The charity secured income of £120,783 during the year which included the gift aid recovered of £21,397. The expenditure for the period was £109,382. This has been primarily the grants (totalling £106,000) given to Markaze Islami Primary School and Darul Uloom Markaze-E-Islami in India via a Memorandum of Agreement between the 2 entities. The surplus of £11,401 was added to prior year surpluses. Total surpluses held at year was £54,746. Currently the trustees don't have a policy on reserves as they intend to use surplus funds for future charitable activities.







We have helped support the running costs such as boarding expenses and salaries of the Primary school staff, pupils and also for an Islamic education school. This has resulted in the qualifications of 240 students in Islamic Education courses and English language.

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

The charity secured donations at a lower level of £54,792 compared to the previous year due to Covid-19. With the recovery of Gift Aid of £6,697, the total income for the year was £61,489. The expenditure for the period was £87,112. This has been primarily the grants (totalling £86,150) given to Markaze Islami Primary School and Darul Uloom Markaze-E-Islami in India via a Memorandum of Agreement between the two entities. Currently, the trustees do not have a policy on reserves as they intend to use funds for future projects and operation costs.


