Executive Summary

During the year ending 31 March 2025, Little Angels Foundation continued to advance its charitable mission of transforming the lives of children, young people, and families in Cameroon, DR Congo, and the United Kingdom. Building on the strong foundations laid in the previous year, the Foundation delivered a similar portfolio of educational, creative, and empowerment-focused activities, with a notable expansion of **online workshops, virtual training sessions, and digital engagement**.

Despite ongoing global and regional challenges, including economic pressures and continued instability affecting some of our beneficiaries, the Foundation demonstrated resilience and adaptability. By increasing the use of online delivery, we were able to reach wider audiences, maintain continuity of support, and ensure access to learning and counselling opportunities for children, young people, and families who might otherwise have been excluded.

The trustees are satisfied that the charity has continued to operate in furtherance of its charitable objectives, has managed its resources responsibly, and remains well-positioned to grow its impact in the coming years.

In 2025, our work maintained a strong focus on literacy, creativity, and life skills development, while increasingly embracing digital platforms to deliver workshops and support sessions.

Key Activities and Achievements in 2025

Creative Writing and Literacy Workshops

The Foundation continued to deliver creative writing, reading, and storytelling workshops for children and young people. In 2025, a greater proportion of these sessions were delivered **online**, enabling broader participation across geographical boundaries. These workshops supported literacy development, self-expression, and confidence-building, with positive feedback from participants, parents, and educators.

Online Educational Sessions and Webinars

In response to demand and accessibility needs, Little Angels Foundation significantly increased its programme of online workshops and virtual sessions. These included:

- Literacy and reading support sessions for children
- Creative writing masterclasses led by authors and facilitators
- Interactive discussions promoting a love of books and storytelling

The use of digital platforms allowed the Foundation to maintain regular engagement with beneficiaries and volunteers, while reducing delivery costs.

Books Donation Programme

The books donation programme remained a core activity in 2025. The Foundation continued to distribute books to children from disadvantaged and underrepresented communities, complementing both in-person and online literacy activities. These resources supported learning at home and reinforced the impact of workshops and reading sessions.

Financial Literacy and Empowerment Workshops

Building on the success of previous initiatives, financial literacy workshops for mothers and caregivers were continued, with several sessions delivered online. Participants gained practical skills in budgeting, financial planning, and household money management, contributing to increased confidence and economic resilience.

Counselling, Mentoring, and Family Support

The Foundation continued to provide counselling, coaching, and mentoring support to children, young people, and families experiencing distress. Where face-to-face support was not feasible, online and telephone-based sessions ensured continuity of care and guidance.

Public Benefit

The trustees confirm that they have had due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit. All activities undertaken during the year were carried out to further the Foundation's charitable purposes and provided clear benefit to the public, particularly disadvantaged children, young people, and families.

Challenges and Resilience

The Foundation continued to face challenges related to limited funding, rising costs, and ongoing socio-political instability affecting some regions of Cameroon. However, the increased use of online delivery enabled the charity to adapt effectively, maintain programme delivery, and reach beneficiaries in a flexible and cost-efficient manner.

The commitment of trustees, volunteers, and partners remained a key strength, ensuring that services continued despite financial and operational pressures.

Plans for the Future

Looking ahead to 2026, Little Angels Foundation aims to:

- Further expand online and hybrid workshops to reach more beneficiaries
 - Develop vocational training and skills-based initiatives for young people
 - Strengthen partnerships with schools, publishers, and community organisations
 - Enhance fundraising activities to support long-term sustainability

These activities demonstrated our ongoing commitment to empowerment and education.

Key Activities and Achievements in 2024

Creative Writing Workshops at the Bootle International Festival

Our creative writing workshops were a highlight of the Bootle International Festival in 2024. These sessions provided young participants with an opportunity to develop their writing skills and share their unique stories. Attendees expressed newfound confidence and enthusiasm, with many showcasing their creations at the festival's youth talent showcase.

Books Donation Programme

We continued our impactful books donation programme, distributing hundreds of books to children in need. This initiative was supported by collaborations with schools and publishers, helping to bridge educational gaps in underserved communities. The donated books served as vital tools for learning and personal growth.

World Book Day Symposium

Our second annual World Book Day symposium in March 2024 was a resounding success. The event brought together educators, authors, and young readers for panel discussions, storytelling sessions, and interactive workshops. Participants left inspired and better equipped to foster a lifelong love for reading and literature.

Reading and Storytelling Workshops for Underrepresented Communities

We expanded our reading and storytelling workshops to engage children from underrepresented communities. These sessions, led by professional storytellers and volunteers, were designed to nurture a love for stories while providing a platform for creative expression. The workshops created a sense of inclusion and belonging for participants.

Financial Literacy Workshops for Mothers

A new initiative in 2024 was the introduction of financial literacy workshops for mothers in underrepresented communities. Conducted in collaboration with Likambi Global Publishing Ltd., these workshops equipped participants with essential skills to manage household finances, budget effectively, and pursue economic independence.

Challenges and Resilience

Despite our progress, challenges persisted in Cameroon due to political instability and economic difficulties. Displacement and disrupted schooling continued to impact our beneficiaries. However, the foundation's adaptability and the dedication of our team allowed us to deliver virtual workshops and distribute critical resources.

Financial constraints remained a concern due to limited fundraising opportunities, but the generosity of our trustees, volunteers, and partners sustained our programmes. Their unwavering commitment ensured that we continued to meet the needs of our beneficiaries.

Looking Ahead

In 2025, Little Angels Foundation aims to:

- Establish a vocational training centre to empower disadvantaged youth with practical skills.
 - Expand our creative writing and storytelling programmes to reach more young people.
 - Strengthen collaborations with partners to enhance resource distribution and programme delivery.

Creative Writing Workshops for Young People

In 2022, we launched a series of creative writing workshops aimed at inspiring and nurturing young talents. These workshops provided participants with the opportunity to express themselves through storytelling and writing, cultivating both their creativity and confidence. Held in various community centres, the workshops attracted children from diverse backgrounds and served as a platform for budding writers to showcase their ideas.

Feedback from attendees was overwhelmingly positive, with many young participants expressing their newfound passion for writing and storytelling. We believe this initiative has planted seeds of hope and ambition in their lives.

Storytelling and Reading Sessions

Recognising the power of stories to educate, heal, and inspire, we organised regular storytelling and reading sessions. These events, hosted by volunteers and professional storytellers, were designed to foster a love for literature among children and young people. The sessions were particularly

impactful for children facing distress, offering them solace and a sense of belonging through shared narratives.

The sessions also included the donation of books to schools and individuals in need. With the help of key partners in Cameroon, we distributed books to disadvantaged schoolchildren, enabling them to continue their education despite ongoing hardships.

Creative Genius Conference - August 2022

A highlight of our year was the **Creative Genius Conference** held in August 2022. This transformative event brought together young minds, educators, and creatives to explore the boundless potential of creativity. The conference featured workshops, panel discussions, and networking opportunities, leaving attendees inspired and equipped with tools to pursue their dreams.

The Creative Genius Conference showcased the resilience and ingenuity of our community, reaffirming our belief in the power of creativity to shape futures. It was a resounding success, with many participants expressing their eagerness for similar events in the future.

Challenges and Resilience

The aftermath of the COVID-19 pandemic continued to present challenges, particularly in our work in Cameroon. Displacement and school closures in the English-speaking regions of the country disrupted our direct engagements. Nonetheless, our trustees, led by the unwavering commitment of Dr Sylvia Forchap, worked tirelessly to provide support through mentoring, counselling, and resource distribution.

Despite limited fundraising activities, the foundation remained steadfast in its mission, relying on the selfless contributions of our trustees and volunteers. Their dedication ensured that our beneficiaries continued to receive essential support and encouragement.

As we move forward, Little Angels Foundation is determined to expand its initiatives and deepen its impact. Plans for 2023 include:

- Establishing a vocational training centre to empower disadvantaged youth with practical skills.
 - Scaling up our creative writing and storytelling programmes to reach more young people.

both in the UK and Cameroon during this financial year and are working with key partners in Cameroon to enable the donation of books to disadvantaged school children in Cameroon become feasible.
