Shine Bright Foundation have continued to employ the holistic practitioners at Navitas and also at the Reiki Place. Each of these holistic centres hare proving popular.

The holistic treatments come in the form of reiki and reflexology, we offer these treatments for those people who have been diagnosed or are having treatment for breast cancer.

While our focus is to raise money to provide these treatments locally, we are also well placed to give substantial donations to the Christie Foundation Trust centre research dept Manchester headed by Dr Sacha Howell leading oncologist.

We also promote selfcare through leaflets and through social media notifications.

We provide giftbags and comfort cushions on request. These are design to provide some comfort to each people who receives them.

For the year 2023-2024 Nov 2023 – Oct 2024.

Our year continued with our objectives.

We were able to provide and pay for 38 sessions of reiki and reflexology
Each session is 1hour long treatment.

We have been able to send 85 gift bags and over 30 comfort cushions.
The gift bags are made up of aloe vera-based product, tooth gel, moisturiser, deodorant, antibacterial hand gel, lip balm, herbal tea and cosy socks along with our charity leaflets.

We are also providing comfort cushions that are designed to sit or be placed under your arm to relieve any soreness or pressure from the chest area where surgery has been needed.

We were in the wonderful position to be able to give a grant of £40,000 to the Christie Research Dept Manchester this year.

This is a second donation from Shine Bright Foundation towards the BCAN-RAY study, totalling £90k so far. This is an early detection breast cancer app that has had impressive results.

As always, we are very lucky to have support and commitment toward Shine Bright Foundation.



Shine Bright Foundation have continued our relationship with the Navitas Holistic centre based in Shavington cum Gresty, additionally with another complimentary therapy company based at the Yard, Burland Nantwich. Each of these therapy centres is proving popular.

The holistic treatments are there for people who have been diagnosed with Breast Cancer or are having medical treatment for Breast Cancer. Up to 12 months post-medical treatment.

The holistic treatments we provide are Reiki, Reflexology and Mindfulness, we will also provide a course to learn Reiki up to level 1 to enable people to self-help (treat themselves). These treatments are always popular and successful, there is always a demand for these therapies.

While our focus is to raise money to provide treatments locally to the Cheshire East area, we are also well placed to give a substantial donation to the Christie Foundation Trust Centre research dept Manchester- Manchester Cancer Research dept headed by Dr Sacha Howell.

We also promote self-care through our leaflets, mostly through social media.

We have been able to offer our gift bags, a total of 117, these gift bags contain Aloe Vera products; Tooth gel, Deodorant, Moisturiser, lip balm and antibacterial hand gel. Herbal tea and a pair of cosy socks.

We have also included comfort cushions that sit or are placed under your arm to relieve any soreness or pressure from the chest area where surgery has been needed. This year we have provided 36 cushions.

We didn't give any donations/grants this year to The Christie Research dept. Manchester.

We are very lucky to have a lot of support shown towards Shine Bright Foundation. Fundraising events have been less than in previous years we have still been able to fulfil our commitments. We hope to break this trend.

We are still very humbled and grateful for all the donations received to Shine Bright Foundation.

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





We at Shine Bright Foundation have continued our partnership with Navitas (based in Crewe). A centre of excellence in holistic treatments. These treatments are there for people who have been diagnosed or are having ongoing treatment for breast cancer.

Reiki, reflexology and mindfulness are some of the treatments on offer. We also provide a course to learn reiki up to level1 to enable people to self help after their 'paid for' treatments have finished. This is proving very successful and we are finding an increase demand for our services. All paid for by Shine Bright Foundation.

While our focus is to raise money to provide these treatments locally, we do from time to time help people outside our area of Crewe and Nantwich. We are also well placed to offer a substantial donation to the Christie Foundation Trust centre research dept Manchester/Manchester cancer research dept headed by Sacha Howell.

We also promote self care through leaflets but mostly through social media.

Shine Bright Foundation our year started/continued with our objectives and then we were hit with the coronavirus (Covid19) outbreak in January 2020.

We did manage to provide one or two treatments and then with the lockdowns and uncertainty of how the virus travelled. It was felt prudent to stop treatments.

We were able to continue providing gift bags though. To any one who is having treatment for breast cancer.

These gift bags comprise of Aloe Vera products:

Tooth gel, deodorant, Gelly and antibacterial hand gel. Herbal tea bags x3, scented candle mini chocolate and cosy socks.

We try to send out x10 each month and from time to time increase the amount depending on demand, and of course if we can afford them.

These gift bags are sent out on request to individuals who are having treatment for B/C.

We have managed to send out 132 gift bags over this period 2019/20. These again were all warmly received, a nice pick- me- up!

Part of the money we raise through out the year goes directly to to the research of triple negative breast cancer and other breast cancers.

We were in a great position to be able to give Dr Sacha Howell's research team a cheque for £50,000. This year the money was put to an ongoing project into an early detection breast cancer app aiming it at women who are too young for breast cancer screening..We are at this moment are waiting on the results of preliminary tests.

We were very lucky to receive some monetary donations this year but as we can all appreciate revenue dropped considerably. We are very hopeful that things will change for the better for this following year.

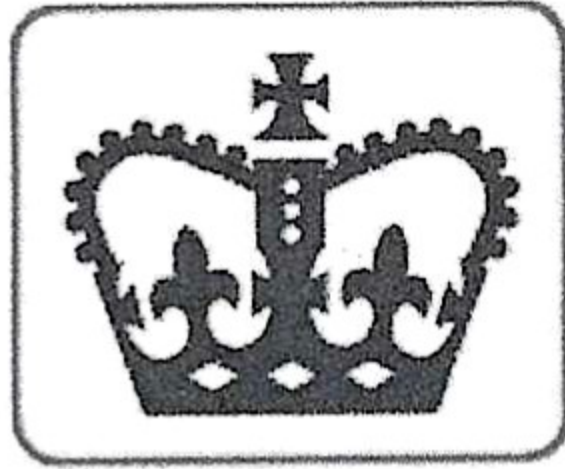
