To relieve the physical and mental distress of persons with cancer and the partners, family, friends and carers of such persons through the provision of financial support and paying for services.

<p>The charity Trustees, Patrons, Ambassadors, Attachés, Volunteers and Supporters plan, organise and hold fundraising ‘Drag &amp; Cabaret’ events in bars, nightclubs and theatres in London, Brighton, Liverpool &amp; South Shields to help us provide financial support and wellbeing to people and their families living with cancer.</p> <p>Money raised is given to our beneficiaries in the form of grants ranging from £100 - £500, depending on circumstance and need, to support them with living costs, travel, medication, household goods, bills, mortgage payments, funeral costs or a treat to raise their spirits (that they could otherwise not afford) such as a short break away to relieve the additional stress being experienced whilst living with and fighting cancer – to make it ‘less of a drag’ than it already is.</p> <p>We receive many donations through PayPal Giving Fund from various platforms such as Facebook Campaigns, Virgin Money Giving &amp; Just Giving Funds.</p> <p>We have supported people living with cancer to access our grant giving by visiting them in their own home when necessary, meeting them at local hospitals, chatting directly by phone and through our Facebook Page on social media. To make life easier for our beneficiaries we provide paid postage and ‘bank transfer’ grants if the money is needed urgently.</p> <p>This year, since the ‘pandemic’, we have not been able to hold as many fundraising events as we would have liked and understand that many small charities are struggling a bit. However, we are proud to have taken part in the 2023 London Pride Parade to let people know that we exist and have been taken onboard, as their chosen charity, at a fabulous venue in central London, practically on Tower Bridge, called The Raven.</p> <p>We have made new partnership/connections with Click 4 Clothing Collection whilst continuing to donate to our supporters fundraising schemes in aid of Macmillan Cancer Support and Cancer Research. Our Trustees continue to support the work of Macmillan in many ways.</p>

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**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**

In 2023, since the 'pandemic', things have changed and it is quite difficult for small charities to raise money these days the way we used to." However, we still managed to raise over £14,000, which is amazing in our eyes!

Our new partnership/connection with Click 4 Clothing Collection has raised over £3,000.

We have raised over £1,500 through Virgin Money Giving, JustGiving & PayPal Giving Fund Campaigns.

Personal donations by cheque totalled over £1,000.

Of all this money raised, we have provided our beneficiaries with a range of financial grants to the total of nearly £6,000.

We sell our own logo t-shirts at events, together with our logo pin-badges and are in the process of setting up an online shop on our website to sell new merchandise to boost our fundraising.

We have a fantastic relationship with The Royal Vauxhall Tavern in London, holding at least two big fundraisers there per year, with them also fundraising on our behalf during their Christmas Pantomimes.

We now have supporters organising events in South Shields and in Kent.

We have strong connections at Macmillan Cancer Support, Guy's & Kings College Hospitals, CLIC Sergeant and OUTpatients.
