Chaudhry Foundation is committed to alleviating poverty and hardship across crisis-affected regions and underserved communities worldwide. The charity supports a broad range of humanitarian causes, including food and water distribution, healthcare, education, solar energy systems, and emergency relief efforts. Its educational initiatives empower young boys and girls through both general and Islamic education, equipping them with the tools they need for a brighter future.

The foundation also delivers targeted support to orphans, widows, and low-income families. It provides ongoing financial assistance to healthcare facilities that offer free eye treatment to the poor, elderly, and visually impaired. In the UK, the foundation supports local institutions by funding Islamic education, community facilities, and cultural exhibitions. #### **Report of the Independent Examiner to the trustees**

#### **on the accounts of the Charity for the year end 31 December 2024**

I report on the financial statements of the Charity on **pages 7 to 11** for the year ended **31st December 2024** which have been prepared on a Receipts and Payments basis.
