STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The Charity governing document is a CIO – Foundation registered 24th November 2014. The Charity is governed by a board on which the trustees are represented. It meets regularly to review, plan activities, and monitor the financial position.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The Objects of the organisation are first to advance the Christian faith in accordance with the statement of beliefs for the benefit in the United Kingdom and in such other parts of the world as the trustees may think fit from time to time. The trustees confirm that they have had due regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit before deciding what activities the charity should undertake.

ACHIEVMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The organisation holds regular worship services in the community to promote the Christian faith to the public. It held special events one in the middle of the year and the other over the Christmas period as a way of reaching out to the community with the Christian message. These proved to be successful as more people started attending their regular Sunday services. It now has a fully functional website that allows it to better to advertise its services. They continue to hold their services at the Kennington Community Centre, 8 Harleyford street, London SE11 5SY. They also recently started advertising on the local Christian channel to promote their services.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The charity's income is £26,850. This seemed to be a good amount for this difficult year with the economic crisis. The charity's costs have been well managed over this period, and the organisation is still in a good position to manage its costs. The main cost of the organisation was paying for the rent of its building that it uses for worship services.

RESERVE POLICY

It is the policy of the Charity to maintain unrestricted funds, which are the reserves of the charity at about 3 months of unrestricted expenditure. This provides sufficient funds to cover any emergency expenditures that may arise from time to time. The charity will seek to maintain this level throughout the year.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The charity has assessed all the major risks to which the charity is exposed to, those related to operations and finances of the charity and are satisfied those systems are in place to mitigate exposure to major risks.

TRUSTEE RESPONSIBILITIES

Under the Charities Act 2011, the trustees are required to prepare a statement of accounts for each accounting year which gives a true and fair view of the state of the church. They are required to:

1. Select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently.
2. Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent.
3. State whether the applicable accounting standards have been followed.
4. Prepare financial statements on an ongoing basis.

They are responsible for keeping proper records which disclose with reasonable accuracy the finances of the church at any time and to ensure that such accounts comply with the Charities Act 2011. They also have a responsibility to safeguard the assets of the church and to take reasonable steps to detect fraud or other irregularities.
