties and to include investment properties and certain financial instruments at fair value]. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

1.2 Going concern

At the time of approving the financial statements, the trustees have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus the trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

1.3 Charitable funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of their charitable objectives.

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors or grantors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Endowment funds are subject to specific conditions by donors that the capital must be maintained by the charity.

1.4 Income

Income is recognised when the charity is legally entitled to it after any performance conditions have been met, the amounts can be measured reliably, and it is probable that income will be received.

Cash donations are recognised on receipt. Other donations are recognised once the charity has been notified of the donation, unless performance conditions require deferral of the amount. Income tax recoverable in relation to donations received under Gift Aid or deeds of covenant is recognised at the time of the donation.

Legacies are recognised on receipt or otherwise if the charity has been notified of an impending distribution, the amount is known, and receipt is expected. If the amount is not known, the legacy is treated as a contingent asset.

1.5 Expenditure

All costs are recognised on the accruals basis, inclusive of irrecoverable VAT.

1.6 Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are initially measured at cost and subsequently measured at cost or valuation, net of depreciation and any impairment losses.

Depreciation is recognised so as to write off the cost or valuation of assets less their residual values over their useful lives on the following bases:

Land and buildings	4% per annum straight line
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The gain or loss arising on the disposal of an asset is determined as the difference between the sale proceeds and the carrying value of the asset, and is recognised in the statement of financial activities.

No depreciation is charged on freehold land.

No depreciation is charged on equipment regarded as heritage assets. The trustees consider that such a charge would not be appropriate given the nature of the equipment and the expenditure incurred to keep it in operating condition, that expenditure being charged to resources expended.

Individual assets costing less than £500 are not capitalised, except in the case of heritage assets.

1.7 Impairment of fixed assets

At each reporting end date, the charity reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have suffered an impairment loss. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated in order to determine the extent of the impairment loss (if any).

1.8 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities.

1.9 Financial instruments

The charity has elected to apply the provisions of Section 11 'Basic Financial Instruments' and Section 12 'Other Financial Instruments Issues' of FRS 102 to all of its financial instruments.

Financial instruments are recognised in the charity's balance sheet when the charity becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset, with the net amounts presented in the financial statements, when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Basic financial assets

Basic financial assets, which include debtors and cash and bank balances, are initially measured at transaction price including transaction costs and are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial assets classified as receivable within one year are not amortised.

1 Accounting policies

(Continued)

Basic financial liabilities

Basic financial liabilities, including creditors and bank loans are initially recognised at transaction price unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the debt instrument is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial liabilities classified as payable within one year are not amortised.

Debt instruments are subsequently carried at amortised cost, using the effective interest rate method.

Trade creditors are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of operations from suppliers. Amounts payable are classified as current liabilities if payment is due within one year or less. If not, they are presented as non-current liabilities. Trade creditors are recognised initially at transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Derecognition of financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are derecognised when the charity's contractual obligations expire or are discharged or cancelled.

1.10 Employee benefits

The cost of any unused holiday entitlement is recognised in the period in which the employee's services are received.

Termination benefits are recognised immediately as an expense when the charity is demonstrably committed to terminate the employment of an employee or to provide termination benefits.

2 Critical accounting estimates and judgements

In the application of the charity's accounting policies, the trustees are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amount of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised where the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods where the revision affects both current and future periods.

The trustees present their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2023.

There has been no change in these objectives and activities during the year.

The trustees have met formally on a regular basis putting plans in place and designing projects to take us forward as a society.

Achievements and performance

Significant activities and achievements against objectives

The Society was able to hold its annual Rally again. Overall the Rally was a success with slightly fewer attendees by the public but was also hit by rising costs. As always the organisers of the Rally worked tirelessly both before and during the Rally and deserve a huge vote of thanks.

During the Rally in 2022 the Society's single deck bus was damaged and an insurance claim was made in order to pay for the repairs. The insurance claim has been honoured and the damage to the bus was repaired and it is now awaiting new tyres and the re-spray to be finished. We hope it will be returned in time to help promote the 2024 Rally and appear at the Rally.

The meeting room continued to be used by the Society for its monthly meetings and it has been available for local groups to use. Three separate groups have been taking advantage of the facility and they have made donations to the Society. The Wood turning group have returned to their previous venue in Llandygai and no longer use our facilities.

The Trustees were able to fulfil their commitments and held meetings to ensure that the Society was being managed.

The plan for installing better toilet facilities and additional storage and working space is still ongoing.

The idea of what is now called Members' Shed, which is the meeting of various members on Tuesday mornings to enjoy each other's company and to work on renovating various pieces of equipment, has proved popular and continues. The weekly meetings have enabled the fire engine to be partially renovated (ongoing with a view to exhibiting it at the Rally) and the Treasurer's hut, which is vital during the Rally, to be overhauled. Work on the wheeled hut has now started. The area around the buildings is also being cared for on a regular basis.

The Open Day at Dolwen to allow the public to see what the Society is actually doing was continued. No entrance fee was charged but donations for the installation of a defibrillator at Star were requested. This charity was nominated as a member who passed away donated £1,060 to the Society. These donations are currently held in the Society's bank account and will be specified as for the purpose of the installation of a defibrillator or should this not be required, an alternative satisfactory purpose.

A Christmas meal was organised for members which was held at the Lastra Farm hotel and with the proceeds from the raffles held in December the Society was able to donate £127 to the St Davids Hospice just before Christmas.

Financial review

The trustees consider that the charity is on a sound footing with adequate resources to continue its activities in the future.

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the society that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six month's expenditure. The trustees consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the society's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the year.

Major risks

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

1 Accounting policies

Charity information

Anglesey Vintage Equipment Society is a private company limited by guarantee incorporated in England and Wales. The registered office is Unit F1, Intec Ffordd Y Parc, Parc Menai, Bangor, Gwynedd, LL57 4FG, United Kingdom.

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the charity's Memorandum and Articles of Association, the Companies Act 2006 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)" (as amended for accounting periods commencing from 1 January 2016). The charity is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

The charity has taken advantage of the provisions in the SORP for charities applying FRS 102 Update Bulletin 1 not to prepare a Statement of Cash Flows.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, [modified to include the revaluation of freehold properties and to include investment properties and certain financial instruments at fair value]. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

1.2 Going concern

At the time of approving the financial statements, the trustees have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus the trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

1.3 Charitable funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of their charitable objectives.

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors or grantors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Endowment funds are subject to specific conditions by donors that the capital must be maintained by the charity.

1.4 Income

Income is recognised when the charity is legally entitled to it after any performance conditions have been met, the amounts can be measured reliably, and it is probable that income will be received.

Cash donations are recognised on receipt. Other donations are recognised once the charity has been notified of the donation, unless performance conditions require deferral of the amount. Income tax recoverable in relation to donations received under Gift Aid or deeds of covenant is recognised at the time of the donation.

Legacies are recognised on receipt or otherwise if the charity has been notified of an impending distribution, the amount is known, and receipt is expected. If the amount is not known, the legacy is treated as a contingent asset.

1.5 Expenditure

All costs are recognised on the accruals basis, inclusive of irrecoverable VAT.

1.6 Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are initially measured at cost and subsequently measured at cost or valuation, net of depreciation and any impairment losses.

Depreciation is recognised so as to write off the cost or valuation of assets less their residual values over their useful lives on the following bases:

The gain or loss arising on the disposal of an asset is determined as the difference between the sale proceeds and the carrying value of the asset, and is recognised in the statement of financial activities.

No depreciation is charged on freehold land.

No depreciation is charged on equipment regarded as heritage assets. The trustees consider that such a charge would not be appropriate given the nature of the equipment and the expenditure incurred to keep it in operating condition, that expenditure being charged to resources expended.

Individual assets costing less than £500 are not capitalised, except in the case of heritage assets.

1.7 Impairment of fixed assets

At each reporting end date, the charity reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have suffered an impairment loss. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated in order to determine the extent of the impairment loss (if any).

1.8 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities.

1.9 Financial instruments

The charity has elected to apply the provisions of Section 11 'Basic Financial Instruments' and Section 12 'Other Financial Instruments Issues' of FRS 102 to all of its financial instruments.

Financial instruments are recognised in the charity's balance sheet when the charity becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset, with the net amounts presented in the financial statements, when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Basic financial assets

Basic financial assets, which include debtors and cash and bank balances, are initially measured at transaction price including transaction costs and are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial assets classified as receivable within one year are not amortised.

1 Accounting policies

Basic financial liabilities

Basic financial liabilities, including creditors and bank loans are initially recognised at transaction price unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the debt instrument is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial liabilities classified as payable within one year are not amortised.

Debt instruments are subsequently carried at amortised cost, using the effective interest rate method.

Trade creditors are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of operations from suppliers. Amounts payable are classified as current liabilities if payment is due within one year or less. If not, they are presented as non-current liabilities. Trade creditors are recognised initially at transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Derecognition of financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are derecognised when the charity's contractual obligations expire or are discharged or cancelled.

1.10 Employee benefits

The cost of any unused holiday entitlement is recognised in the period in which the employee's services are received.

Termination benefits are recognised immediately as an expense when the charity is demonstrably committed to terminate the employment of an employee or to provide termination benefits.

2 Critical accounting estimates and judgements

In the application of the charity's accounting policies, the trustees are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amount of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised where the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods where the revision affects both current and future periods.

Regular meetings and activities are held by the society, including an annual rally.

There has been no change in these objectives and activities during the year.

The trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the charity should undertake.

The trustees have met formally on a regular basis putting plans in place and designing projects to take us forward as a society.

Achievements and performance

This year the Society was able to hold its first Rally since 2019. The decision by the Trustees in 2021 to defer any spending in order to husband the funds in hand was vindicated as it ensured that the Rally was to be a great success. The organisers of the Rally worked tirelessly both before and during the Rally and deserve a huge vote of thanks. Feedback from the public was very positive. Nearly 4,500 adults attended over the 2 days and possibly half as many again of under 16 year-olds were present. It is encouraging to say that it was also financially successful.

During the Rally the Society's single deck bus was damaged and an insurance claim was made in order to pay for the repairs. Whilst the bus was to be repaired it was decided to enquire about the possibility of having the whole bus resprayed. The bus is with the restorers at present and the Society is awaiting a final quotation for repair and respray. The insurance money has been received and a sum allocated for the painting dependent upon the quotation obtained. This subject will be revisited by the Trustees when the quotation has been submitted.

The steel which had been purchased in the past has now been erected with an agreement with the erection company to allow them to complete the task as and when they had manpower which enabled the Society to negotiate a very competitive price.

The meeting room continued to be used by the Society for its monthly meetings and it has been available for local groups to use. Four separate groups have been taking advantage of the facility and they have made donations to the Society.

The Trustees were able to fulfil their commitments and held meetings to ensure that the Society was being managed.

The plan for installing better toilet facilities and additional storage and working space is still ongoing and a firm of building inspectors has been employed to oversee any future work on the project.

The idea of what is now called Members' Shed, which is the meeting of various members on Tuesday mornings to enjoy each other's company and to work on renovating various pieces of equipment, has proved popular and is going from strength to strength. The weekly meetings have enabled the fire engine to be partially renovated (ongoing) and the Treasurer's hut, which is vital during the Rally, to be overhauled. The area around the buildings is also being cared for on a regular basis.

During the year it was decided to hold an Open Day at Dolwen to allow the public to see what the Society is actually doing. No entrance fee was charged but donations for Hope House Hospice were requested. This charity was nominated by the farmer whose land adjoins the premises at Dolwen in return for allowing the Society to use two fields for an entrance and parking. The bus was still in use and a round trip from Dolwen to the Menai Strait was well supported with a collection on board for the charity. In total, during the day, over £500 was raised for the charity. The day was felt to have been very successful with nearly 50 new members joining.

A Christmas meal was organised for members which was held at the Nant yr Odyn hotel and with the proceeds from the raffles held in November and December the Society was able to donate £165 to the Holyhead Food Bank just before Christmas.

Financial review

The trustees consider that the charity is on a sound footing with adequate resources to continue its activities in the future.

It is the policy of the society that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six month's expenditure. The trustees consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the society's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the year.

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

Structure, governance and management

The charity is a company limited by guarantee and a charity registered in England and Wales.

1 Accounting policies

Charity information

Anglesey Vintage Equipment Society is a private company limited by guarantee incorporated in England and Wales. The registered office is Unit F1, Intec Ffordd Y Parc, Parc Menai, Bangor, Gwynedd, LL57 4FG, United Kingdom.

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the charity's Memorandum and Articles of Association, the Companies Act 2006 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)" (as amended for accounting periods commencing from 1 January 2016). The charity is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

The charity has taken advantage of the provisions in the SORP for charities applying FRS 102 Update Bulletin 1 not to prepare a Statement of Cash Flows.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, [modified to include the revaluation of freehold properties and to include investment properties and certain financial instruments at fair value]. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

1.2 Going concern

At the time of approving the financial statements, the trustees have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus the trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

1.3 Charitable funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of their charitable objectives.

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Endowment funds are subject to specific conditions by donors that the capital must be maintained by the charity.

1.4 Income

Income is recognised when the charity is legally entitled to it after any performance conditions have been met, the amounts can be measured reliably, and it is probable that income will be received.

Cash donations are recognised on receipt. Other donations are recognised once the charity has been notified of the donation, unless performance conditions require deferral of the amount. Income tax recoverable in relation to donations received under Gift Aid or deeds of covenant is recognised at the time of the donation.

Legacies are recognised on receipt or otherwise if the charity has been notified of an impending distribution, the amount is known, and receipt is expected. If the amount is not known, the legacy is treated as a contingent asset.

1.5 Expenditure

All costs are recognised on the accruals basis, inclusive of irrecoverable VAT.

1.6 Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are initially measured at cost and subsequently measured at cost or valuation, net of depreciation and any impairment losses.

Depreciation is recognised so as to write off the cost or valuation of assets less their residual values over their useful lives on the following bases:

The gain or loss arising on the disposal of an asset is determined as the difference between the sale proceeds and the carrying value of the asset, and is recognised in the statement of financial activities.

No depreciation is charged on freehold land.

No depreciation is charged on equipment regarded as heritage assets. The trustees consider that such a charge would not be appropriate given the nature of the equipment and the expenditure incurred to keep it in operating condition, that expenditure being charged to resources expended.

Individual assets costing less than £500 are not capitalised, except in the case of heritage assets.

1.7 Impairment of fixed assets

At each reporting end date, the charity reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have suffered an impairment loss. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated in order to determine the extent of the impairment loss (if any).

1.8 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities.

1.9 Financial instruments

The charity has elected to apply the provisions of Section 11 'Basic Financial Instruments' and Section 12 'Other Financial Instruments Issues' of FRS 102 to all of its financial instruments.

Financial instruments are recognised in the charity's balance sheet when the charity becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset, with the net amounts presented in the financial statements, when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Basic financial assets

Basic financial assets, which include debtors and cash and bank balances, are initially measured at transaction price including transaction costs and are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial assets classified as receivable within one year are not amortised.

1 Accounting policies

Basic financial liabilities

Basic financial liabilities, including creditors and bank loans are initially recognised at transaction price unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the debt instrument is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial liabilities classified as payable within one year are not amortised.

Debt instruments are subsequently carried at amortised cost, using the effective interest rate method.

Trade creditors are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of operations from suppliers. Amounts payable are classified as current liabilities if payment is due within one year or less. If not, they are presented as non-current liabilities. Trade creditors are recognised initially at transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Derecognition of financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are derecognised when the charity's contractual obligations expire or are discharged or cancelled.

1.10 Employee benefits

The cost of any unused holiday entitlement is recognised in the period in which the employee's services are received.

Termination benefits are recognised immediately as an expense when the charity is demonstrably committed to terminate the employment of an employee or to provide termination benefits.

2 Critical accounting estimates and judgements

In the application of the charity's accounting policies, the trustees are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amount of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised where the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods where the revision affects both current and future periods.
